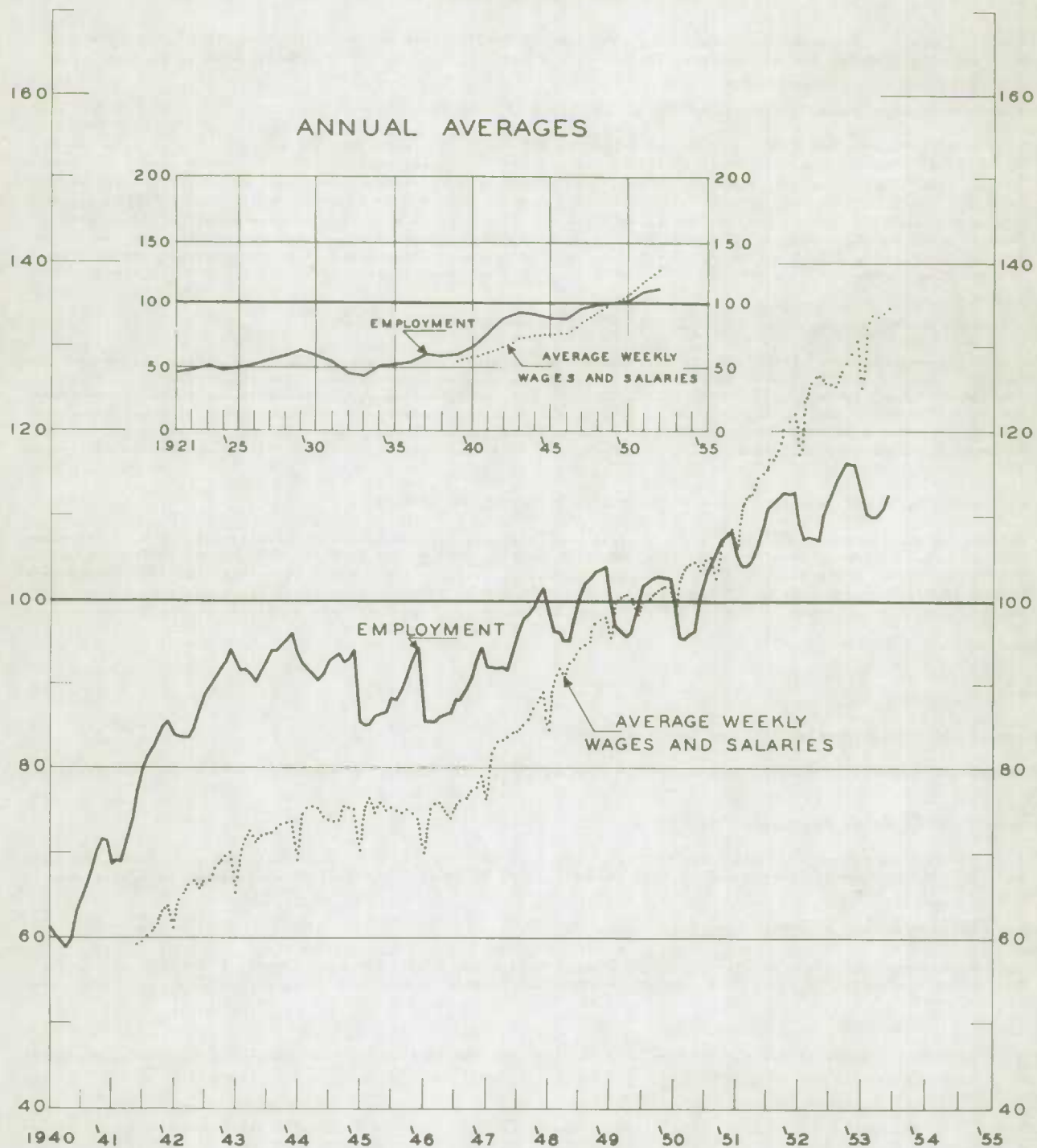

Employment, Payrolls and Average Weekly Wages and Salaries

1. Explanation of the Base Period Revision

The present bulletin contains new index numbers of employment, payrolls and average weekly earnings on the 1949 base which, as previously announced, will hereafter be used in computing the monthly series on these subjects. The next monthly bulletin on employment and payrolls will carry the record forward from June 1, 1953. The new series includes statistics for Newfoundland from 1950. Since the trends and levels in that province in recent years have been generally similar to those in other parts of the country, the inclusion of the Newfoundland data has had little effect upon the Canada indexes and per capita figures.

The 1949 base is the fourth used in the monthly employment record, going back to 1920, and the third in the payroll and average weekly wages and salaries series, instituted in 1941, and subsequently carried back on an annual basis to 1939. A post-war reference period has been established in many countries. For Canada, 1949 was selected as being the most satisfactory period, on the whole, for the various fields in which index numbers are calculated. It appears especially suitable for the employment series, since the situation in that year was relatively stable, following the period of immediate post-war adjustment, and preceding the outbreak of hostilities in Korea, with subsequent acceleration of industrial activity, particularly in the production of durable manufactured goods.

