The Royal Charter for incorporating  
the Hudson's Bay Company, granted  
by His Majesty King Charles the  
Second, in the 22<sup>nd</sup> year of his  
Reign - A.D. 1670.

Charles the Second, by the grace  
of God, King of England, Scotland,  
France and Ireland - Defender  
of the Faith, &c &c.

To all whom these presents  
shall come, Greeting -

Whereas Our dear and entirely  
beloved Cousin, Prince Rupert,  
Count Palatine of the Rhine,  
Duke of Bavaria and Cumberland,  
&c. &c. Christopher, Duke of  
Albemarle, William, Earl of Ormonde,  
Henry, Lord Arlington, Anthony,  
Lord Ashley, Sir John Robinson,  
and Sir Robert Kyer, Knights

and

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and Baronets; Sir Peter Colleton,  
Baronet; Sir Edward Hungerford,  
Knight of the Bath; Sir Paul Hele,  
Knight; Sir John Griffith, and  
Sir Philip Carteret, Knights; James  
Hayes, John Kirke, Francis Kell-  
ington, William Petty, man,  
Oliver Fenn Esquires, and other  
Portuaries, Citizens and Goldsmiths  
of London; have at their own  
great cost and charges, undertaken  
an expedition for Hudson's Bay  
in the North West part of America,  
for the discovery of a new passage  
into the South Sea, and for the  
finding some trade for furs,  
minerals and other considerable  
commodities: and by such their  
undertaking, have already made  
such discoveries as do encourage  
them to proceed further in  
pursuance of their said design;

by

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by means whereof, there may  
probably arise very great damage  
to us and our Kingdom;  
and whereas, the said undertaken  
for their further encouragement  
in the said design, have humbly  
besought us to incorporate them,  
and grant unto them, and their  
successors, the sole trade and  
commerce of all those Seas, Straits,  
Bays, Rivers, Lakes, Creeks, and  
Sound, in whatsoever latitude  
they shall be, that lie within the  
entrance of the Straits commonly  
called Hudson's Straits, together  
with all the lands, countries and  
territories upon the Coasts and  
confines of the Seas, Straits, Bays,  
Lakes, Rivers, creeks and sounds  
aforesaid, which are not now  
actually possessed by any of  
our Subjects, or by the Subjects

of

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of any other Christian Prince or  
State, now know ye, that we  
being desirous to promote all  
endeavours tending to the Public  
good of our People, and to en-  
courage the said undertaking,  
Laws of our special grace,  
certaine Rentes, and hered  
incomes, given, granted, ratified,  
and confirmed, and by these  
we sent for us, our heirs, and  
successors, to give, grant, ratify  
and confirm, unto our said cousin  
Prince Rupert, Christopher Ratke  
of Althemarle, William Earl of  
Barre, Henry Lord Wellington,  
Anthony Lord Whalley, Sir John  
Robertson, Sir Robert Kymer, Sir  
Peter Colleton, Sir Edward Hunger-  
ford, Sir Paul Neale, Sir John  
Griffith and Sir Philip Carteret,  
John Hayes, John Kirk, Francis  
Wellington

Willington, William Pettyman,  
John Penn, and John Portman,  
that they and such others as shall  
be admitted into the said Society  
as is hereafter expressed, shall  
be one body corporate and  
Politie, in deed and in name,  
by the name of the "Governor and  
Company of Adventurers of  
England trading into Hudson's  
Bay" and then by the name of  
"The Governor and Company of  
Adventurers of England trading  
into Hudson's Bay" one body  
corporate and Politie in deed  
and in name, really and fully  
for ever, for us, our heirs and  
successors, we do make, ordain  
constitute, establish, confirm  
and declare, by these Presents, and  
that by the same name of Governor  
and Company of Adventurers of  
England,

