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

COMMENTARY

The industrial composite annual average index of employment (1949=100) for 1963 was 124.6. This figure was 2.6 per cent above the average for 1962 and surpassed the previous high of 122.6 recorded for 1957.

The increase between 1962 and 1963 reflected substantial gains in the service-producing industrial divisions, particularly trade (3.8 per cent); finance, insurance and real estate (5.2 per cent); and service (6.5 per cent). Typically, these industries show year-to-year gains in employment. However, since the current expansion got under way in 1961, these industries have grown at an increasing rate. Except for manufacturing, the goods-producing industrial divisions have not shown much strength since 1961. Declines in forestry and mining in 1963 marked the third successive year-to-year reduction for forestry and the sixth for mining. Construction declined from 1960 to 1961, partly recovered this loss in 1962 but was virtually unchanged in 1963.

Women increased their share of industrial employment in 1963 as the annual average index of employment for females rose by 3.2 per cent to 132.7 compared to an average increase for males of 2.5 per cent to 122.3. Employment of men and women in manufacturing increased at the same rate so that the rising share attributed to women was almost entirely a reflection of the marked growth in the service industries.

All regions recorded higher levels of employment in 1963. The gains ranged from 1.1 per cent in the Atlantic Region to 3.6 per cent in British Columbia.

The industrial composite annual average of weekly wages and salaries rose by 3.5 per cent in 1963 to \$83.41. The increase reflected higher earnings in all major industrial divisions with percentage increases of 5.0 per cent or more in forestry, construction and public utility operation. Earnings were up in all provinces, the gains ranging from 4.2 per cent in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick to 2.7 per cent and 2.6 per cent in Manitoba and Alberta, respectively. The industrial composite annual average index for payrolls, at 243.9, was up 6.1 per cent from the 1962 figure.

Employment, 1962-63 Averages

Manufacturing Industries

The rise in manufacturing of 2.7 p.c. in 1963 was substantially less than the 4.0 p.c. recorded between 1961 and 1962. Nevertheless, the increase carried the average index to 116.4, slightly above the previous high of 115.8 recorded for both 1956 and 1957. Within manufacturing, the durables component rose by 3.8 p.c. and the non-durables by 1.7 p.c. In durables, the relatively large increase resulted from gains of 4.0 p.c. or more in iron and steel,

transportation equipment and electrical apparatus and supplies. In non-durables, the largest increases occurred in rubber (4.3 p.c.), textiles (4.5 p.c.) and miscellaneous manufacturing industries (5.3 p.c.). There were moderate advances of 2.9 p.c. in clothing and 2.1 p.c. in chemicals. The remaining industries were not significantly altered from the previous year.

Non-manufacturing Industries

Manufacturing apart, average employment levels in the **goods-producing industrial divisions** declined in 1963 although the reduction in construction was negligible. Forestry declined for the third successive year; as in preceding years, the reduction resulted from decreases in the Atlantic Region and Quebec.

Mining has declined in every year since 1957 as a result of weakening in metals and fuels. Employment levels in metals have fallen off due to the decline in importance of gold mining and the reduction of markets for uranium. The fuels group has likewise shown a downward trend in employment due to the rapid increase in the use of substitute fuels. A small rise in employment in coal mining from 1962 to 1963 marked the first year-to-year increase in that component since that for 1948 to 1949; a reduction in oil and natural gas of 4.3 p.c. accounted for the 1962-1963 decline in fuels. The oil and natural gas industry has recorded year-to-year decreases in every year since 1957. In that year, the rapid growth in employment associated with the exploration and drilling for oil and gas wells in Western Canada began to taper off as emphasis shifted to production which requires a much smaller labour force.

In the **service-producing industrial divisions**, the gains in trade, in service and in finance, insurance and real estate continued the almost uninterrupted series of year-to-year increases evident since the end of World War II. In fact, the only exception was a small decline between 1957 and 1958 in trade. Since the current expansion in aggregate economic activity got under way early in 1961, employment growth in trade, service and finance, insurance and real estate has accelerated. For the last two-named industries, expansion has been so marked that the percentage increases over 1960 were 16.4 in service and 14.2 in finance, insurance and real estate; about three times the rate of change shown for the industrial composite over the same period.

