## CHAPTER ONE

## AGGREGATE OF TOTAL LOSSES IN

THE TOWN OF RIMOUSKI

We have fixed the final amount of damages done by the conflagration of May $6 t h$ and 7 th last at Rlmouskl, as follows:-

The loss sustained by the Price Company at thls place through the destruction of its mills and of its lumber yards, is not Included in the above figures. .

Prior to the fire, the total number of bulldings, whether residences, lodging houses, stores, office build!ngs, hotels or ! ndustrlal plants in the Town of Rimousk: was 1,329.-

In the fire, 230 bulldings were destroyed and 19 ser:ously damaged...

The number of residences destroyed represents 383 places of habitation.-.

Nelther the Rellglous institutions with thelr dependencles, nor the bulldings which are the property of the ederal and Provinclal Governments are Included In this enumeration of habltations but are described In Chapter Two.-

The total population of the Town of. Rlmouskl is 10,412 souls, of whom 1,915 have been without lodging since the fire. The permanent residents of the annexes to the Religious institutions in which the Reverend Sisters live, number 450, whlch makes a total of 2,365 persons burned out.-

Nelther the student boarders, the hospltal patients nor the Nuns serving the Seminary are included in these flgures.-

We attach hereto a colored plan of the Town of Rimouskl, together with aerlal photographs showing the extent of the damage.

- The summary of the losses sustalned at RImouskl is as follows:-10.- LOSSES BY INDIVIDUALS

The total amount of property losses by Individuals is based on the real value of the bulldings according to the munlcipal valuation which is based on an average of 40\%.-

Before accepting this basis as a falr one for individuals, we took note of all the lists of the flre-sufferers, indicating thelr respectlve losses. These llsts had been drawn up and audlted by the Assessor of the Town of RImousk1, the former Town Clerk, the Reconstruction Commlttee and the Soclal Service Investigation Bureau of the War Veterans.-

From our own investlgation and audlt, we have concluded that this pasis of 40\% which was employed in preparing the Preliminary Report, is stlll the falrest one, placing every individual on the same footing.

The losses of moveables include the mechanical, techntcal and Industrial equlpment together with the furniture of industrial, professional and commercial establishments, as well as some indeterminate losses on properties more or less damaged and destruction
of minor bulldings, etc., have been e stabllshed at a rate of $28 \%$ of the real value of the destroyed properties.-

In our Preliminary Report, we had estlmated the damage to moveables at the rate of $25 \%$ of the value of the property losses but, after obtalning the fullest possible Information through investigation and research and after studying the reports of the different authoritles above-mentioned, we have thought it more equitable to increase this proportion to $28 \%$ of the property losses.-

Commerclal stocks-In…trade and personal effects were not taken care of in appralsing the losses..

30... LOSSES BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

At R mouskl, the losses sustalned by the Federil Government amount to $\$ 325.000 .00$ less $\$ 65,000.00$ pa:d by the Insurance Compantes. wh:ch leaves a net loss of $\$ 260,000.00$.

These losses include the cost of the break-water on the Rlmousk R!ver, the me... chanical equipment of the Marine School as well as $50 \%$ of the cost of th's School...

40.- LOSSES BY THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT
```

At Rimouski the losses by the Provincial Government amount to $\$ 930,000.00$, less $\$ 30,000.00$ pald by the Insurance Companles, which leaves a net loss of $\$ 900,000.00$.

Enclosed herewith are two layouts of the bulldings destroyed, together with a color photograph.-

In our Preliminary Report we mentloned that the total losses by the provincial Government amounted to $\$ 1,405,000.00$, Including the reconstruction of a bridge over the Rimouskl River, but we have since been informed that the reconstruction of this. bridge within the limits of the Town, comes within the Municipal and not the Provincial domaln.-

The net losses by the Provinctal Governmont are therefore reduced to the amount of $\$ 900,000.00$.

## 50-- LOSSES BY THE MUNICIPALITY, PUBLIC

UTILITIES AND OTHERS INDETERMTNATE
The total losses sustalned by the Municlpallty of the Town of Rimouskl, such as damages or destruction of sewers, waterworks, road beds and road pavements, sidewalks, fire apparatus, loss of taxes revenues, cost of rental of neighboring towns fire apparatus and hiring of outsider firemen, the cost of reconstructing a bridge on Rimouskl River, etc., together with the losses sustalned by Publlc Utillties, such as poles, transformers, street lights, cables, etc., as well as other relevant but indeterminate losses and damages, amount to $\$ 735,000.00 \ldots$