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England Trading into Hudson's  
Bay, they shall have perpetual  
succession, and that they and their  
successors, by the name of the  
"Governor and Company of Ad-  
mirers of England trading into  
Hudson's Bay", he, and at all times  
hereafter shall be possessed and  
capable in Law, to have, purchase  
seize, possess, enjoy, and retain  
lands, rents, privileges, liberties,  
jurisdictions, franchises, and  
hereditaments, of what kind,  
nature, or quality soever they be, to  
him, and their successors, and also  
to give, grant, demise, alien, assign,  
and dispose lands, tenements, and  
hereditaments, and to do and  
execute all and singular other  
things by the same name, that to them  
shall or may appertain to do: and  
that they and their successors, by  
the

the name of "The Governor and  
Company of Adventurers of England  
trading into Hudson's Bay" may  
plead and be impleaded, answered,  
and be answered, defended and be  
defended, in whatsoever Courts and  
places, before whatsoever Justices  
and Justices and other persons  
and officers, in all and singular  
actions, pleas, suits, quarrels,  
causes, and demands whatsoever,  
of whatsoever kind, nature, or  
sort, in such manner and form  
as any other, our liege people of  
the our Realm of England, being  
persons able and capable in law,  
may or can have, purchase, re-  
ceive, possess, enjoy, retain, give,  
grant, devise, alien, assign,  
dispose, plead, defend and be defend-  
ed, do, pernent, and exercise, and  
that the said Governor and Company

of Adventurers of England trading

successors may have a common  
Seal, to serve for all the causes  
and business of them and their  
successors, and that it shall and  
may be lawful to the said Governor  
and Company, and their successors,  
the same seal from time to time,

change, and to make new, or alter  
as to them shall seem expedient.

And further we will, and by  
these presents, for us, our heirs,  
and successors, we do ordain,  
that there shall be from henceforth  
one of the said company to be  
elected and appointed in such form  
as hereafter in these presents is  
expressed, which shall be called the  
Governor of the said Company,  
and that the said Governor and

and not otherwise; and that they  
shall have, hold, retain and enjoy  
the grants, liberties, privileges

only hereafter in these presents  
granted and expressed, and no  
other; and for the better execution  
of our will, and grant in this  
behalf, we have attested, notari-  
eate of, constituted, and made,  
and by these presents for us, our  
heirs, and successors, we do assign,

our said Cousin, Prince Rupert,  
to be the first and present Governor  
of the said Company, and to  
continue in the said office, from  
the date of these presents, until the

Company in future hereafter ex-  
-plained: And also we have  
assigned, nominated, and appoint-  
ed, and by these presents, for us,  
our heirs, and successors, we do  
assign, nominate and constitute,  
the said Sir John Robinson, Sir  
Robert Wyner, Sir Peter Colleton,  
James Hayes, John Kirke, Francis  
Willington, and John Portman,  
to be the seven first and present  
Committee of the said Company  
from

From the date of these presents, until  
the said 10<sup>th</sup> day of November, then  
and next following, and so until  
new Committees shall be chosen, in  
form hereafter specified.

And further we will and grant  
by these presents, for us, our Heirs  
and Successors, unto the Said  
Governor and Company, and their  
Successors, that it shall and may  
be lawful to send for the Said Gov-  
ernor and Company, for the time  
being, or the greater part of them,  
picked at any Publick Assembly  
commonly called the Court General,  
to be holden for the Said Company,  
the Governor of the Said Company  
being always one, from time to  
time, to elect, nominate and  
appoint one of the Said Company  
to be Deputy to the Said Governor  
which Deputy shall take a Capital  
oath

well, truly and faithfully to  
execute his said Office of Deputy

and after his oath so taken shall

ought to do; And further we will,  
and grant by these presents, for  
us, our Heirs, and Successors,  
all to the said Governor and Company  
of Adventurers of England, trading

successors, that they or the greater  
part of them, whereof the Governor  
for the time being or his Deputy be  
one, from time to time, and at  
all

all times, hereafter, shall and  
may have authority and power,  
yearly, and every year, between  
the first and last day of November,  
to assemble and meet together in  
some convenient place to be  
appointed from time to time, by  
the Governor, or in his absence  
by the Deputy of the said Governor  
for the time being, or the greater  
part of them which then shall  
happen to be present, whereof the  
Governor of the said Company  
or his Deputy for the time being  
to be one, to elect and nominate  
one of the said Company which  
shall be Governor of the said  
Company for the whole year then  
next following, whose person being  
so elected and nominated, to be  
Governor of the said Company, as  
is aforesaid, before he be admitted  
to