Employment by Sex

The industrial composite annual average index for females rose by 3.2 p.c. over the year to 132.7 in 1963. The index for males rose by 2.5 p.c. to 122.3. Thus, women increased their share of industrial employment from 24.1 p.c. to 24.3 p.c. The proportion of women in industrial employment as compared to men has now risen in every year since

1959. In manufacturing, the relative rates of growth of employment of males and females differed only slightly so that the proportion of women employed did not change. The rising percentage of females is, therefore, associated with the major growth of the service industries which employ high proportions of women and the decline or lack of expansion in forestry, mining and construction which employ relatively small numbers of women.

Regions

Every region showed higher levels of employment in 1963. The gains were largest in British Columbia (3.6 p.c.) and Ontario (3.2 p.c.). In British Columbia, there were strong advances in forestry, mining, trade, finance, insurance and real estate and service. In Ontario, the largest percentage increases occurred in manufacturing and service. In fact, manufacturing reported larger gains in Ontario than in any other region.

A 2.2 p.c. increase in Quebec was due almost entirely to advances in trade, service and finance, insurance and real estate. Manufacturing was rather sluggish in the region, rising by only 0.7 p.c. The retarding influence in this division was a marked reduction in transportation equipment, reflecting weakening in shipbuilding and aircraft and parts.

In the Atlantic Region, employment rose substantially in mining, manufacturing, service and finance, insurance and real estate. However, these gains were offset to some extent by reductions in forestry, transportation, storage and communication and construction. In the Prairie Region, the industrial composite rose by 1.7 p.c. as increases of 2.0 p.c. or more occurred in manufacturing, public utility operation, trade, finance, insurance and real estate and service.

Cyclical Movements in Employment in 1963

Trends in the Industrial Composite and Major Industrial Divisions

The seasonally-adjusted industrial composite index of employment (1949=100) was 127.3 at the end of December 1963. This figure was 4.0 p.c. above the December 1962 figure of 122.4. As a result of the substantial gains in 1963, by the end of the year, the adjusted composite had reached its highest level on record, surpassing by 2.8 p.c. the previous cyclical high of 123.8 recorded March 1957.

The movement of the composite in 1963 was uneven. The first quarter saw a continuation of the uninterrupted series of increases recorded for 1962. However, in the second quarter, these advances ceased and the composite indicated some weakening between April and July. After July, employment strengthened and expansion resumed at a rate unequalled since the current upswing began early in 1961.

The second quarter slackening in the composite during 1963 reflected movements in manufacturing, construction and transportation, storage and communication. Manufacturing stood at 114.5 at the end of December 1962, rose to 115.9 by April 1963 then slackened off to 114.6 in July. However, between July and December, the index rose by a substantial 4.1 p.c. to 119.3, the highest seasonally-adjusted value ever recorded for this component.

The seasonally-adjusted index for construction, at 125.0, showed little movement in the first quarter. Between April and July, the index dipped sharply to 120.7 due to uncertainty in the industry as a result of the sales tax on building materials. After July, employment picked up sharply, partly in response to the modification of the sales tax and the concerted effort by builders to make up ground lost during the period of uncertainty, and in the latter part of the year, to government incentives to home-builders. Consequently, by year's end, the construction index stood at 126.7, up 5.0 p.c. from July 1963.

The seasonally-adjusted index for transportation, storage and communication declined from 109.4 in January 1963 to 108.5 in June of that year. After June, renewed vigor in construction and manufacturing as well as greatly increased wheat marketing stimulated the transportation and storage industries; as a result, the adjusted index for the division rose by 2.0 p.c. over the second half of the year, climbing to 110.7 by the end of December 1963.

