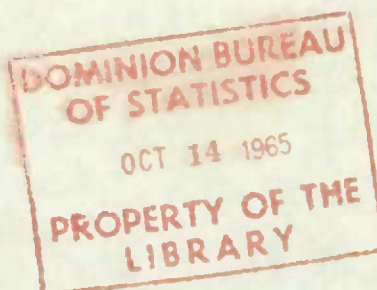

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT IN METROPOLITAN AREAS

SEPTEMBER 1964

INTRODUCTION

This is the fourth in a series of published reports giving information on employment of the federal government in metropolitan areas. Previous reports were for the months of March 1961, September 1962 and September 1963. The present report covers seventeen metropolitan areas. Changes from the publication of September 1963 are listed below:

1. Metropolitan Quebec, P.Q.
 - (a) Town of La Petite-Rivière, name changed to Duberger
 - (b) Parish of St. Ambroise, name changed to Neufchâtel
2. Metropolitan Montreal, P.Q.

 - (c) Village of Saraguay, annexed by City of Montreal
 - (d) Town of St-Eustache-sur-le-Lac, became City of Deux-Montagnes.
3. Metropolitan Calgary, Alta.
 - (a) Town of Bowness, annexed by City of Calgary
4. Metropolitan Edmonton, Alta.
 - (a) Town of Jasper Place, annexed by City of Edmonton

These changes did not alter the boundaries of any metropolitan areas.

Extent of Coverage

The report is restricted to employees in departmental branches, services and corporations. It gives the staff strength of these at September 30, 1964 and includes data on regular payroll of employees on strength during that month. Retroactive and overtime payments are excluded. The report does not include employees of agency and proprietary crown corporations and other agencies.

To indicate the extent of coverage of this report the September 1964 staff strength (in Canada and abroad) of all federal government organizations is shown below:

Of the 203,059 persons employed in departmental branches, services and corporations 135,612 or 66.8 per cent were employed in metropolitan areas.

Relation to the Monthly Federal Government Employment Report (Catalogue No. 72-004)

This is a companion report to the monthly Federal Government Employment report and the same general comments apply. A detailed statement of the methods used in preparing the monthly Federal

Government Employment report is provided each year in the publication for April. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded but the civilian personnel of the Department of National Defence are included. Both civilian and uniformed personnel of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police are included. Ministers of the Crown and the Solicitor General are excluded as are those members of boards or commissions who are paid on a per diem basis or who receive a nominal honorarium for their services. Terms used in the report are defined in the Glossary which will be found in Appendix B.

Composition of Metropolitan Areas

The seventeen metropolitan areas covered by this report are essentially those developed for use in the 1961 decennial census of population. There are, however, a few cases where municipalities are partly included within the boundaries of metropolitan areas and partly excluded for census purposes. Because the basic data on government employment are detailed by location, a split cannot be made and the rule followed has been to incorporate the entire location into the metropolitan area concerned. Thus the metropolitan area coverage, as used herein, is slightly greater in the cases of Calgary and Edmonton than the areas covered by the census. A list of locations forming each metropolitan area for purposes of this report is given in Appendix A.

It should be noted that this report, like those for September 1962 and 1963 is based on 1961 census metropolitan areas, whereas that for March 1961 was based on census metropolitan areas in effect in 1956. The differences between 1956 and 1961 census metropolitan areas were indicated in the September 1962 edition of this report.

Comparability Between Number of Employees and Regular Earnings

Persons using these statistics are warned against making direct comparisons between the number of employees and regular payrolls for purposes of deriving average pay per employee. This is because the count of staff represents persons employed at the end of September, whereas payrolls relate to all persons who receive pay during that month, including those not on strength at the end of September. There are considerable fluctuations in the number employed, especially among casual staff and, consequently, a comparison between the number and payrolls would, in many cases, not be valid.

Analysis of Data

In September 1964 just over two thirds of the total staff of departmental branches, services and corporations were employed in the seventeen metropolitan areas. They numbered 135,612 or 66.8 per cent compared with 67,447 or 33.2 per cent in the remainder of Canada and abroad. The distribution in September 1963 had been 135,563 employees or 66.8

per cent in metropolitan areas compared with 67,475 or 33.2 per cent in the remainder of Canada and abroad. The Ottawa-Hull metropolitan area staff at September 1963 numbered 48,190 or 23.7 per cent of the total. This was an increase of 690 employees or 1.5 per cent from 1963. The Montreal metropolitan area remained the second largest employer of federal personnel at 19,212 employees or 9.5 per cent of the total while Toronto was third largest with 16,179 or 8.0 per cent of total staff.

