PREFACE

The PS8000 schedule for the classification of Canadian literature was developed in response to a need in Canada for a more specific treatment of the topic than that provided by the Library of Congress schedules. In particular, a comprehensive classification scheme for Canadian literature regardless of language is considered preferable in the Canadian context to the arrangement provided by the Library of Congress classification which separates Canadian literature by language, for example placing Canadian literature in English in PR, Canadian literature in French in PQ.

The Canadian Task Group on Cataloguing Standards examined the 1964 version of the PS8000 schedule used by the National Library and a number of other Canadian libraries, and concluded that the schedule needed to be expanded, revised and brought up to date but not fundamentally changed. In its report to the National Librarian in 1972 the Task Group recommended that the National Library assume responsibility for the revision. Accordingly the National Library contracted with Mr. T.R. McCloy, who had devised PS8000 originally, to update the schedule.

It is not possible for the Library of Congress to adopt PS8000 and to incorporate it into its own classification because PS8000 differs in principle from Library of Congress practice, both in its assembling of Canadian literature regardless of language and in keeping novels with the rest of Canadian literature instead of placing them in PZ.

The Library of Congress however recognizes a need for PS8000 and endorses its use as an official alternate classification scheme. In order to eliminate the danger of a conflict in notation at some future date, the Library of Congress gives assurance that it will never develop the PS8000 area for its own uses.

INTRODUCTION

The original PS8000 schedule for Canadian literature was compiled some twenty-five years ago by T.R. McCloy for use in the library of the Public Archives of Canada. A somewhat modified version was prepared in 1964 and xeroxed copies were made available to other libraries.

PS8000 was based on the Library of Congress classification schedule for American literature in English. (American literature in other languages is classed with other literatures in those languages). The intention of the compiler of PS8000 was that all Canadian literature, regardless of language or other considerations, would be classified as one literature. Nevertheless only odd numbers were used in the PS8000 schedule, leaving even numbers optional for the separate classification of French Canadian literature.

Some libraries have classified all Canadian literature together, some have used odd and even numbers for English and French respectively but most have adopted the practice, not anticipated in the original schedule, of simply converting PS8000 to PS9000 for French Canadian literature.

The Canadian Task Group on Cataloguing Standards (see its Report, 1972) found that no complete revision of PS8000 was necessary and recommended only that the schedule be updated. Specific mention was made of the need for period divisions. Accordingly this version of PS8000 has been somewhat expanded but has undergone no fundamental changes. Only odd numbers continue to be given, leaving open the option of using even numbers for French Canadian literature (e.g. General works on English Canadian poetry, PS8141; on French Canadian poetry, PS8142). English and French can be either intershelved in strict numerical order, or arbitrarily shelved in separate sequences, odd and even. However, the use of even numbers is not recommended. It is preferable to substitute PS9000 for French Canadian literature (e.g. General works on English Canadian poetry, PS8141; on French Canadian poetry, PS9141).

If this revised version of PS8000 is adopted in toto, some reclassification will be necessary. By the introduction of hitherto unused numbers or by the use of decimals new subjects have been added and subjects already included have been separated or subdivided. (See the Comparison Table following the Introduction). Efforts have been made, however, to prevent conflicts, that is to avoid assigning to numbers in this version a meaning which is completely different from the meaning of the same number used in 1964. Inevitably, numbers used in one version may mean rather more or rather less than the same numbers used in the other version. It is hoped that, nevertheless, the objective has been attained of permitting this version to be used to expand the 1964 version without the confusion which would ensue from totally contradictory numbers.

A problem which has not been solved is the classification of Canadian literature in languages other than English or French. Adequate provision for separate but associated treatment of these literatures could be made only with considerable restructuring and

expansion of the classification. A survey of opinion among Canadian librarians showed a preference for maintaining the status quo, so the only change has been to add some new places for other languages under Collections.

The effect of singling out only one language for separate classification is of course to throw together all other languages used in Canada. For example, if a decision is made to use PS9000 exclusively for French Canadian literature, then English and all other languages must be classified in PS8000. Some provision has been made within PS8000 for distinguishing history and criticism and collections of the literature of Canadian ethnic groups other than English or French. In all other cases, however, including classification of the work of individual authors writing in "non-official" Canadian languages, no distinction is made. It also follows that general works treating English and French Canadian literature together may not be distinguishable from those treating English alone. For example, PS8141 would include history and criticism both of English Canadian poetry alone and of English and French Canadian poetry together.

Mr. T.R. McCloy, under contract to the National Library, is primarily responsible for this revision of PS8000. Some additions and changes were subsequently made in response to comments from potential users to whom a preliminary draft of the schedule was circulated.

NOTES

Relationship to Library of Congress classification.

PS8000 is an independent schedule for Canadian literature but it is designed to be used with the Library of Congress classification in other fields. References made to classification numbers outside PS8000 are to numbers in the Library of Congress schedules.

Subdivision by language.

Where the schedule calls for subdivision by cutter number to indicate the language of an ethnic group, guidance may be obtained by consulting the list under E184 in the E schedule. Note that in some cases names should be modernized.

Subdivision by period.

Where topics are subdivided by historical period, class in the period in which the work ends, e.g. History and criticism of Canadian literature, 1900 - 1950, class in PS8115; from the beginning to 1975, class in PS8117.

Subdivision by cutter number.

Where topics are subdivided by .A - .Z, .A1 should be reserved for general, collective or polyglot works even though such works are not always specified in the schedule.

Substantive changes only. Minor changes in wording, added notes, examples, etc. omitted.