Trends in Manufacturing

The seasonally-adjusted index for manufacturing continued, in 1963, the growth that has been characteristic of that division since the current expansionary phase began in the spring of 1961. Between Decembers 1962 and 1963, employment rose by 4.2 p.c. This advance resulted from increases of 5.0 p.c. in durables and 3.5 p.c. in non-durables. The two major components showed similar movements during 1963. Each advanced in the first quarter, slackened in the second, then advanced in the third and fourth. However, the overall trend was dominated by the more volatile durables component.

From January to April of 1963, the seasonally-adjusted index for **durable goods manufacturing** increased from 119.8 to 120.6. Between April and July, the index declined to 118.2; however, over two-thirds of this decrease reflected an unusually heavy lay-off in July in the automobile industries for model changeover. After July, the index made substantial gains rising by 6.1 p.c. to 125.4 in December.

All components of durable-goods manufacturing increased in 1963. Measures of year-to-year percentage increases in the annual average indexes of employment indicate that the relative gains were greatest in iron and steel (4.8 p.c.), transportation equipment (4.0 p.c.) and electrical apparatus and supplies (4.5 p.c.). Wood products was not far off the pace with an advance of 3.3 p.c., while non-

metallic mineral and non-ferrous metal products showed increases of 2.7 p.c. and 1.2 p.c., respectively.

In every case, except for non-ferrous metals, the major part of the expansion occurred in the latter part of 1963. If allowance is made for usual seasonal variations, there was a decline in wood products from February to June and non-metallic mineral products from May to August. Weakening in these components was a major factor contributing to the slackening in durables in the second quarter. Both industries showed great vigour in the second half of the year as evidenced by the year-to-year percentage gains quoted in the preceding paragraph. Electrical apparatus and supplies rose moderately in the first quarter, indicated no clear trend in the second and third quarters but advanced strongly in the fourth quarter. Transportation equipment showed little improvement in the first half of the year and actually declined in July due to larger-than-usual lay-offs for model changeover; in the third and fourth quarters, however, this industry made substantial advances. Iron and steel and non-ferrous metal products expanded throughout 1963 although in the case of the former, employment advanced at a decreasing rate in the first half of the year. The year-to-year percentage increase for non-ferrous metals was small, because the industry contracted in 1962.

The gains in iron and steel products resulted primarily from higher levels of employment in agricultural implements, iron castings, machinery and primary iron and steel. The second quarter slowdown reflected movements in industries closely connected with construction materials and household equipment such as fabricated and structural steel, sheet metal products and heating and cooking appliances.

In transportation equipment, the marked expansion was due primarily to gains in the motor vehicle and motor vehicle parts and accessories industries for which the 1963 annual average was higher than that for 1962 by 14.0 p.c. and 16.4 p.c., respectively. Shipbuilding weakened through most of 1963, but the contraction did not occur at as fast a rate as the expansion of the previous year, so that, on the average, employment in the industry for 1963 was higher than in 1962. Employment in aircraft and parts and railroad and rolling stock equipment expanded strongly in the second half of 1963. However, these gains were not enough to balance a contraction in earlier months and as a result, the annual averages for 1963 were lower than those for 1962.

Regional Employment

Employment expanded in all regions in 1963, with British Columbia showing the most marked gains. Comparison of the seasonally-adjusted indexes for December 1963 with those for December 1962 reveal that the Atlantic Region was up 4.5 p.c., Quebec 3.6 p.c., Ontario 4.2 p.c., the Prairie Region 3.4 p.c. and British Columbia 5.2 p.c.

In the Atlantic Region, employment expanded in manufacturing, mining, trade, service and in finance, insurance and real estate. There was no improvement in construction as employment oscillated around an average level about 5.0 p.c. below that for 1962. Only the transportation, storage and communication division weakened substantially during 1963, although it strengthened somewhat in the fourth quarter.

The seasonally-adjusted industrial composite for Quebec rose throughout 1963, gaining momentum in the second half of the year. There were substantial advances in trade, service and in finance, insurance and real estate. In manufacturing, employment continued at 1962 levels through the first three quarters of 1963, but improved substantially in the fourth quarter. In the first three quarters, employment expanded in textiles, clothing, wood, iron and steel and non-metallic mineral products, but these gains were offset, in the main, by a marked contraction in transportation equipment and mild weakening in electrical apparatus and supplies. In the latter part of the year, employment picked up in non-ferrous metals, chemical products and transportation equipment, but slackened in iron and steel products; however, these additional gains, combined with continued expansion in industries which were buoyant earlier in the year, boosted employment in the fourth quarter.