Except in a few cases where changes in classification or other circumstances made advisable a completely new record, arithmetically-converted index numbers on the 1939 base adjusted for the inclusion of Newfoundland, were used for the revised series up to the beginning of 1952. From then on, adjustments were made where necessary to link the old and the new records, based on the relationship between the converted indexes for the industries and areas, and those calculated monthly on the actual 1949 base from early in 1953. In most cases, the adjustments required were small, ranging between 1.0 p.c. and 3.0 p.c. They were carried back for a sufficiently lengthy period to preserve the direction of month-to-month trends. The inclusion of returns for Newfoundland changed the general employment index for any month by less than half a point, and the per capita earnings figure by less than 5 cents.

For some time, it has appeared that interest in monthly statistics of employment and average earnings is greater than in the payroll indexes. Accordingly, it has been decided, on a trial basis, to publish payroll indexes only in the summary tables in this and in future monthly bulletins. For the present, industrial figures for Canada, the provinces and the metropolitan areas will be provided on request.

Dollar averages of weekly wages and salaries are not affected by the change in reference period. The 1952 per capita figures for industries and areas, with comparisons from 1947, appear in Tables 16 - 18, while a new series of index numbers, on the 1949 base, is shown in Table 1.

2.- Employment, Payrolls and Average Weekly Earnings, 1952

Employment

The upward movement characterizing employment since the immediate post-war period continued during 1952, resulting in a new all-time high index. The rise, however, was substantially smaller than in 1951, when increasing momentum in the defence programme had contributed materially to marked expansion in industrial activity. The situation in 1952 was adversely affected by the occurrence of important labour-management disputes, notably in the textile, wood product and construction industries. On the whole, the losses in working time due to strikes were greater than in any other year since 1946.

Slight curtailment in employment, largely seasonal in character, was reported from the opening of 1952 until May 1, the index falling by 2 p.c. Almost uninterrupted improvement in succeeding months raised the figure, on the 1949 base, to a peak of 116.4 at Oct. 1, 8.6 p.c. above the 1952 low. Minor declines followed, but at the end of the year, industrial employment was 6.1 p.c. above its level at the beginning. The average increase over 1951 was 2.6 p.c.

The moderate improvement in 1952 was widely distributed, geographically and industrially. The trend was upward in all provinces. Especially pronounced gains were made in Alberta, where intensified development of natural resources and related industrial growth raised the employment index by 7.5 p.c. as compared with 1951. The movements were more varied in metropolitan areas for which annual comparisons may be made. In 13 centres, industrial activity reached a higher level in 1952, in 3 it showed practically no change on the whole, while in 6 employment was reduced. Strikes had an important effect in certain cities, notably Montreal, Hamilton and Vancouver. In the first-named, however, favourable factors were more weighty, and the index rose by 4 p.c. in the year.

Employment in all major non-agricultural industrial divisions except logging increased in volume in 1952. The falling-off in forestry, amounting to 10.6 p.c., was largely due to lessened demand in overseas markets and to strikes, notably in British Columbia. The 1952 index of employment was nevertheless nearly 65 points higher than in 1939, and almost 24 points higher than in the base year, 1949. The most noteworthy gain as compared with 1951 was recorded in construction, in which the index mounted by 8.5 p.c., to a new maximum. Manufacturing employment as a whole increased 1.2 p.c., with the index in the durable goods division rising by 3.9 p.c., while the non-durable index for 1952 fell by 1.3 p.c. The principal declines were reported in rubber, textile and knitting factories. In the first two, industrial disputes were among the factors contributing to lower levels of activity. Strikes also occasioned losses in employment, hours and earnings in several groups in the durable goods category, notably lumber mills.

Employment for Men and Women

The growth of industrial employment in 1952 took place among men, whose numbers rose by 3.2 p.c. from 1951, while the number of women fell by 1.3 p.c. The difference

in the trends reflected variations in the industrial distribution pattern. Important among these changes, as already mentioned, were curtailment in the textile and textile-using groups, employing many women, and expansion in such industries as transportation equipment and construction, both staffed in the main by men. The following statement shows that the 1952 proportion of women was the lowest recorded since 1946, when monthly sex distribution figures were instituted.

In manufacturing, the proportion fell from 227 per 1,000 in 1951, to 220 in 1952; the number of women declined by 2.0 p.c., but that of men was higher by 2.2 p.c. In the months, Jan. 1 to June 1, 1953, the reported number of women in the major non-agricultural industrial divisions had risen by 7.4 p.c. from the same period in 1952, and by 6.4 p.c. from 1951. In manufacturing, there were increases of 10 p.c. and 3.1 p.c. over the first half of 1952 and 1951, respectively. The advance in the first comparison largely resulted from a return to more usual levels of activity in the textile and textile-using industries.

