It was a bad month for Canadian exports. The decline in merchandise exports was big enough to wipe out two very strong prior months. Declines were enough to drive the nominal trade balance to a deficit of CAD 1.9 billion, roughly a tripling of the January trade deficit.

The declines were broadly-based: 7/11 sectors were down with substantial declines in key sectors including Consumer Goods, Energy and Automobiles.
Prices wreaked havoc with the data, accounting for roughly two-thirds of the drop. This was obviously affected by a $4.4 \%$ appreciation of the Canadian dollar in the month.
Declines were largely coming from the US, which is disturbing given the strength we are seeing in US consumer spending and business investment fundamentals. There was very little that was positive in other markets as the EU was flat and sales to the BRIC countries swooned.

On a more positive note, price-adjusted exports are still $4 \%$ higher on average than 2015 exports. Year-to-date performance is still up by a very strong double-digit pace in key high value-added export industries.