Except for a brief slowdown between April and July, the seasonally-adjusted index for Ontario continued to advance in 1963 at about the same rate as in 1962. In this region, all major industrial divisions improved over the year except mining and construction. As in other regions, employment surged in the service-producing industries of trade, finance, insurance and real estate and service. More significant, however, were substantial gains in manufacturing. Nearly all component industries in manufacturing reported marked increases in 1963, but expansion was greatest in transportation equipment, iron and steel, electrical apparatus and supplies and rubber products. The gains in transportation equipment were particularly impressive and reflected expansion in the motor vehicle and motor vehicle parts and accessories industries.

In the Prairie Region, the seasonally-adjusted index tended to decline in the first half of the year; in the second half, employment expanded vigorously. As elsewhere, the region showed a steady growth in trade, finance, insurance and real estate and service. The remaining divisions showed little overall improvement in the first half of 1963 but expanded in the second half. Mining was among those that advanced markedly in the latter part of 1963; increases in metal mining were a factor. There were similar trends in the third and fourth quarters for transportation, storage and communication resulting from gains in storage and trucking associated with greatly increased wheat sales. Manufacturing expanded in the first and fourth quarters to the extent that the year-to-year percentage increase in its

annual average exceeded that for the industrial composite. The strength in manufacturing reflected gains in clothing, iron and steel and transportation equipment.

British Columbia made the most marked advance in employment in 1963. In this region, all major industrial divisions advanced. Employment conditions were particularly favourable in the goods-producing industrial divisions; forestry was up over the year by 5.2 p.c., mining by 7.8 p.c., manufacturing by 3.1 p.c. and construction by 1.7 p.c. The high level for mining resulted from expansion in metals. In manufacturing, there were impressive gains in wood, paper and iron and steel products.

Average Weekly Wages and Salaries

The industrial composite of average weekly wages and salaries was \$83.43 in 1963, up 3.5 p.c. from the 1962 figure of \$80.59. In percentage terms, the increase was slightly larger than that shown for

each of the three preceding years and continued the series of relatively small year-to-year gains typical of the 1960's.

Among the major industrial divisions, increases were largest in forestry (5.7 p.c.), construction (5.1 p.c.) and public utility operation (4.9 p.c.). The percentage gains in the remaining divisions did not differ substantially to that shown for the industrial composite.

Per capita earnings rose in all provinces, with the gains ranging from 4.2 p.c. in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick to 2.6 p.c. in Alberta. In Nova Scotia, higher earnings and employment in the relatively highly paid coal mining industry was a factor. In New Brunswick, higher earnings and employment in manufacturing, where earnings tend to be slightly higher than the average for the province, resulted in an increase in the overall average. In Alberta, employment decreases in the relatively highly paid mining and construction industries retarded the advance in the composite average of weekly earnings.



1949=100








1949 = 100



1949 = 100










BY INDUSTRIAL DIVISION**





NOTES

A Note on the Change in Reporting Procedure for Quebec Forestry

Commencing with the present report, statistics of employment and per capita earnings for the forestry industry in Quebec are revised to improve quality of data for pieceworkers and certain other categories of bushworkers. These revisions have also been applied to data for each month back to and including January 1961. In the following tables, monthly and annual employment indexes and average weekly earnings are shown as previously published and on the new basis, for the industry and for the broader groups affected, viz. forestry for Canada and the industrial composites for Quebec and Canada. Revisions to the seasonally-adjusted employment indexes have been carried back to 1958. In future months, data will be available only on the new basis.

The revisions are designed to produce employment, payroll and weekly earnings series that are more closely comparable in content with those for other industries and areas. In general, they minimize the effect of high labour turnover rates in forestry in Quebec, increase the average weekly earnings and reduce the amplitude of their month-to-month fluctuations. The improvements were made possible through the co-operation of logging operators in the province who changed their reporting procedures for pieceworkers and, in many cases, for daily and hourly-rated workers in logging camps.