Payrolls

The payroll expenditures reported in the major industrial divisions reached a new peak in 1952. The index, (1949=100), was 11.7 p.c. above its 1951 level. The effect of rising wage and salary rates was strengthened by generally expanding employment, with relatively greater growth in industries where earnings tend to be above the average. Most areas and industries shared in the upward movement. Industrially, an exception was the textile group, in which the payroll index declined by 4.9 p.c. in 1952 as compared with 1951; the accompanying reduction in employment was 11 p.c.

In spite of the small recession in employment reported in plants producing non-durable manufactured goods in 1952, the weekly wages and salaries disbursed were 8.5 p.c. higher than in 1951. The corresponding increase in the durable manufactured goods division was 10 p.c. In the post-war period, the payroll index in the latter category has mounted by 74 p.c., and in the non-durable classes as a whole by 71 p.c.

Among the non-manufacturing industries included in the monthly surveys, construction reported especially pronounced gains in the payrolls distributed, showing an increase of 23 p.c. from 1951. In the transportation, storage and communication division, the index rose by 10 p.c.; higher wage rates for steam railway employees contributed. As already mentioned, employment in logging was at a lower level in 1952, but the weekly wages and salaries disbursed by the co-operating firms were higher by 15 p.c., in spite of the adverse effect of strikes in Pacific Coast camps, and some slackening in demand for wood products.

Average Weekly Wages and Salaries

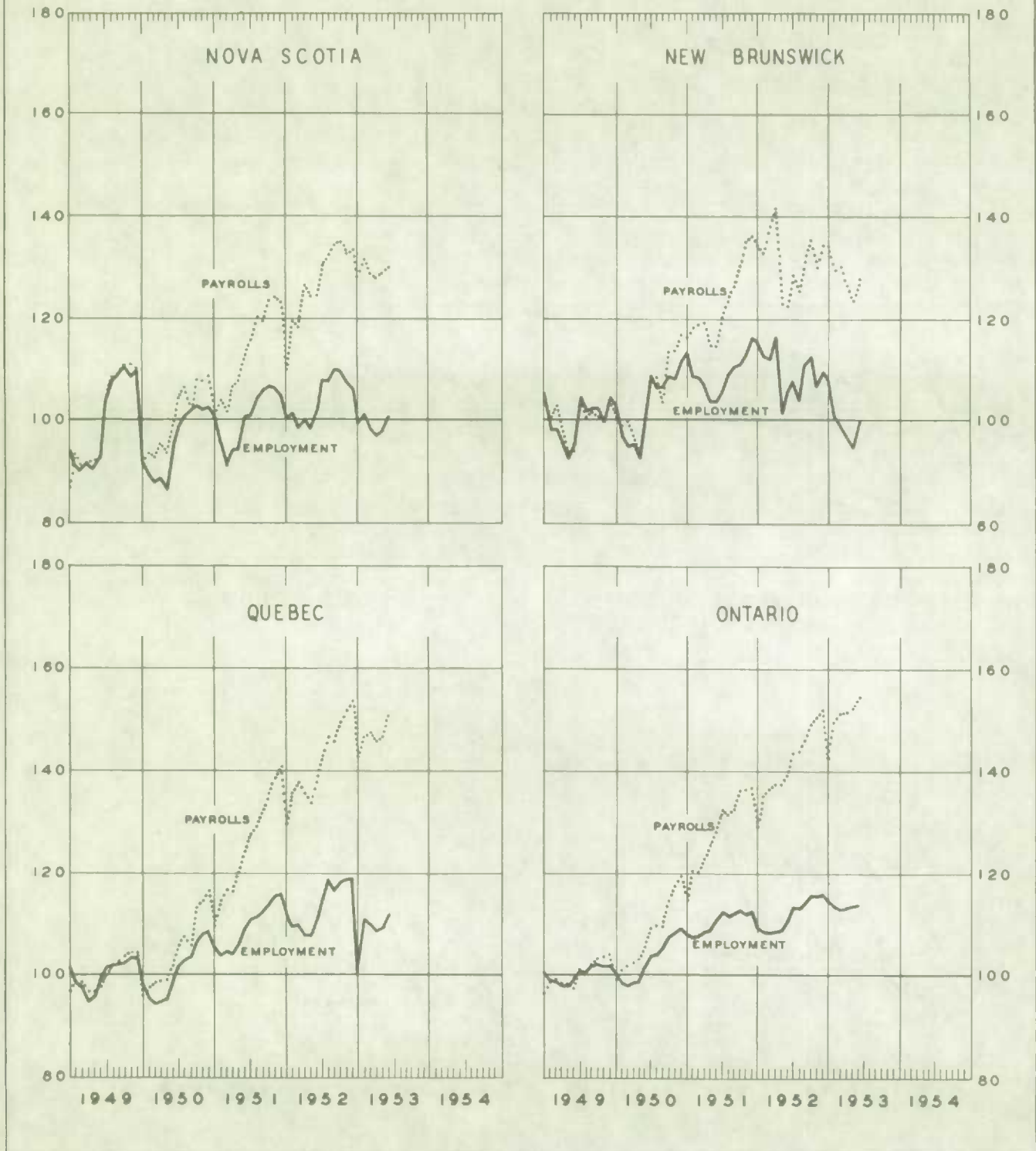
Per capita earnings in the major non-agricultural industries continued to rise during 1952. On only 3 occasions were there declines in the month-to-month comparison. The slight losses then recorded were partly seasonal, due to the employment of numerous workers taken on at below average rates of pay. The existence of industrial disputes, involving in some cases large numbers of men whose earnings usually exceed the general average, was also a factor.