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To the execution of the said Office,  
I shall take a corporal oath, before  
the last Governor, being his Pre-  
decessor or his Deputy, and any  
three or more of the Committee  
of the said Company for the time  
being, that he shall from time to  
time, well and truly execute the  
office of Governor of the said  
Company in all things concerning  
the same, and that immediately  
after the said oath so taken, he  
shall and may execute and discharge  
the said office of Governor of the  
said Company, for one whole  
year, from thence next following;  
And in like sort, we will and  
grant, that as well everyone of  
the above named to be of the said  
Company or Fellowship, as all  
others hereafter to be admitted or  
free of the said Company, shall  
take

take a corporal oath before the Governor of the said Company or his Deputy for the time being, to such effect, as by the said Governor and Company shall be  
the greater part of them in any Public Court to be hold for the said Company, shall be in a reasonable and legal manner set down and devised, before they shall be allowed or admitted to trade or traffick as a Freeman of the said Company;

and further we will and grant by these presents for us, our heirs, and successors, unto the said Governor and Company, and their successors, that the said Governor or Deputy Governor, and the rest of the said Company, and their successors, for the time being, or the greater part of them whereof

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Governor,  
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whereof the Governor or Deputy  
Governor from time to time shall  
be one, shall and may from time  
to time, and at all times hereafter  
take power and authority yearly  
and every year, between the first  
and last day of November to  
assemble and meet together in  
some convenient place from time  
to time to be appointed by the said  
Governor of the said Company,  
or in his absence by his Deputy;  
and that they being so assembled,  
it shall and may be lawful to  
and for the said Governor or his  
Deputy, and the Company for the  
time being, or the greater part of  
them, which then shall happen  
to be present, whereof the Governor  
of the said Company or his Deputy  
for the time being to be one, to elect  
and nominate seven of the said  
Company

Company which shall be a  
Committee of the said Company  
for one whole year from the next  
ensuing, which persons being so  
elected and constituted to be a  
Committee of the said Company  
as aforesaid, before they be ad-  
mitted to the execution of their  
Office shall take a corporal  
oath before the Governor or his  
Deputy, and any three or more of  
the said Committee of the said  
Company, being their last pre-  
decessors, that they and every  
of them shall well and faithfully  
perform their said Office of  
Committee in all things concern-  
ing the same, and that immedi-  
ately after the said oath so taken  
they shall and may execute and  
use their said Office of Commit-  
tee of the said Company for one  
whole

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whole year from thence next  
following: And moreover our  
will, and pleasure is, and by  
these presents, for us, our heirs,  
and successors, we do grant  
unto the said Governor and  
Company and their Successors,  
that when and as often as it  
shall happen, the Governor or  
Deputy Governor of the said Com-  
pany for the time being, at any  
time within one year after that  
he shall be nominated, elected  
and sworn to the office of the  
Governor of the said Company  
as is aforesaid, to die, or to be  
removed from the said office,  
which Governor or Deputy Govr.  
nor not demeaning himself  
well in his said office, we will be  
removable at the pleasure of  
the rest of the said Company, or  
the

the greater part of them which  
shall be present at their Public  
Assemblies, commonly called  
their General Courts held for  
the said Company, that then and  
so often it shall and may be  
lawful to and for the lessee of  
the said Company for the time  
being or the greater part of them  
within a convenient time after  
the death or removing of any such  
Governor or Deputy Governor to  
assemble themselves in such  
convenient place as they shall  
think fit, for the election of the  
Governor or Deputy Governor of  
the said Company and that the  
said Company or the greater part  
of them being then and there present,  
shall and may, then and there,  
before their departure from the  
said place, elect and nominate  
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the other of the said Company,  
to be Governor or Deputy Governor  
for the said Company, in the  
place and stead of him that so  
died or was removed, which  
person being so elected and  
ominated to the office of  
Governor or Deputy Governor  
of the said Company, shall have  
and exercise the said Office  
for and during the residue of  
the said year, taking first a  
Superal Oath, as is aforesaid  
for the due execution hereof,  
and this to be done from time  
to time, so often as the case  
shall so require: And also our  
will and pleasure it is, and by  
these presents for us, our heirs  
and successors, we do grant unto  
the said Governor and Company  
that when and as often as it  
shall