Under the former procedure, the number of employees on payroll at any time in the report month was usually reported, regardless of when or how long they worked. Monthly payrolls frequently included advances on earnings and settlements for work done in earlier periods and excluded earnings for unscaled wood (i.e. wood cut but not measured). Average weekly earnings were found by dividing the reported employment by the weekly equivalent of the payroll, as described in the notes at the back of this bulletin.

In the new procedure, aggregate man-days worked in the report month by pieceworkers and, in

some cases, by other bushworkers are reported, together with the gross remuneration for this time, excluding payments for work done in previous months and including estimated earnings for unscaled wood. The average number of such workers on strength in the last week of the month is also reported. This average is used in tabulation; the corresponding payroll and per capita weekly earnings are found by relating the average daily earnings calculated from the monthly figures to the weekly average employment. There is no change from the former procedure for salaried employees or for wage-earners reported on a basis comparable with other industries.

The difference in employment levels resulting from minimizing labour turnover among bushworkers was substantial, although it was limited by the inclusion of a number of workers who had not been reported on the original returns. For example, in August 1963, the revised employment figure of 24,789 was 988 below that reported on the old basis. The new employment indexes have been linked through the 1961 and 1962 annual averages to those previously published. Month-to-month relationships in the revised indexes differed substantially in many instances from those in the original series. The revisions significantly affected the Canada figures for the industry but, because of the comparatively small weight of forestry in the aggregates of all industries covered, the industrial composite indexes for Quebec and for Canada were influenced to a much lesser extent.

The annual averages of weekly earnings for forestry in 1961 and 1962 were increased by more than \$5.00 in Quebec and by more than \$2.00 in Canada, while the respective industrial composite earnings varied by only a few cents. Month-to-month fluctuations in earnings levels were less extreme than in the original series. This is particularly notable in the spring months when seasonal layoffs and settlements formerly caused substantial variations in earnings levels.

Methods and Scope of Monthly Surveys of Employment and Payrolls

General.—The monthly surveys of employment and weekly payrolls relate to all branches of the following industrial divisions: forestry, mining, manufacturing, transportation, storage and communication, construction, public utility, trade, finance, insurance and real estate, and to certain groups of the service industry, mainly hotels, restaurants, laundries and dry cleaning plants, recreational and business services. The surveys do not cover firms usually employing less than 15 persons, of which the number is very large in relation to their employment totals. Establishments reducing their staffs below this minimum are not necessarily removed from the mailing list. Data are requested for all classes of employees, irrespective of their functions in the business; statistics for the owners are excluded. Employers operating in two or more lines of business, or in different provinces or cities, are asked to furnish separate monthly returns for their establishments in the different units.

1. Coverage.—Virtual limitation of the surveys to firms with staffs of 15 and over results in a large and relatively even coverage of total employment in the included industries in most of the provinces and in the urban areas. The industrial representation, though large, is more uneven, the proportion of employees covered depending upon the organization of particular industries in larger or smaller units of operation. Complete information respecting the area and industry distributions of the working population is available only when the Decennial Censuses are taken, at place of residence. In 1951, data were not segregated for paid workers actually at work. Estimates of coverage that can be made are therefore conservative because they relate employees of reporting firms to all paid workers with jobs, including those absent from work without pay who would not be included in the monthly statistics of employment and payrolls. Estimates of coverage according to industrial divisions for Canada and the provinces are given in the first columns of Tables 4 and 5 of the monthly reports "Employment and Payrolls".

The following table contains provincial estimates of coverage of total wage-earners and salaried employees in all industries, including those in agriculture, government, education, health and other classes excluded from the monthly surveys, as well as paid workers in the industries that are included. The general estimate for Canada was 62 p.c.

It is important to note that the statistics of employees covered, as published in the monthly and annual reports, do not represent estimates of total numbers of paid workers in specified areas or industries, but show only the distributions of men and women on the staffs of the co-operating employers in the indicated periods, including their full-time, part-time and casual employees.

