AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$1.5 BILLION IN 2015


IOWA EXPORTED \$844 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$190M in animal feed (incl. \$128M in soybean meal)
- \$155M in ethanol
- \$136M in fresh/frozen pork
- \$41M in corn (incl. \$29M in corn seed)
- \$41M in animal feed preparations

IOWA IMPORTED \$619 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:


- \$158M in live animals (incl. \$127M in hogs)
- \$139M in oats
- \$74M in fresh/frozen meat (incl. \$52M in pork)
- \$39M in refined canola oil
- \$32M in wheat

A STRONG PARTNERSHIP IN TRADE:

Feeding an integrated supply chain! – Canada-Iowa trade is all about “making things together”. Consider the pork sector. Canadian farmers feed their hogs with soybean meal grown in Iowa. When the hogs are ready, Canadian farmers export them to Iowa for processing. Once processed, Iowa sends the finished pork back to Canada. In 2015, Canada imported \$136M in fresh and frozen pork from Iowa! Iowa processors can count on Canadian producers to keep plants operating at full capacity, and Iowa's expertise in pork processing provides Canadians with a variety of meat products. The story of the pork sector, from feed to farms to processing to market, is a great example of our efficient and effective integrated supply chains.