choose of the Committee of the  
said Company for the time being,  
at any time within one year  
next after that they or any of  
them shall be nominated, elected  
and sworn to the Office of  
Committee of the said Company  
as is aforesaid, to die, or be  
removed from the said Office,

ding themselves well in their said  
Office, we will to be removable  
at the pleasure of the said Governor  
and Company, or the greater part  
of them, whereof the Governor of  
the said Company for the time

that there and so often, it shall  
and may be lawful to an act

the most part of them; And of our  
more abundant grace and favor  
to the said Governor and Company,  
we do hereby declare our will and  
pleasure to be, that if it shall so  
happen that any of the persons

pany of Adventurers of England  
trading into Hudson's Bay, who  
shall before the going forth of any  
Ship or Ships appointed for a  
voyage, or otherwise, promise or  
agree, by writing under his or  
their hands, to adventure any

deliver to the Treasurer or Treasurers appointed for the Company, such sums of money as shall have been extreasted and set down in writing by the said persons or person subscribed with the names of the said Adventurer or Adventurers, that they and their at all times after it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Governor and Company, or the more part of them present, whereof the said Governor or his Deputy to be one, at any of their General Courts or General Assemblies, to examine and disprauel him or them, and every such person and persons at their wills and pleasures, and he or they so embezzled and disprauelled not to be permitted to trade into the countries, territories and islands before said

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of the said, or any part thereof, nor  
to have any advection or stock  
going or remaining with or amongst  
the said Company, without the  
special license of the said Governor  
and Company, or the like part of  
them present at any General  
Court, first had and obtained in  
that behalf, anything before in  
these presents, to the contrary thereof  
in any wise notwithstanding.

And be it will and pleasure to,  
and hereby we do also ordain that  
it shall and may be lawful to and  
for the said Governor and Company  
or the greater part of them, whereof  
the Governor for the time being or  
his Deputy to be one, to advertise  
and to be of the said Company, all  
such seruants of factors, of such  
the said Company, and all such  
others as to them, or the workfard

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of them present, at any Court held  
for the said Company, the Governor  
or his Deputy being one, shall be  
thought fit and agreeable, with  
the Orders and Ordinances made  
and to be made for the Govern-  
ment of the said Company:  
And further our will and pleasure  
is, and by these presents for us,  
our heirs, and successors, we do  
grant unto the said Governor  
and Company, and to their succes-  
sors, that it shall and may be  
lawful in all elections and by-  
laws to be made by the General  
Court of the Advocates of the  
said Company, that every person  
that shall be a member of votes  
according to his stock, that is to  
say, for every hundred pounds by  
him subscribed or brought into the  
present stock, one vote, and that

any

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any of those that have subscribed  
less than one hundred Pounds,  
may join their respective towns,  
to make up the hundred Pounds  
and have one vote jointly for the  
same, and not otherwise.

And further by our especial grace  
certain Proclamations, and were  
motion, we do, for us, our heirs  
and successors grant to and  
with the said Governor and  
Company of Advertiser of  
England trading into Hudson's  
Bay, that all traders, factors,  
merchants, plantations, ports,  
fortifications, factories, or colonies  
where the said Company's factors  
and trade are or shall be, within  
any the ports or places aforesaid,  
shall be immediately  
and from henceforth under the  
power and command of the

Said Governor and Company,  
their successors and assigns,  
saving the faith and allegiance  
due to be performed to His, our  
Sire and Successors as aforesaid  
and that the Said Governor and  
Company shall have liberty, full  
power, and authority to appoint  
and establish Governors and all  
other officers to govern them, and  
that the Governor and his Council  
of the several and respective places,  
where the Said Company shall