2. The Questionnaire used in the monthly surveys asks employers to state the number of wage-earners and salaried employees drawing pay in the last pay periods in the months, with their payroll disbursements in the same periods. The request for statistics for the last pay period in the month only is designed to prevent duplication in the employment count where individuals may appear on the payrolls of more than one employer in a period of several weeks. The workers reported are not necessarily employed for a period of a week, by any one establishment or by more than one. Workers on strike during the reported pay periods are not included in the statistics unless they draw pay from their employer; for example, take paid holidays during the dispute. Workers laid off without pay during the pay period as an indirect effect of industrial disputes are not counted as employed.

Employees and earnings are grouped according to the duration of their pay periods—monthly, semi-monthly, fortnightly, weekly, etc. Gross payrolls are requested before deductions are made for taxes, unemployment insurance contributions, etc. Overtime payments, cost-of-living allowances, commissions, incentive, and production bonuses are included, as are payments for absences with pay in the reported pay periods. The statistics do not include employers' contributions to unemployment insurance, workmen's compensation and other welfare plans, nor do they include amounts paid for pensions, retirement gratuities, bonuses paid at irregular or infrequent intervals, and various other supplementary labour costs.

3. The Processing.—Statistics of wages and salaries reported for any period exceeding a week are reduced for tabulation purposes to one week's proportion of the totals, the numerators of the fractions used for this purpose being 5, 6 or 7 days,

depending upon the number of days per week on which the establishment operated in the pay period; the denominators of the fractions are the numbers of working days in the different pay periods. For employees paid at annual or monthly rates, whose earnings are not affected by variations in the number of working days in the month, fixed proportions are used to reduce the earnings to a weekly basis, irrespective of the length of the calendar month. The sums resulting from these various calculations are then aggregated to give the total amounts which would be paid for services rendered in one week by the employees of the co-operating firms.

4. The Tabulation. — Data tabulated each month show the numbers of women and of workers of both sexes drawing pay from the establishments furnishing returns and their weekly payrolls, with similar information for employees of the same firms a month earlier, and in the base period (1949). The statistics first published for each month are preliminary; re-tabulation of the data on the succeeding month's tabulation permits incorporation of revisions in the material originally tabulated and inclusion of returns received too late for the preliminary tabulation.

5. The Index Numbers. — The index numbers of employment and payrolls represent the percentage relationships between employees of establishments currently furnishing data and their aggregate weekly earnings, and the corresponding 1949 averages of these employees. The 1949 figures of employment and payrolls for firms which have since gone out of business are continued in the basic averages; firms or branches opening for business since 1949 are tabulated with zero base figures. The basic averages of establishments which operated in 1949 but have since been added to the mailing list, are incorporated in the base figures from the date when their co-operation was first obtained. The index numbers of average weekly wages and salaries relate the average earnings of persons employed by the reporting firms at a given date to the average earnings of their employees in 1949.

6. The Weekly Wages and Salaries. — The statistics of average weekly earnings result from the division of the aggregate weekly wages and salaries disbursed in the last pay periods in the month by the co-operating establishments, by the number of their

full time and part-time employees in the same periods. The figures represent gross earnings, before deductions are made for unemployment insurance contributions, taxes, etc. In addition to basic wages and salaries, the earnings include overtime payments, shift premiums, commissions, cost-of-living, incentive and production bonuses, and other bonuses paid at frequent intervals. They also include amounts paid employees absent on leave with pay during the reported pay periods, i.e., during vacations, statutory holidays, sick leave, etc.

The earnings do not include the value of free board and lodging and other perquisites, employers' contributions to welfare funds such as workmen's compensation, pension, and unemployment insurance funds and supplementary unemployment benefits. Also excluded are the cost to employers of certain other employee benefits, such as bonuses paid at irregular or infrequent intervals, (e.g., annual bonuses), and retirement gratuities.