The increase in 1952 over 1951 was 9 p.c., a slightly smaller proportion than in 1951 over 1950, but larger than in either 1950 or 1949 as compared with the preceding year. The rise in average weekly wages and salaries has considerably accelerated during the post-war period. From 1946 to 1952, the general per capita figure mounted by \$21.65, or 66.7 p.c., while from 1939 to 1945, the gain was \$8.60, or 36.7 p.c. In the war years, during most of which wage controls were in effect, the increase largely reflected changes in industrial and occupational distributions as between relatively low-pay and high-pay classes. Substantial amounts of premium overtime work, upgrading as employees acquired new skills, and adjustments in the cost-of-living allowances required for a majority of workers during part of this period were also factors. With the termination of wartime regulations governing wages, and rising living costs, an upswing of wage and salary rates has been the most important factor, affecting all industries and areas. Unusually marked expansion of employment in industries paying above-average rates of wages, in a period of high industrial activity, has also contributed.

Following the pattern of recent years, the per capita earnings in manufacturing in 1952 gained by 9.5 p.c., a slightly larger proportion than was shown in the industrial composite average. From 1946 to 1952, the increase was nearly 73 p.c., in spite of a reduction in the weekly average of hours worked in the larger factories from 42.7 in the first post-war year to 41.5 in 1952. The average of hourly earnings advanced in the same period from 70 cents to \$1.29, or by over 84 p.c.

