BABINE AGENCY


Visitations of the more important Reserves of the Babine Agency and meetings with the Indians thereof engaged the Commission from the 15th to the 26th April and again on the 13th July, 1915; Mr. A. W. Harvey, B.C.L.S., being specially examined on the 21st October, as to available lands suitable for Indian requirements, and Mr. Agent Loring being under examination from the 4th to the 22nd November, of the same year.

The present is a period of transition for the Indians of the Babine Agency. Old conditions governing their means of self-maintenance are changing; and while in times past they have looked upon fishing, hunting and trapping as their natural avocations and sources of livelihood, the time would appear to be comparatively near when farming and stock raising must necessarily replace the hereditary occupations of these Indians as their means of self-support. This fact has been recognized and taken cognizance of by the Commission, as also the generally inferior character of the available lands of the district, in adjusting the areas of confirmed and allotted lands to the measure of the Indian requirements.


When the Commission entered upon its work there were established and recognized as lands of the Indians of this Agency 45 Reserves in all, with an aggregate area of 31,099.04 acres as shewn by the Official Schedule of 1913, or 30,073.80 acres as per the Plans of Survey (less deductions for allowed rights-of-way) or 18.49 acres per capita. The readjustment of Reserves—one Reserve of small area being cut off, as unsuitable for Indian utilization, and 23 new Reserves created—shews a net added area of 5,734.93 acres, the confirmations and allowances by the Commission giving the Babine Agency a new total of 67 Reserves, with an aggregate area of 35,808.73 acres, or 22.02 acres per capita for the present Agency population of One Thousand Six Hundred and Twenty six.

WATER RIGHTS OF INDIANS OF B. C.

MINUTE and RESOLUTION of the 15th June, 1916:

"WHERE'S former Indian Reserves Commissioners, acting under joint Governmental Agreements, allotted defined Water Rights to certain Tribes or Bands of Indians in British Columbia;

"Whereas this Commission has been unable to obtain any advice from the ... w officers of the Crown in right of the Dominion of Canada as to the authority of the said former Commissioners to allot such Water Rights;

"AND WHEREAS this Commission desires that any right or title which Indians may have to such allotted Water Rights may not be adversely affected by inaction on its part,

"Be it Resolved: That, to the extent to which the allotting Commissioners had authority to allot such Water Rights, this Commission, insofar as the power may lie in it so to do, confirms the said allotted Water Rights as set forth in the Schedule hereto appended:
