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

INTRODUCTION

In this report information is given on employment and payroll data related to federal employees in metropolitan areas. The nineteen areas listed in the following tables, include the seventeen metropolitan areas as defined for purposes of the 1966 Census of Population, plus the cities of Regina and Saskatoon.

Extent of Coverage

The report is restricted to employees in departments and departmental corporations. That is, "departments" as named divisions of the Government of Canada and defined in the Financial Administration Act, Schedule A, and "Departmental Corporations" which are corporations that act as a servant, or agent, of Her Majesty in right of Canada and are responsible for administrative, supervisory, or regulatory services of a governmental nature. Departmental Corporations are designated in the Financial Administration Act, Schedule B.

Staff strength is given as of September 30, 1966, and regular payroll of employees on strength during the month is also shown. Retroactive and overtime payments are excluded. Employment data of agency and proprietary corporations and other agencies, as defined in Schedules C and D of the Financial Administration Act, are also excluded.

The September 1966 staff strength, in Canada and abroad, of all federal government organizations is shown below:

Of the 225,892 persons employed by the departments and departmental corporations, 146,869 or 65.0 per cent were employed in metropolitan areas and their distribution is analyzed in this publication.

Relation to the Monthly Report, Federal Government Employment (Catalogue No. 72-004)

This is a companion report to the monthly Federal Government Employment report and the same general comments apply. A detailed statement of the methods used in preparing the monthly report is provided each year in the publication for April. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded, as are Ministers of the Crown, Judges and the Governor General and Lieutenant-Governors. Also excluded are those members of boards or commissions who are paid on a per diem basis or who receive a nominal honorarium for their services. Included are both civilian and uniformed personnel of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. Terms used in this report are defined in the Glossary which will be found in Appendix B, page 38.

Composition of the Metropolitan Areas

The nineteen areas covered by this report are essentially those used in the 1966 Census of Population. For census purposes, only part of certain municipalities were included within the boundaries of metropolitan areas. Data on employment cannot be separated within a municipality and the rule followed has been to include the entire municipality in the metropolitan area concerned. A list of locations forming each area for purposes of this report is given in Appendix A, page 36.

Comparability Between Number of Employees and Regular Payrolls

Persons using these statistics are warned against making direct comparisons between the number of employees and regular payrolls for purposes of deriving average pay per employee. This is because the staff strength represents only those persons employed at the end of September whereas the payroll includes monies paid during the month, including payments to those not on strength at the end of September. There is considerable variation between the number employed, particularly among the casual employees, and, as a result most comparisons between the number employed and the payroll would not be meaningful.

Analysis of Data

As noted in the first paragraph, this report includes the cities of Regina and Saskatoon for the first time, so that comparisons between 1965 and this one are misleading to that extent.

A new Table 1, giving a 1965-66 comparative summary of employment by Department is included in this issue. The Government Organization Act did not become effective, officially, until October 1, 1966. However, the necessary re-organization began in December 1965 and continued to October 1966. The effect of these changes are apparent in this table.

Early in 1966 the first changes came into effect with the (1) transfer of the Indian Affairs Branch from Citizenship and Immigration to Northern Affairs and National Resources; (2) The Dominion Bureau of Statistics, formerly under Trade and Commerce, became a department in its own right, directly answerable to the Minister of Trade and Commerce.

The Purchasing and Stores (or Purchasing and Provisions) Branch of several departments were transferred to Defence Production. The individual branches transferred were small showing little effect on the "transferring" department, however, the combined numbers are apparent in Defence Production staff, particularly in the Ottawa-Hull area. Labour Department transferred two Branches; Technical and

Vocational Training Assistance and National Employment Service to Citizenship and Immigration. A new department, that of Solicitor General, was created and appears in this publication for the first time. The Royal Canadian Mounted Police, previously an independent organization, is now included under the Solicitor General.

In addition to the above mentioned transfer of branches, or divisions from one department to another, variations in the number of employees are apparent in departments where a re-organization (or further re-organization) was pending. For example, both Privy Council and Secretary of State were affected by the creation of the Solicitor General's department and that of the Registrar General, although they did not become "official" until Oct. 1 (the day following this survey) the change-over was in progress prior to September 30.