The revised figures of earnings in the monthly reports incorporate retroactive pay for one month, corrections in the material originally tabulated, and data received too late for inclusion in the first tabulation; for the most part, such adjustments are not carried back for more than one month.

7. Hourly Earnings. — Statistics of average hours and average hourly and weekly earnings of wage-earners for whom co-operating employers keep record of hours worked are contained in the monthly reports "Man-Hours and Hourly Earnings".

8. Urban Area Statistics. — Statistics given in the present report for communities listed as "metropolitan areas" and "other major urban areas" in Tables 8 and 9 of the 1956 Census Volume 1 (population) and in the same tables in Bulletin 1-6, cover the census areas, except those for St. Catharines, which also include establishments in Port Colborne and Welland, and those for Chicoutimi-Jonquiere which also include Bagotville and Port Alfred, as well as other smaller centres. Statistics given for urban areas **not** listed in the above mentioned tables cover establishments in the incorporated cities and towns named except for Galt, which include establishments in Preston as well as in Galt.

FOOTNOTES

Most of the footnotes are lists of names of industries that appear in the Standard Industrial Classification Manual which are grouped under special titles in employment and payroll publications. In some industries, the group breakdown shown in the tables is less extensive than in the Standard Industrial Classification; figures for the omitted categories however, are contained in the group totals.

- (a) **Gold mining** includes alluvial gold mining; auriferous quartz mining.
- (b) **Other metal mining** includes copper-gold-silver mining; iron mining; nickel-copper mining; silver-cobalt mining; silver-lead-zinc mining; miscellaneous metal mining.
- (c) **Non-metal mining** includes non-metal mining; quarrying, clay and sand pits.
- (d) **Other beverages** includes carbonated beverages; wines.
- (f) **Other leather products** includes leather gloves and mittens; leather tanneries; miscellaneous leather products.
- (g) **Saw and planing mills** includes plywood and veneer mills; sash, door and planing mills; sawmills.
- (h) **Other wood products** includes boxes and baskets (wood); morticians' goods; miscellaneous wood products.
- (i) **Other paper products** includes paper boxes and bags; roofing papers; miscellaneous paper products.
- (j) **Machinery manufacturing** includes household, office and store machinery; machine tools; machinery, n.e.c.
- (k) **Non-metallic mineral products** includes abrasive products; asbestos products; cement, hydraulic; clay products; glass and glass products; lime and gypsum products; stone products; concrete products; miscellaneous non-metallic mineral products.
- (l) **Other chemical products** includes explosives, ammunition and pyrotechnics; fertilizers; paints and varnishes; soaps, washing and cleaning compounds; toilet preparations; vegetable oil mills; primary plastics; miscellaneous chemical and allied products.
- (m) **Building** includes buildings and structures; special trade contractors. **General engineering** includes other construction, other than highways, bridges and streets.
- (n) **Water transportation** includes water transportation; services incidental to water transportation.
- (o) **Electric and motor transportation** includes bus and coach transportation-interurban; urban and suburban transportation systems; taxicab; truck transportation; services incidental to transportation; other transportation.
- (p) **Urban and interurban transportation** includes bus and coach transportation-interurban; urban and suburban transportation systems.
- (q) **Other public utilities** includes gas manufacture and distribution; water and sanitary services; other public utilities.
- (r) **Industrial machinery** includes machine tools; machinery, n.e.c.
- (s) **Synthetic textiles and silk** includes synthetic filament yarn and staple fibre; spun yarn and fabric.
- (t) **Durable goods manufacturing** includes wood, iron and steel, transportation equipment, non-ferrous metal, electrical apparatus and supplies and non-metallic minerals. The **non-durable** group includes the remaining manufacturing industries.
- (u) **Service** includes hotels, restaurants, laundries, dry cleaning plants, business, recreational services and miscellaneous services. Government, community and health services are **not** covered.
- (v) **Estimates of coverage** are based on comparisons of data for 1951 with Population Census Statistics. For details, see notes on page 70.
- (w) **The Northwest Territories** with the exception of Baffin Island are included in Alberta, Baffin Island is included in Quebec. The **Yukon Territory** is included in British Columbia.

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