The number of ships' employees assigned to the Canadian Coast Guard in Quebec City declined from 447 in September 1963 to 26 in September 1964.

For the Ottawa-Hull metropolitan area, comparing the figures of September 1964 to September 1963:

1. The transfer of employees from the Department of Public Printing and Stationery to the Directorate of Printing (Department of Defence Production) accounts for staff variations in these departments.
2. The establishment of the Department of Industry caused an increase in Federal Government staff.
3. The Secretary of State gained 110 employees because the National Museum was brought under its administration from the Department of Northern Affairs and National Resources.

The sex distribution of staff shows that there were 96,627 males and 38,912 females employed in metropolitan areas. The indicated distribution therefore is 71.3 per cent males and 28.7 per cent females among staff employed in metropolitan areas. This contrasts with 53,493 males and 11,332 females in non-metropolitan areas (or 82.5 per cent males versus 17.5 per cent females). The proportion of male employees in non-metropolitan areas is probably greater since most of the 2,622 employees not distributed by sex are male staff. The highest proportion of female staff is, as previously, located at Ottawa-Hull where, 36 of each 100 employees are women. The 3,088 employees outside Canada represent Canadians posted abroad and "locally engaged" employees who are residents of foreign countries hired for local service by the Government of Canada.

Regular payrolls are proportionally high in metropolitan areas with 66.8 per cent of total payrolls. The Ottawa-Hull metropolitan area where most of the administrative and policy making staff are located indicates a still higher average salary with 23.7 per cent of the total staff receiving 27.3 per cent of all regular earnings.

A comparison between this report and the monthly Federal Government Employment report for September 1964 follows:

Some 71 per cent of all salaried employees are employed or based in metropolitan areas in contrast to 56 per cent of ships' officers and crews, 50 per cent of prevailing rate employees and 45 per cent of the casuals. More than one quarter of all the salaried staff are employed in the Ottawa-Hull area.

While most departments have staff both within and outside metropolitan areas there are eleven whose entire staff are employed in the metropolitan areas. These are:

The vast majority of these and other administrative employees are located at the departmental headquarters which are usually situated in the Ottawa-Hull area.

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APPENDIX B. Glossary of Principal Terms Used

1. **Metropolitan Areas:** These are essentially the same as those developed by the Census Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. They include the suburban fringe or thickly settled territory lying outside of, but adjacent to, the boundaries of the larger cities in Canada. Because of the requirements of this survey, complete municipalities are included, hence the metropolitan areas of Calgary and Edmonton are somewhat larger than the Census Metropolitan Areas.
2. **Salaried employee:** An employee who is paid on the basis of an annual salary rate and occupies a salaried position authorized by the Treasury Board or the Privy Council. These employees and positions may be of a continuing, term, seasonal, sessional, or part-time nature. The positions are specified together with appropriate funds, in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents and are located in departmental branches, services and corporations subject to the regulation of the Treasury Board. Ships' officers are not classified as salaried owing to their special treatment under the Financial Administration Act.
3. **Prevailing rate employee:** A person employed in the Public Service of Canada whose remuneration is based on the rate of pay prevailing in the area where he is employed for the class of work he does. His rate of pay may also be based on rates prevailing in any area in Canada for work comparable to that which he does. The rates may be hourly, daily, weekly or monthly. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Prevailing Rate Employees General Regulations. They are occupants of positions authorized by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
4. **Ships' officer:** A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as a master, mate or marine engineer who is duly certified under the Canadian Shipping Act or in a position designated by the Treasury Board as that of a ship's officer. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. An annual rate of pay is determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Officer's Regulations. They are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
5. **Ships' crew employee:** A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as an unlicensed crew member. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. These employees are paid on the basis of a monthly salary rate determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. They are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Crews Regulations. These employees are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
6. **Casual and other employees:** All employees in Departments and Departmental Corporations of the Government of Canada who are not defined as salaried, prevailing rate, ships' officer or ships' crew employees.
7. **Regular payroll:** The basic wage and salary payments to employees during a specified period of time, excluding overtime, retroactive and other payments, but before deductions for income tax, etc. Includes payroll for all those employed during the month whether they were on strength at the end of the month or not. If there were semi-monthly, fortnightly or weekly payments in a month, the total amount paid for the month constitutes the "Regular payroll".
