# FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYMENT IN METROPOLITAN AREAS

#### SEPTEMBER 1967

#### INTRODUCTION

This publication presents statistics on employment and payrolls, respecting Government of Canada employees in metropolitan areas, as of September 1967. Terms used in this publication are defined in the Glossary found in Appendix B, page 28.

#### Composition of the Metropolitan Areas

The nineteen metropolitan areas are those so defined for the purposes of the 1966 Census of Population. A list of the metropolitan areas and their components is provided in Appendix A, page 26. The metropolitan areas of Regina, Saskatoon and Calgary have no components, other than the cities themselves. Their boundaries are coincident with those of the metropolitan areas.

#### Extent of Coverage

The publication contains statistics relating only to employees of departments (as designated in Schedule A, the Financial Administration Act) and departmental corporations (as designated in Schedule B, the Financial Administration Act), and as such excludes those of agency and proprietary corporations and other agencies. The Governor General and Lieutenant-Governors, well as those members of boards or commissions who are paid on a per diem basis or who receive a nominal honorarium for their services.

Included are both civilian and uniformed personnel of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

The data in this publication reflect regular payrolls only, not including overtime or retro-active salary increase payments.

#### Comparability Between Number of Employees and Regular Payrolls

Users are cautioned against attempting to derive average salary rates by making direct comparisons between the number of employees and regular payrolls, as data relating to each are reported on different and therefore non comparable bases.

#### Analysis of Data

The September 1967 staff strength of all departments and departmental corporations was 236,085. This publication analyzes the 156,887 or 66.5 per cent of these employees who were employed in metropolitan areas.

The number employed in metropolitan areas represented an increase of 10,018 or 6.7 per cent over the number employed in these areas as of September 1966. The monthly payroll of \$75,803,723, represented an increase of \$9,502,452 or 14.3 per cent over the September 1966 payroll,

Note was made, in the 1966 issue, of the Government Reorganization Act which came into force October 1,1966. The significant variations reflected in this publication result primarily from the implementation of the provisions of that Act. The more significant variations resulting therefrom are highlighted as follows:

Manpower and Immigration (previously Citizenship and Immigration).—A continued expansion in this department is indicated. This has occurred primarily in the Development and Utilization of Manpower Division.

Public Service Commission (previously Civil Service Commission).—The Public Service Employment Act (February 1967) established this commission to replace the Civil Service Commission.

Public Service Staff Relations Board.—This Board was established in February 1967 to administer the new Public Service Staff Relations Act and to administer the operations of the Pay Research Bureau which had previously operated within the Civil Service Commission.

Forestry and Rural Development (previously Forestry). — A 22.2 per cent increase in staff is indicated with respect to this department.

Energy, Mines and Resources (previously Mines and Technical Surveys). — There has been a noticeable staff increase across the department particularly in Research and Investigation with the transfer of the functions and staff of the Resource Development Branch from the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development.

The Privy Council. — The 25.3 per cent decrease in staff strength since 1966 resulted essentially from the transfer of the functions and staff of the Combines Investigation Act Administration and the Patents, Copyrights and Trade Marks Branches to the Registrar General. There were also decreases in the staffs of the Royal Commissions on Pilotage and Bilingualism and Biculturalism.

The Secretary of State. — This organization was affected significantly by the Government Reorganization. The functions and staff of the former Citizenship Branch of Citizenship and Immigration were assumed by it, while the Corporations Branch was transferred to the Registrar General and the National Arts Centre was established by act of parliament as a crown corporation.

Other staff variations were predicated on service and/or workload changes. Some of the more notable are:

**Defence Production.**—Staff increases reflect the assumption of the service and supply function on behalf of certain other departments and absorbed the staff which previously had been located within those departments to perform the function.

**External Affairs.**—The increased number of employees in this department is related to the expansion of the External Aid function.

Finance. — The staff increase in this department, while on the surface only 5 per cent, is actually more significant. During the year ending September 1967 The Treasury Board, which had been a part of the Department of Finance, was established as a separate department and its staff, included in Finance in 1966, is shown separately in this publication. The actual increase in Finance is, therefore, more of the order of 12 per cent. The increase in the main resulted from the expansion of Treasury service at the regional level.

Industry. — This department since its inception in July 1963 has shown a continued, though gradual, increase in staff. The trend continued during the year to September 1967.

National Defence.—The civilian staff increased by some 10 per cent during the year in large measure due to the taking over, by civilian staff, of certain functions which had previously been performed by forces personnel.

National Film Board.—The increase of approximately 23 per cent was due in great part to the increased activities of the Board in connection with Centennial Year.

Indian Affairs and Northern Development. — The staff increases to establishments of this department in metropolitan areas, totalling about 300, were evident in all branches.

