

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT IN METROPOLITAN AREAS

MARCH 1961

INTRODUCTION

This is the first published report covering Federal Government employment in the 15 census metropolitan areas in Canada. A table on Federal employment in the Ottawa-Hull metropolitan area, March 1960 was released on July 5, 1960 through the Dominion Bureau of Statistics Daily Bulletin.

Extent of Coverage

The present report pertains to departmental branches, services and corporations. It gives details of the staff strength at March 31, 1961 and regular earnings of employees during that month. Retroactive and overtime payments are excluded. Information on agency and proprietary corporations and other agencies is not available for inclusion in this report.

To indicate the coverage of this report, the March 31, 1961 staff strength (in Canada and abroad) of all Federal Government bodies is shown below:

Of the 201,402 employees in departmental branches, services and corporations, some 130,616 or 64.8 per cent were employed in metropolitan areas on March 31, 1961.

Relation to the Monthly Federal Government Employment Report (Cat. No. 72-004)

This being a companion report to the monthly Federal Government Employment report, the same general comments apply. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded but the civilian personnel of National Defence are included. The civilian and uniformed personnel of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police are included. Ministers of the Crown and the Solicitor-General are excluded as are those members of Boards or Commissions who are paid on a per diem basis or who receive a nominal honorarium for their services. Terms used in the report are defined in the Glossary, Appendix B.

Composition of Metropolitan Areas

The fifteen metropolitan areas used herein are those developed for the 1956 decennial census of population. A list of the metropolitan areas together with the places included in each is contained in Appendix A.

Employees in Metropolitan Areas

Included are all Federal Government employees of departments and departmental corporations who work within the boundaries of the metropolitan areas. Persons working in the fifteen areas but residing outside are included whereas those residing in metropolitan areas but working outside are excluded. Employees normally working in a metropolitan area but who occasionally work outside are included. For example, ships' officers and crews based on ports such as Halifax and Victoria are recorded as employed in those metropolitan areas.

Comparability Between Number of Employees and Regular Earnings

The user of these statistics is advised to avoid making direct comparisons between the number of employees and regular earnings since the count of staff represents those employed at the end of the month whereas regular earnings relate to all persons who received pay during the month, including those not on strength at the end of the month. Considerable fluctuations in the number employed frequently occur, especially among casual staff and, consequently, a comparison between the number and earnings would, in many cases, not be valid.

The next report in this series will give statistics for the month of September, 1962.

Analysis of Data

Almost two-thirds of Federal employees work in metropolitan areas, i.e. 64.8 per cent compared to 35.2 per cent in non-metropolitan areas. As could be expected, Federal employees are most numerous in the Ottawa-Hull metropolitan area, where 46,095 or 22.9 per cent of the 201,402 employees in departmental branches, services and corporations are employed. The next ranking metropolitan areas are Montreal and Toronto with 17,471 and 15,129 employees respectively. Females represent a higher proportion of total staff in metropolitan areas at 30 per 100 compared with 20 per 100 in non-metropolitan areas. In the Ottawa-Hull metropolitan area the proportion is highest with 38 out of each 100 employees being women. The 4,080 employees for whom distribution by sex is not available are mostly male employees. The 2,569 employees outside Canada represent Canadians posted abroad and "locallyengaged" employees who are residents of foreign countries hired for local service by the Government of Canada.

Earnings are generally higher in metropolitan areas than in the non-metropolitan areas. Metropolitan areas with 64.8 per cent of employees register 67.0 per cent of total regular earnings. The Ottawa-Hull metropolitan area, where most of the administrative and policy-making staff are located, indicates a still higher average salary by the fact that 22.9 per cent of total staff are in receipt of 25.6 per cent of regular earnings.

A comparison between this report and the monthly Federal Government Employment report for March 1961 is shown below:

Almost seventy per cent of salaried staff are employed in metropolitan areas. Three-quarters of the ships' officers and crews are also based in the fifteen areas. The majority (about 55 per cent) of prevailing rate and casual employees are situated at points outside these areas.

While most departments have staff both within and outside metropolitan areas there are nine departments whose entire staff are employed in metropolitan areas, these are:



APPENDIX B. Glossary of Principal Terms Used

- 1. Salaried employee: An employee who is paid on the basis of an annual salary rate and occupies a salaried position authorized by the Treasury Board or the Privy Council. These employees and positions may be of a continuing, term, seasonal, sessional, or part time nature. The positions are specified together with appropriate funds, in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents and are located in departmental branches, services and corporations subject to the regulation of the Treasury Board. Ships' officers are not classified as salaried owing to their special treatment under the Financial Administration Act.
- 2. Prevailing rate employee: A person employed in the Public Service of Canada whose remuneration is based on the rate of pay prevailing in the area where he is employed for the class of work he does. His rate of pay may also be based on rates prevailing in any area in Canada for work comparable to that which he does. The rates may be hourly, daily, weekly or monthly. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Prevailing Rate Employees General Regulations. They are occupants of positions authorized by the Treasury Board. The positions, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
- 3. Ships' officer: A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as a master, mate or marine engineer who is duly certified under the Canadian Shipping Act or in a position designated by the Treasury Board as that of a ship's officer. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. An annual rate of pay is determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Officer's Regulations. They are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which positions, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
- 4. Ships' crew employee: A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as an unlicensed crew member. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. These employees are paid on the basis of a monthly salary rate determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. They are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Crews Regulations. These employees are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which positions, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
- 5. Casual and other employees: All employees in Departments and Departmental Corporations of the Government of Canada who are not defined as Salaried, Prevailing Rate, Ships' Officer or Ships' Crew employees.
- 6. Regular earnings: The basic pay of employees before deductions but or Juding any special payments such as overtime, living allowances, etc. All regular earnings for the month, including those persons off-strength at the end of the month are included.