Other staff increases will be noted which are the result of natural growth, that is, added responsibility for a department made additional staff necessary. Public Works show a decrease in staff from 1965 due to their policy of giving out projects to private contractors, thereby lessening the staff requirements of that department.

Total departmental staff strength as of September 30, 1966 (including those posted abroad) was 225.9 thousand. Within the nineteen metropolitan areas there were 146.9 thousand employees, or 65.0 per cent of the total, compared to 140.3 thousand in 1965, representing 66.5 per cent of the total. In 1966, staff strength of 53.0 thousand (23.5 per cent) were in the Ottawa-Hull area, compared to 50.3 thousand (23.8 per cent) in 1965. Montreal and Toronto have the second and third highest concentration of employees, with Vancouver in fourth place, previously held by Halifax which is now fifth in order of significance.

Within metropolitan areas there were 102.7 thousand males and 44.1 thousand females employed by the Federal Government as of September 30, 1966. In September 1965 there were 98.9 thousand males and 41.3 thousand females which indicates a 3.9 per cent increase in male staff and 6.7 per cent in female. The greatest ratio of female to total staff occurred in the Ottawa-Hull area where 37 out of every 100 employees were women. Sudbury and London areas were next with 35 and 34 females per 100, respectively. Regular payroll was proportionately higher in metropolitan areas where they accounted for 67.7 per cent of the total payroll. The Ottawa-Hull area, where the most of the administrative and planning offices are located, accounted for 27.2 per cent of the payroll.

Seventy per cent of all salaried employees work within metropolitan areas, compared to 69 per cent of ships' officers and crews, 49 per cent of prevailing rate employees and 32 per cent of casuals. More than one quarter of all salaried employees were in the Ottawa-Hull area.

Of the thirty-eight Federal Government departments and departmental corporations providing this survey material, there are eight departments and two departmental corporations whose staff are entirely employed in the Ottawa-Hull Metropolitan area. These are:



APPENDIX B. Glossary of Principal Terms Used

1. **Metropolitan Areas:** These are essentially the same as those developed by the Census Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. They include the suburban fringe or thickly settled territory lying outside of, but adjacent to, the boundaries of the larger cities in Canada.
2. **Salaried employee:** An employee who is paid on the basis of an annual salary rate and occupies a salaried position authorized by the Treasury Board or the Privy Council. These employees and positions may be of a continuing, term, seasonal, sessional, or part-time nature. The positions are specified together with appropriate funds, in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents and are located in departmental branches, services and corporations subject to the regulation of the Treasury Board. Ships' officers are not classified as salaried owing to their special treatment under the Financial Administration Act.
3. **Prevailing rate employee:** A person employed in the Public Service of Canada whose remuneration is based on the rate of pay prevailing in the area where he is employed for the class of work he does. His rate of pay may also be based on rates prevailing in any area in Canada for work comparable to that which he does. The rates may be hourly, daily, weekly or monthly. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Prevailing Rate Employees General Regulations. They are occupants of positions authorized by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
4. **Ships' officer:** A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as a master, mate or marine engineer who is duly certified under the Canadian Shipping Act or in a position designated by the Treasury Board as that of a ship's officer. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. An annual rate of pay is determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Officer's Regulations. They are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
5. **Ships' crew employee:** A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of or chartered by or on behalf of Her Majesty as an unlicensed crew member. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. These employees are paid on the basis of a monthly salary rate determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. They are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Crews Regulations. These employees are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
6. **Casual employees:** An employee engaged on a casual basis, or for a period not exceeding 12 months. These personnel may perform the duties which would normally be carried out by salaried, prevailing rate or ships' crew employees. They may be paid out of either the Salaries and Wages Object or other financial objects of expenditure. For example, persons employed and paid out of monies provided for the repair and upkeep of furniture would be considered casual employees, unless engaged on a contractual basis.
7. **Regular payroll:** The basic wage and salary payments to employees during a specified period of time, excluding overtime, retroactive and other payments, but before deductions for income tax, etc. Includes payroll for all those employed during the month whether they were on strength at the end of the month or not. If there were semi-monthly, fortnightly or weekly payments in a month, the total amount paid for the month constitutes the "Regular payroll".





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