Kingdom, and to execute Justice  
accordingly, and in case any  
crime or misdeemeanor shall  
be committed in any of the said  
Company's Plantations, ports or  
factories, or places of trade with-  
in the limits aforesaid, where  
Judicature cannot be executed  
for want of a Governor and  
Council there, then in such case  
it shall also may be lawful for  
the Chief Factor of that place and  
his Council to transact the party  
together with the offence, to such  
other Plantation, factory or port  
where there shall be a Governor  
and Council, where Justice may  
be executed, or into this Kingdom  
of England, as shall be thought  
most convenient, there to receive  
such punishment, as the nature  
of his offence shall deserve, and  
Justice done.

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Moreover, the will and pleasure  
is, and by these presents for us,  
our heirs and successors, we do,  
give and grant unto Sir. M. R. B.  
Governor and Company, and  
their Successors, full liberty and  
license, in case they conceive it  
necessary, to send either Ships of  
war, men, or ammunition, unto  
any their Plantations, forts, fac-  
tories, or places of trade aforesaid,  
for the security and defense of  
the same, and to choose command-  
ers and officers over them, and  
to give them power and authority  
by commission under their  
Common Seal, or otherwise, to  
confine or make peace or war  
with any prince or people what-  
soever, that are not Christians,  
in any places where the said  
Company shall have any Plantations  
Forts,

To let, or to close, or to do, and  
thereabouts as shall be need for  
the advantage and benefit of  
the said Governor and Company,  
and of their trade, and also to  
right and recuperate themselves

nor and Company, and their

Bay, or inhabit in any of the

orders, and send them to England,  
and that all and every person  
or persons, being our Subjects  
any ways employed by the said  
Governor and Company, within  
any the parts, places and towns  
aforesaid, shall be liable to and  
suffer such punishment for  
any offence(s) by them commit-  
ted in the parts aforesaid, as the  
President and Council for the  
said Governor and Company  
there shall think fit, and the  
merit of the offence, I shall require  
as aforesaid: and in case any  
person or persons being convicted  
and

and sentenced by the President  
and Council of the said Gover-  
nor and Company, in the Coun-  
ties, Lands or Towns aforesaid  
their factors or agents there, for  
any offence by them done, shall  
appeal from the same, that  
then and in such case it shall  
not may be lawful to and for

factors or agents, to seize upon  
him or them, and to carry him

men and subjects whatsoever,  
to be riding, passing, halping  
and assisting to the said  
governour and company, and

vants, assyngs, and ministers  
and every af them, in depecting  
and enjoying the premises, as  
well our land, as at se a,  
from time to time when any  
of you shall thereunto be  
required: day statute, act,

Appendix No 2.

An Act for extending the  
Jurisdiction of the Courts of  
Justice in the Provinces of Lower  
and Upper Canada, to the Trial  
and Punishment of Persons guilty  
of Crimes and offences within  
certain parts of North America  
adjoining to the said Provinces.

11 August 1803.

"Whereas crimes and offences  
have been committed in the  
Indian territories, and other  
parts of America not within the  
limits of the Provinces of Lower  
and Upper Canada, or either of  
them, or of the jurisdiction of any  
of the Courts established in those  
Provinces, or within the limits of  
any Civil Government of the  
United States of America, and are  
therefore not cognizable by any  
jurisdiction whatever, and by  
reason thereof great crimes  
and

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"and offences have gone and may  
hereafter go unpunished, and  
greatly increase": For remedying  
whereof, may it please your  
Majesty, that it may be enacted  
and be it enacted by the King's  
Most Excellent Majesty, by and  
with the advice and consent of  
the Lord's Spiritual and Tempo-  
ral and Commons, in this pre-  
sent Parliament assembled, and  
by the authority of the same,  
That, from and after the passing  
of this act, all offences committed  
within any of the Indian Terri-  
tories, or parts of America, not  
within the limits of either of the  
said Provinces of Lower or Upper  
Canada, or of any Civil Government  
of the United States of America  
shall be and be deemed to be  
offences of the same nature,

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and shall be tried in the same  
manner and subject to the same  
punishment as if the same had been  
committed within the Provinces of  
Lower or Upper Canada.