EMPLOYMENT AND PAYROLLS IN PROVINCES 1949 = 100

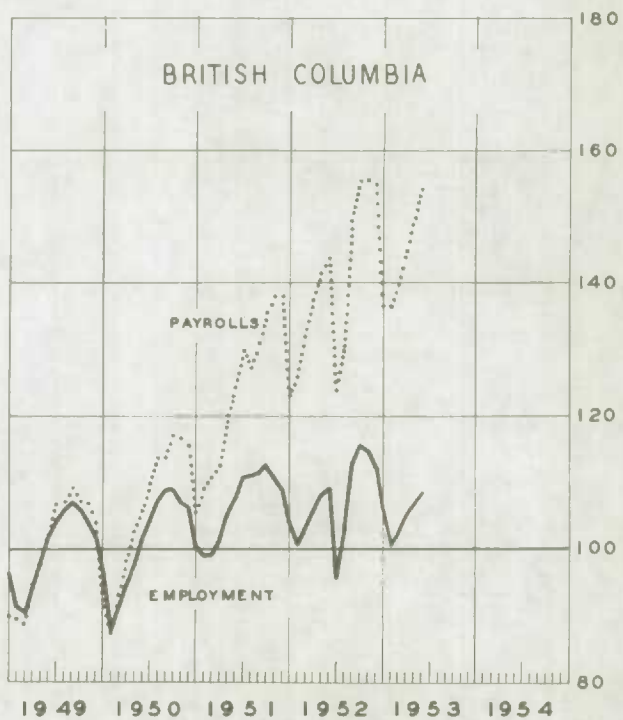
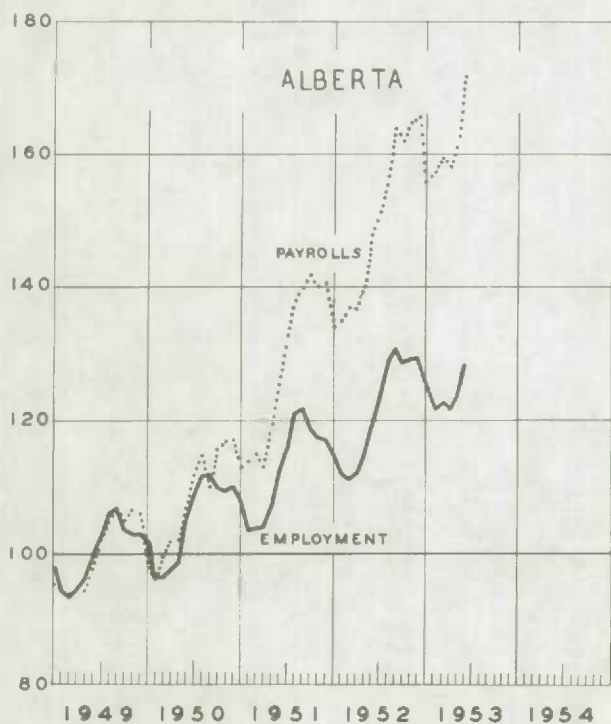
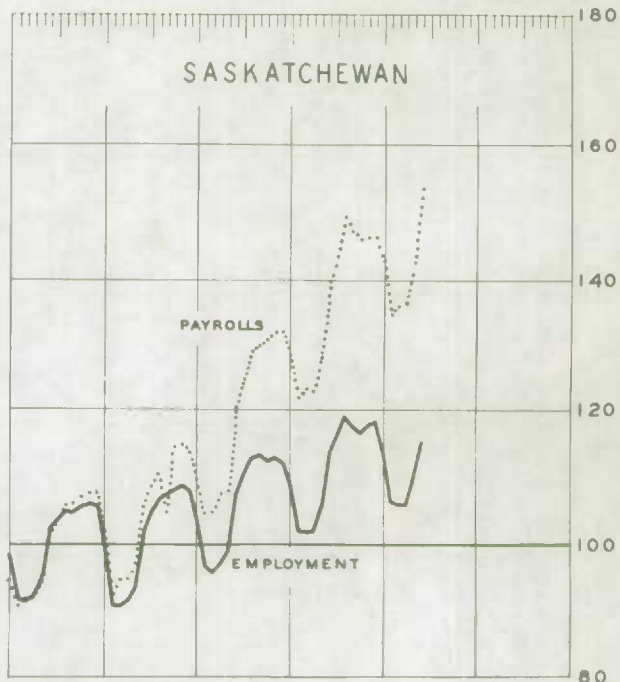
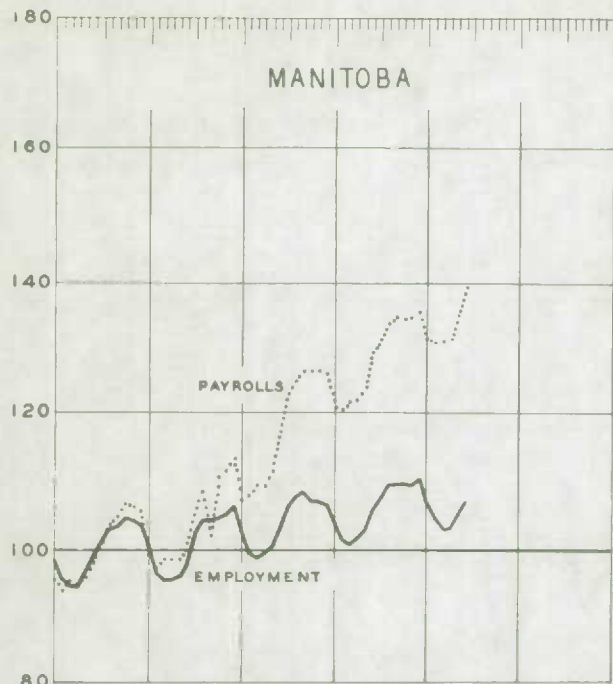

AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGES AND SALARIES IN SPECIFIED INDUSTRIES

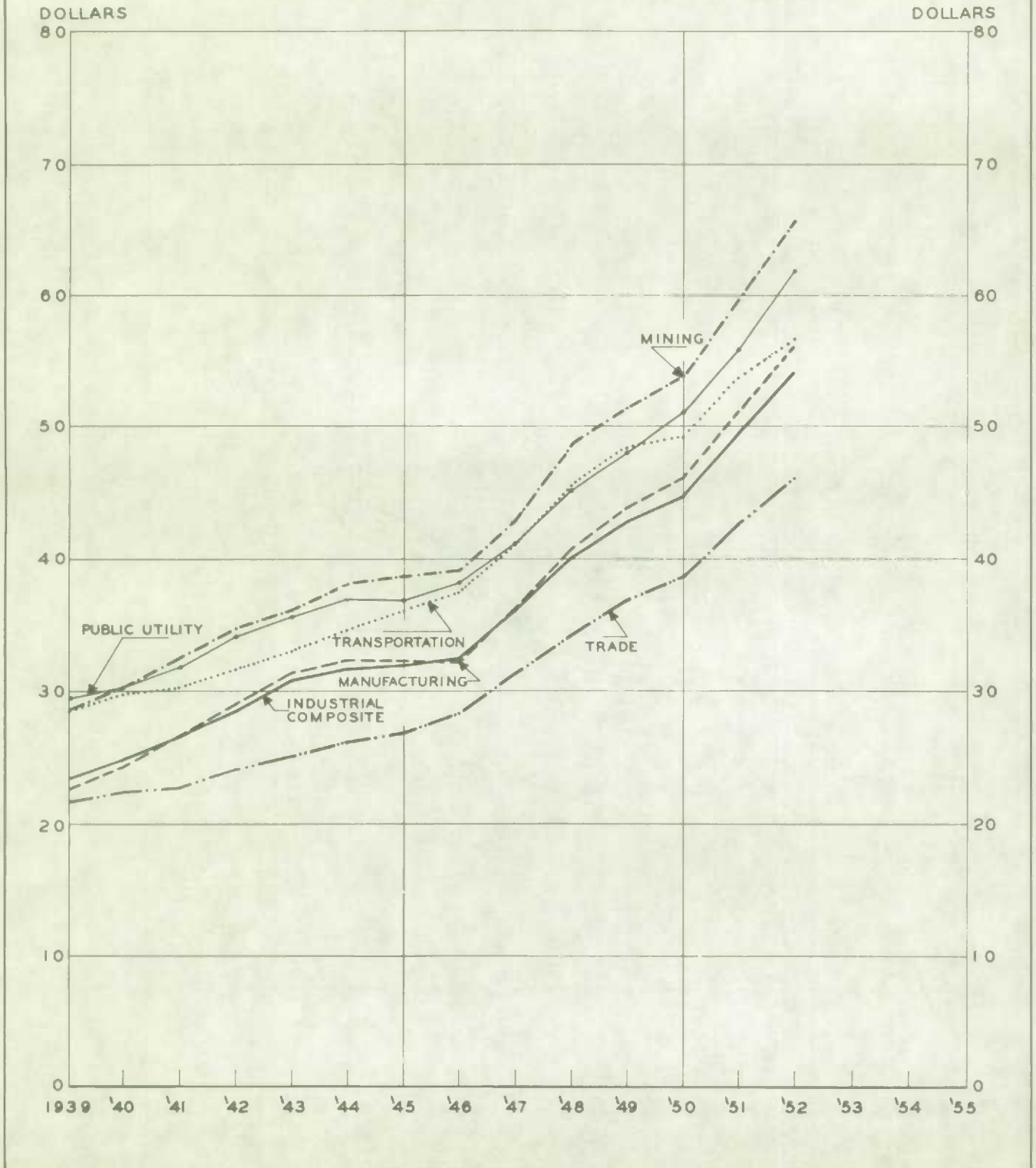

AVERAGE WEEKLY WAGES AND SALARIES IN SPECIFIED INDUSTRIES

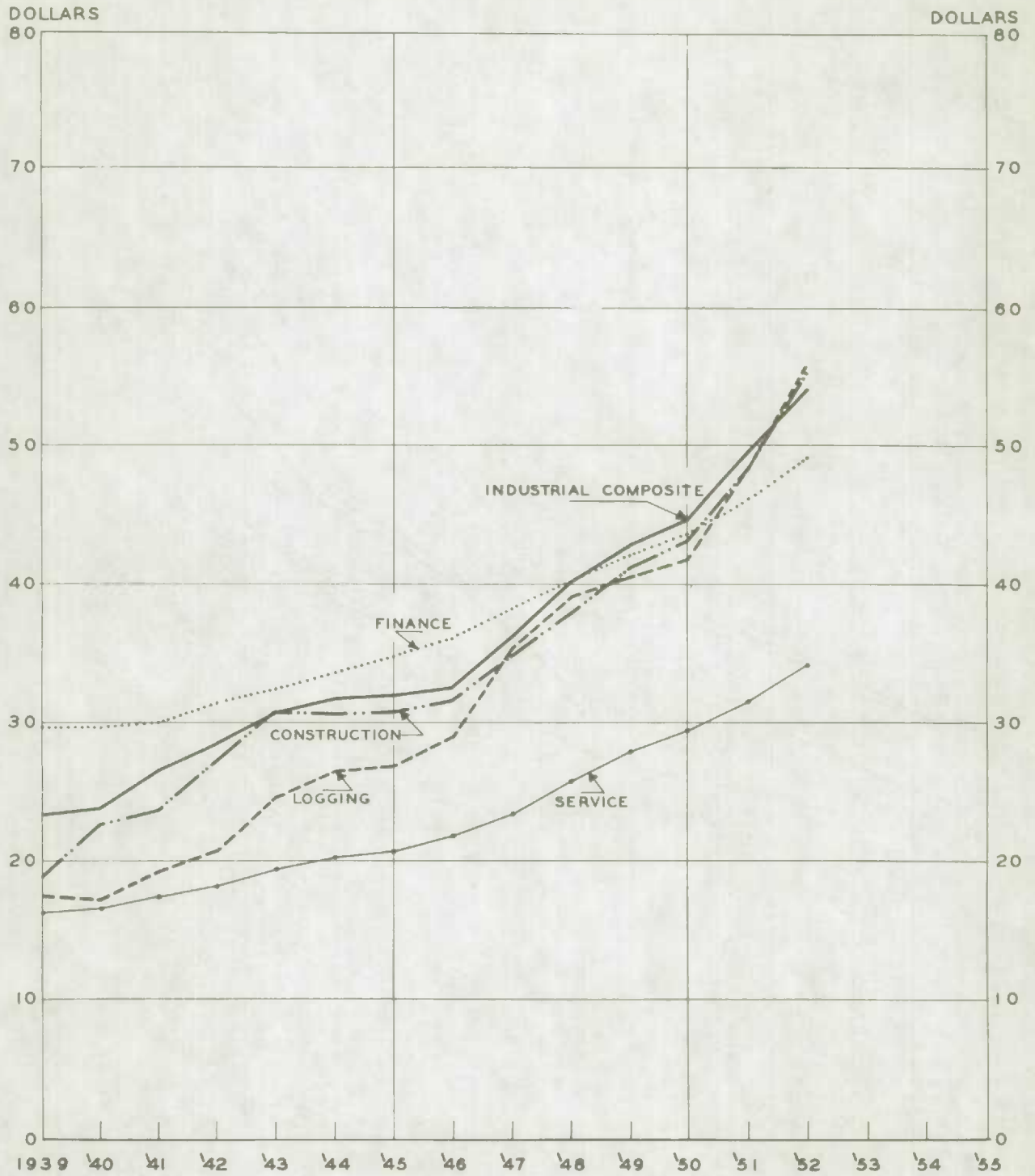

EXPLANATORY NOTES.

General.- The monthly surveys of employment and weekly payrolls relate to the following industries: (1) forestry (mainly logging), (2) mining (including milling), quarrying and oil wells, (3) manufacturing, (4) construction, (5) transportation, storage and communication, (6) public utility operation, (7) trade, (8) finance, insurance and real estate and (9) specified branches of the service industry, chiefly hotels, restaurants, laundries, dry cleaning plants, recreational and business services. For reasons of economy in time and money in collecting and processing the statistics, the surveys do not cover firms usually employing less than 15 persons; establishments reducing their staffs below this minimum are not necessarily removed from the mailing list. Data are requested for all classes of employees, irrespective of their functions in the business; statistics for the owners are not included. Employers operating in two or more lines of business, or in different provinces or cities, are asked to furnish separate monthly returns for their establishments in the different units.

1. Coverage.- Although the monthly surveys are virtually limited to establishments having 15 employees or more, a large and relatively even representation of employment is secured from the various provinces and the cities for which data are segregated. However, a rather uneven though still large industrial representation is obtained, depending upon the organization of particular industries in large or small units of operation. Complete information respecting the distribution of the working population is available only at the dates of the Decennial Census. The distribution of the persons employed at June 1, 1941, by the firms co-operating in the monthly survey, in comparison with the distribution of the wage-earners and salaried employees enumerated in the Census of June 1, 1941, was discussed in the 1944 Annual Review of Employment.

