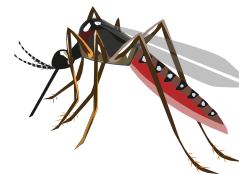
ZIKA VIRUS

IS MAINLY SPREAD TO PEOPLE THROUGH THE BITE OF
INFECTED MOSQUITOES

Zika virus infection in a **PREGNANT WOMAN**
could be **TRANSMITTED TO HER DEVELOPING BABY.**

On some occasions, **IT HAS ALSO BEEN REPORTED
TO BE TRANSMITTED THROUGH:**

- Sexual contact with semen from an infected man
- Blood transfusions from infected donors



IF YOU ARE A:

WOMAN WISHING TO BECOME PREGNANT –

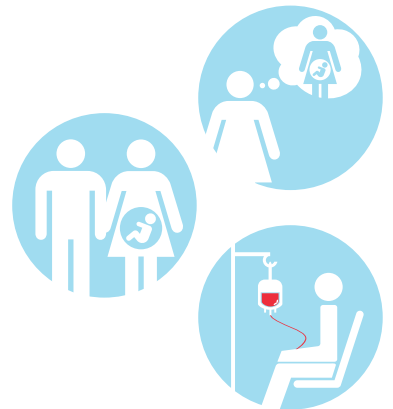
wait at least two months after your return before trying to conceive.

MAN –

use condoms for **two** months after your return with a partner who could become pregnant and use condoms for **the duration** of the pregnancy with a partner who is pregnant.

BLOOD DONOR –

wait at least 21 days after your return to donate blood.



If you get sick while travelling or within 14 days after your return,
see a health care provider and tell them where you have been travelling or living.