II. And be it further enacted, That it  
shall be lawful for the Governor or  
Lieutenant Governor or Person ad-  
ministering the Government for the  
time being of the Province of Lower  
Canada, by commission under his  
hand and seal, to authorize and  
empower any person or Persons  
wherever residing or being at the  
time, to act as Civil Magistrates  
and Justices of the Peace for any  
of the Indian Territories or parts  
of America, not within the limits  
of either of the said Provinces, either  
upon informations taken or given  
within the said Provinces, in any  
part of the Indian Territories or  
parts

Parts of Province aforesaid, for the purpose only of hearing crimes and offences, and committing any Person or Persons guilty of any crime or offence to safe custody, in order to his or their being conveyed to the said Province of Lower Canada, to be dealt with according to law, and it shall be lawful for any Person or Persons whatsoever to apprehend and take before any Person so committed as aforesaid, or to apprehend and convey, or cause to be safely conveyed with all convenient speed, to the Province of Lower Canada, any Person or Persons guilty of any crime or offence, there to be delivered into safe custody for the purpose of being dealt with according to law.

III. And be it further enacted, that every

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every such offender may and  
shall be prosecuted and tried in  
the Courts of the Province of Lower  
Canada, or if the Governor or  
Lieutenant Governor or Person  
administering the Government  
for the time being, shall from any  
of the circumstances of the crime  
or offence, or the local situation  
of any of the witnesses for the  
prosecution or defence, think that  
Justice may more conveniently  
be administered in relation to  
such crime or offence, in the Province  
of Upper Canada, and shall by any  
Instrument under the Great Seal  
of the Province of Lower Canada,  
declare the same, then that every  
such offender may and shall be  
prosecuted and tried in the  
Court of the Province of Upper Canada  
to which crimes or offences of  
the

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the like nature and usually tried,  
and where the same would have  
been tried if such crime or offence  
had been committed within the  
limits of the Province where the  
same shall be tried under this  
act: and every offender tried and  
convicted under this Act shall  
be liable and subject to such  
punishment as may by any law  
in force in the Province where he  
or she shall be tried be inflicted  
for such crime or offence, and  
such crime or offence may and  
shall be tried and charged to have  
been committed within the jurisdiction  
of such Court, and such  
Court may and shall proceed therein  
to trial, Judgement and Execution  
or other punishment for such  
crime or offence in the same  
manner in every respect, as if  
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such crime or offence had been  
really committed within the  
Jurisdiction of such Court, and  
it shall also be lawful for the  
Judges and other officers of the  
said Courts to issue Subpoenas,  
and other processes, for enjoining  
the attendance of witnesses on  
any such trial, and such subpo-  
neas and other processes shall  
be as valid and effectual and  
be in full force and put in  
Execution in any parts of the  
Indian Territories, or other parts  
of America, out of and not  
within the limits of the said  
Government of the United States  
of America, as well as within  
the limits of either of the said  
Provinces of Lower or Upper  
Canada, in relation to the trial  
of any crimes or offences by  
thus

this act made cognizable in such Court, or to the more speedily and effectually bringing any offender or offenders to Justice under this act, as fully and directly as any Subpoena or other Process is or Processes shall issue as aforesaid; any act, practice, law or Laws, usage, matter, or thing to the contrary notwithstanding.

V. Proceeded always, and be it further enacted, That if any Person or offence charged and prosecuted under this act, shall be proved to have been committed by any Person or Persons not being a Subject or Subjects of His Majesty, and also within the limits of any Colony, Settlement or

or Territory belonging to any European State, the Court before which such Prosecution shall be had, shall forthwith acquit such Person or Persons not being such Subject or Subjects as aforesaid of such charges.

V. Provided nevertheless, That it shall and may be lawful for such Court to proceed in the Trial of any other Person, being a Subject or Subjects of His Majesty, who shall be charged with the same or any other offence, notwithstanding that he or she shall appear to have been committed within the limits of any Colony, Settlement, or Territory belonging to any European State as aforesaid.