There is a steady growth in the number of firms reporting to the monthly survey, particularly in the industries in which the coverage is low; steps taken to guard against an upward bias in statistics due to this factor are outlined later in Section 5. On the basis of available material, it is estimated that the coverage in the various industries now ranges from about 58 p.c. in the hotel-and-restaurant and laundry-and-dry-cleaning group, and 60 p.c. in trade, to some 94 p.c. in mining and over 86 p.c. in manufacturing; the last two proportions are based on the statistics of the Annual Census of Industry, relating to practically all establishments in the indicated industries. It is estimated that the composite index of employment in the major non-agricultural industrial groups relates to approximately 83 p.c. of the total paid workers in the same industries throughout Canada. Of the total wage-earners and salaried employees in all industries, including agriculture, government and education services, and the other classes excluded from the monthly surveys, as well as persons employed in the industries which are represented, the coverage of the monthly survey is estimated at about 65 p.c.

It is important to note that the statistics of persons employed, as published in the monthly bulletins, do not represent estimates of the total numbers engaged in the specified areas or industries, but show only the distributions of the men and women on the staffs of the co-operating employers at the indicated dates, including their full time and part-time employees.

2. The Questionnaire.- The questionnaire used in the monthly surveys asks employers to state the number of full time, part-time and casual wage-earners and salaried employees drawing pay in the last pay periods in the months, with their payroll disbursements in the same periods. Workers on strike during the reported pay periods are not included in the statistics unless they draw pay from their employer, for example take paid holidays during the dispute. Workers laid off during the pay period as an indirect effect of industrial disputes are not counted as employed.

Employees and earnings are grouped according to the duration of their pay periods, whether these be monthly, semi-monthly, fortnightly, weekly, etc. Gross payrolls are requested, before deductions are made for taxes, unemployment insurance contributions, etc. Overtime payments, cost-of-living allowances, commissions, incentive and production bonuses are also included, as are payments for absence with pay in the reported pay periods.

