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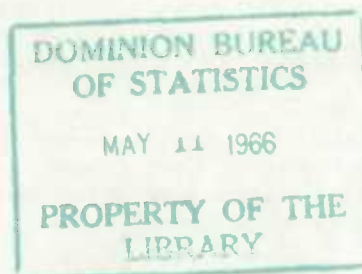

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT IN METROPOLITAN AREAS

SEPTEMBER 1965

INTRODUCTION

This is the fifth published report giving information on employment of the federal government in metropolitan areas. Previous surveys were for the months of March 1961, September 1962, September 1963 and September 1964. The present report covers the same seventeen metropolitan areas as the 1964 survey.

Extent of Coverage

The report is restricted to employees in departmental branches, services and corporations. It gives the staff strength at September 30, 1965 and includes data on regular payroll of employees on strength during that month. Retroactive and overtime payments are excluded. The report does not include employees of agency and proprietary crown corporations and other agencies.

The September 1965 staff strength (in Canada and abroad) of all federal government organizations is shown below:

Of the 211,077 persons employed in departmental branches, services and corporations 140,300 or 66.5 per cent were employed in metropolitan areas and are analyzed in this publication.

Relation to the Monthly Federal Government Employment Report (Catalogue No. 72-004)

This is a companion report to the monthly Federal Government Employment report and the same general comments apply. A detailed statement of the methods used in preparing the monthly Federal Government Employment report is provided each year in the publication for April. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded but the civilian personnel of the Department of National Defence are included. Both civilian and uniformed personnel of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police are included. Ministers of the Crown and the Solicitor General are excluded as are those members of boards or commissions who are paid on a per diem basis or who receive a nominal honorarium for their services. Terms used in this report are defined in the Glossary which will be found in Appendix B.

Composition of Metropolitan Areas

The seventeen areas covered by this report are essentially those developed for use in the 1961 Census of Population. For Census purposes certain

municipalities were only partly included within the boundaries of metropolitan areas. Data on employment cannot be split within a municipality and the rule followed has been to include the entire municipality in the metropolitan area concerned. A list of locations forming each area for purposes of this report is given in Appendix A.

Comparability Between Number of Employees and Regular Earnings

Persons using these statistics are warned against making direct comparisons between the number of employees and regular payrolls for purposes of deriving average pay per employee. This is because the count of staff represents persons employed at the end of September, whereas payrolls relate to all persons who receive pay during that month, including those not on strength at the end of September. There are considerable fluctuations in the number employed, especially among casual staff and, consequently, a comparison between the number and payrolls would, in many cases, not be valid.

Analysis of Data

Departmental staff strength, including those employees posted abroad, totalled 211.1 thousand in September 1965 and 203.1 thousand in September 1964. Within metropolitan areas there were 140.3 thousand employees (66.5 p.c. of total) in 1965 and 135.6 thousand (66.8 p.c. of total) in 1964. Ottawa-Hull encompassed 50.3 thousand employees, 23.8 p.c. of the Canada total, an increase of 2.1 thousand from September 1964. Montreal had the second highest concentration of employees at 20.0 thousand, 9.6 p.c. of the total. Toronto was the third most significant area with 16.7 thousand employees or 7.9 p.c. of the total.

Within metropolitan areas there were 98.9 thousand males and 41.3 thousand females. In September 1964 there were 96.6 thousand males and 38.9 thousand females. These figures indicate a 2.3 p.c. increase in male staff and 6.2 p.c. in female. The greatest ratio of female to total staff occurred in the Ottawa-Hull area where, as in the 1964 survey, 36 out of every 100 employees were women.

Regular payroll was proportionately high in metropolitan areas, they accounted for 68.4 p.c. of the total payroll. The Ottawa-Hull area, where most of the administrative and planning officers are located, indicated a higher than average payroll with 23.8 p.c. of the employees receiving 27.1 p.c. of the pay.

Factors which influenced employment and payroll changes between September 1964 and 1965 were:

1. Early in this fiscal year the Economic Council of Canada, formerly a Crown Corporation and therefore excluded from this report, was designated a departmental corporation under the Secretary of State.
2. National Revenue "seasonal" employees, previously classified as "salaried" are now classified as "casuals". This change affects Table 2.
3. The Department of Defence Production assumed responsibility for the purchasing of stores and supplies for several departments.
4. The number of prevailing rate employees decreased as Public Works increased the amount of work it contracted to outside firms.
5. Privy Council had a staff increase occurring mainly in the Royal Commission on Bilingualism and Biculturalism.
6. Although the "Canada Pension Plan" did not come into effect until January 1966, projects preparatory to its institution affected the Departments of Finance and National Revenue.
7. With the integration of the Armed Forces, there has been a decrease in the number of civilian personnel required by National Defence.
8. The Department of Labour was reorganized with Unemployment Insurance Commission, formerly a branch of that Department, becoming a department.
9. The Civil Service Commission created two new divisions: (a) Personnel Administration Directorate and (b) Language Training Centre.

Slightly more than 71 per cent of all salaried employees were based in metropolitan areas, compared to 53 per cent of ships' officers and crews, 51 per cent of prevailing rate employees and 44 per cent of casuals. More than one-quarter of all salaried staff were employed in the Ottawa-Hull area.

There are 14 departments and 3 departmental corporations whose staff are entirely or mainly employed in the metropolitan area of Ottawa-Hull. Those are:

APPENDIX B. Glossary of Principal Terms Used

1. **Metropolitan Areas:** These are essentially the same as those developed by the Census Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. They include the suburban fringe or thickly settled territory lying outside of, but adjacent to, the boundaries of the larger cities in Canada.
2. **Salaried employee:** An employee who is paid on the basis of an annual salary rate and occupies a salaried position authorized by the Treasury Board or the Privy Council. These employees and positions may be of a continuing, term, seasonal, sessional, or part-time nature. The positions are specified together with appropriate funds, in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents and are located in departmental branches, services and corporations subject to the regulation of the Treasury Board. Ships' officers are not classified as salaried owing to their special treatment under the Financial Administration Act.
3. **Prevailing rate employee:** A person employed in the Public Service of Canada whose remuneration is based on the rate of pay prevailing in the area where he is employed for the class of work he does. His rate of pay may also be based on rates prevailing in any area in Canada for work comparable to that which he does. The rates may be hourly, daily, weekly or monthly. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Prevailing Rate Employees General Regulations. They are occupants of positions authorized by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
4. **Ships' officer:** A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as a master, mate or marine engineer who is duly certified under the Canadian Shipping Act or in a position designated by the Treasury Board as that of a ship's officer. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. An annual rate of pay is determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Officer's Regulations. They are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
5. **Ships' crew employee:** A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as an unlicensed crew member. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. These employees are paid on the basis of a monthly salary rate determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. They are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Crews Regulations. These employees are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
6. **Casual and other employees:** All employees in Departments and Departmental Corporations of the Government of Canada who are not defined as salaried, prevailing rate, ships' officer or ships' crew employees.
7. **Regular payroll:** The basic wage and salary payments to employees during a specified period of time, excluding overtime, retroactive and other payments, but before deductions for income tax, etc. Includes payroll for all those employed during the month whether they were on strength at the end of the month or not. If there were semi-monthly, fortnightly or weekly payments in a month, the total amount paid for the month constitutes the "Regular payroll".
