### AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$9 MILLION IN 2015

#### ALASKA EXPORTED \$2 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

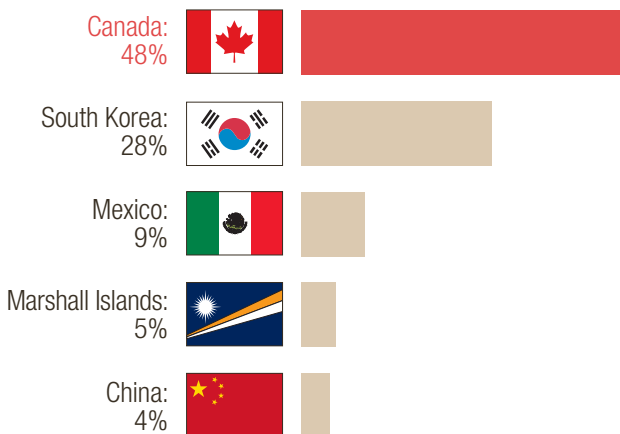
- \$120K in fur skins
- \$106K in berries
- \$86K in rice
- \$74K in fresh/frozen chicken meat
- \$61K in fertilized chicken eggs

#### ALASKA IMPORTED \$7 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$5M in animal feed
- \$639K in live plants
- \$391K in malt
- \$356K in live animals (incl. \$265K in hogs)
- \$185K in food preparations\*

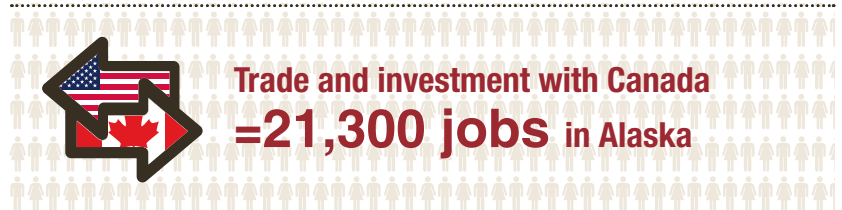
\* The category "food preparations" includes products such as tea substitutes, vegetable preparations, flavoring extracts, powders and essences, milk or cream substitutes, jelly powders, and juices from concentrate.

#### A STRONG PARTNERSHIP IN TRADE:

- Canada is the top destination for U.S. exports of agricultural products.
- Supply chains that cross our shared border are cost-effective and efficient because of the proximity to each other's agricultural inputs and products.
- Canada is a major destination for value-added U.S. agriculture products, which helps sustain American trade jobs.
- Canada purchased over \$25B in agriculture and agri-food products from the U.S. in 2015, of which \$2M came from Alaska, showcasing our strong partnership in trade.