The reported disbursements do not include employers' contributions to unemployment insurance, workmen's compensation and other welfare plants, nor do they include amounts paid for pensions, retirement gratuities, bonuses paid at irregular or infrequent intervals, and various other supplementary labour costs.

3. The Processing.- Statistics of wages and salaries reported for any period exceeding a week are reduced for tabulation purposes to one week's proportion of the totals, the numerators of the fractions used for this purpose being 5, 6 or 7 days, depending upon the number of days per week on which the establishments operated in the pay period; the denominators of the fractions are the number of working days in the different pay periods. For employees paid at annual or monthly rates, whose earnings are not affected by variations in the number of working days in the month, fixed proportions are used to reduce the earnings to a weekly basis, irrespective of the length of the calendar month. The sums resulting from these various calculations are then aggregated to give the total amounts which would be paid for services rendered in one week by the employees of the co-operating firms. The workers reported are not necessarily employed for a period of a week by any one establishment. In order to guard against duplication in the statistics of employment where individuals may appear on the payrolls of more than one employer in a period of several weeks, establishments are asked to furnish data only for the last pay period in the month for their various classes of employees.

4. The Tabulation.- The material tabulated each month shows the number of workers drawing pay from the establishments furnishing returns, and the weekly earnings of such employees, with similar information for the men and women employed by the same firms a month earlier, and in the basic period (1939). The statistics of the first tabulation for each month are preliminary; the re-tabulation of the data on the succeeding month's tabulation permits the incorporation of revisions in the material originally tabulated, and the inclusion of returns received too late for the preliminary tabulation.

5. The Index Numbers.- The index numbers of employment and payrolls represent the percentage relationships between the employees of the establishments currently furnishing data and their aggregate weekly earnings, and the corresponding 1939 average figures of these employers. The 1939 figures of employment and payrolls for firms which have since gone out of business are continued in the basic averages; firms or branches opening for business since 1939 are tabulated with zero base figures. The basic averages of establishments which operated in 1939 but have since been added to the mailing list, have been incorporated in the base figures from the date when their co-operation was first obtained. The index number of average weekly wages and salaries relate the average earnings of persons employed by the reporting firms at a given date to the average earnings of their employees in 1939.

6. The Weekly Wages and Salaries.- The statistics of average weekly earnings result from the division of the aggregate weekly wages and salaries disbursed in the last pay periods in the month by the co-operating establishments, by the number of their full time and part-time employees in the same pay periods. The figures represent gross earnings, before deductions are made for unemployment insurance contributions, taxes, etc. In addition to basic wages and salaries, the earnings include overtime payments, shift premiums, commissions, cost-of-living, incentive and production bonuses, and other bonuses paid at frequent intervals. They also include amounts paid employees absent on leave with pay during the reported pay periods, i.e., during vacations, statutory holidays, sick leave, etc.

The earnings do not include the value of free board and lodging and other perquisites, employers' contributions to unemployment insurance, workmen's compensation and other welfare funds. Also excluded are the cost to employers of certain other employee benefits, such as bonuses paid at irregular or infrequent intervals, (e.g. annual bonuses), pensions, retirement gratuities, etc.

The revised figures of earnings in the monthly bulletins incorporate retroactive pay for one month, corrections in the material originally tabulated, and data received too late for inclusion in the first tabulation; for the most part, such adjustments are not made for more than one month.

Footnotes.

The following footnotes explain the content of various industrial classes listed in the detailed tables in this bulletin. In some industries, the group breakdown is less extensive than in the Standard Industrial Classification; in these cases, figures for certain categories not shown are contained in the group totals.

- (a) Alluvial gold and auriferous quartz mining.
- (b) Copper-gold-silver; iron, nickel-copper; silver-cobalt; silver-lead-zinc, and miscellaneous metal mining.
- (c) Non-metal mining and quarrying, clay and sand pits.
- (d) Carbonated beverages and wines.
- (e) Biscuits and crackers; miscellaneous foods.
- (f) Leather gloves and mittens; tanneries; miscellaneous leather products.
- (g) Miscellaneous wood products.
- (h) Paper boxes and bags; roofing papers; miscellaneous paper products.
- (i) Household, office and store machinery; machine tools; machinery, n.e.s.
- (j) Abrasive, asbestos, hydraulic cement, clay, glass, lime and gypsum, stone, concrete and miscellaneous non-metallic products.
- (k) Buildings and structures, other construction, and special trade contractors.
- (l) Interurban bus and coach and urban and suburban transportation systems.
- (m) Includes services incidental to water transportation.
- (n) Gas manufacture and distribution; water and sanitary services, and other public utilities.
- (o) Chiefly recreational and business services.
- (p) Interurban bus and coach and urban and suburban transportation systems; taxi-cab and truck transportation; services incidental to transportation, and other transportation.