Solicitor General.—The marked increase in numbers reflects a change in the reporting policy with respect to casual employees of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police rather than an actual increase in staff. Trade and Commerce.—The personnel of this department in metropolitan areas increased 14 per cent. This resulted primarily from increased activity of the Exhibition Branch and the Canadian Government Travel Bureau.

Veterans' Affairs. — The transfer of Sunnybrook Hospital from federal government jurisdiction to the the University of Toronto resulted in the large decrease in the number of employees of Veterans' Affairs in the Toronto Metropolitan Area.

As mentioned earlier, in the text, of the 236,085 employed by federal departments who were on staff strength at the end of September, 156,887 or 66.5 per cent were employed within metropolitan areas as compared to September 1966 when there were 146,869 or 65.0 per cent of the total staff strength.

In 1967, 56.3 thousand (23.8 per cent) were in the Ottawa-Hull area, compared to 52.9 thousand (23.5 per cent) in 1966. Montreal with 21.7 thousand (9.2 per cent); Toronto with 17.1 thousand (7.2 per cent); Halifax with 10.0 thousand (4.2 per cent) and Vancouver 9.99 thousand (4.2 per cent) follow in that order. Comparable figures for 1966 are: Montreal 20.1 thousand (8.9 per cent); Toronto 17.4 thousand (7.7 per cent); Vancouver 9.4 thousand (4.1 per cent) and Halifax 8.4 thousand (3.7 per cent). Within the metropolitan areas there were 110.8 thousand male employees and 46.1 thousand female. There was a slight decrease of female employees since 1966. In the Ottawa-Hull area, where there is the highest female ratio, 36 out of every 100 employees were women, this compares with 37 out of 100 in 1966. Halifax had the lowest ratio with slightly less than two per hundred.

Of the total federal government employees, 71 per cent of salaried; 70 per cent of ships' officers and crews; 52 per cent of prevailing rate and 46 per cent of casuals are employed in the metropolitan areas. Thirty per cent of all salaried employees are in the Ottawa-Hull area.

Of the forty-one federal government departments and departmental corporations providing this survey material, there are ten departments and two departmental corporations whose staff are entirely employed in the Ottawa-Hull area. These are:



#### APPENDIX B. Glossary of Principal Terms Used

- 1. Metropolitan Areas: These are essentially the same as those developed by the Census Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. They include the suburban fringe or thickly settled territory lying outside of, but adjacent to, the boundaries of the larger cities in Canada.
- 2. Salaried employee: An employee who is paid on the basis of an annual salary rate and occupies a salaried position authorized by the Treasury Board or the Privy Council. These employees and positions may be of a continuing, term, seasonal, sessional, or part-time nature. The positions are specified together with appropriate funds, in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents and are located in departmental branches, services and corporations subject to the regulation of the Treasury Board. Ships' officers are not classified as salaried owing to their special treatment under the Financial Administration Act.
- 3. Prevailing rate employee: A person employed in the Public Service of Canada whose remuneration is based on the rate of pay prevailing in the area where he is employed for the class of work he performs. His rate of pay may also be based on rates prevailing in any area in Canada for work comparable to that which he performs. The rates may be hourly, daily, weekly or monthly. These employees, previously governed by the Financial Administration Act are, as of February, 1967, included under the Public Service Employment Act. They are occupants of positions authorized by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
- 4. Ships' officer: A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of, or chartered by, or on behalf of Her Majesty as a master, mate or marine engineer who is duly certified under the Canadian Shipping Act or in a position designated by the Treasury Board as that of a ship's officer. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. An annual rate of pay is determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. These employees are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Officer's Regulations. They are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
- 5. Ships' crew employee: A person employed in the Public Service for duty on a ship that is the property of, or chartered by, or on behalf of Her Majesty as an unlicensed crew member. Excluded are members of the Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. These employees are paid on the basis of a monthly salary rate determined by the Treasury Board after consultation with the Department of Labour. They are governed by the Financial Administration Act—Ships' Crews Regulations. These employees are occupants of positions established by the Treasury Board, which, together with appropriate funds, are listed in the Estimates of Canada and supplementary authorizing documents.
- 6. Casual employees: An employee engaged on a casual basis, or for a period not exceeding 12 months. These personnel may perform the duties which would normally be carried out by salaried, prevailing rate or ships' crew employees. They may be paid out of either the Salaries and Wages Object or other financial objects of expenditure. For example, persons employed and paid out of monies provided for the repair and upkeep of furniture would be considered casual employees, unless engaged on a contractual basis.
- 7. Regular payroll: The basic wage and salary payments to employees during a specified period of time, excluding overtime, retroactive and other payments, but before deductions for income tax, etc. Includes payroll for all those employed during the month whether they were on strength at the end of the month or not. If there were semi-monthly, fortnightly or weekly payments in a month, the total amount paid for the month constitutes the "Regular payroll".
