Situation of the Canadian Military Forces Overseas, Summer, 1943: I

Recent Changes in Commands and Staffs.

- 1. This Report sets forth those changes in commands and staffs which have occurred in the Canadian Army Overseas since 20 May 43, which was the date of Report No. 96.
- 2. The form of this Report will be found to be identical with that of Report No. 96 and references to the relevant supplements to Canadian Army Overseas Routing Orders will be made as before. At Appendix "A" will be found a list of officers commanding Formations and holding first-grade staff appointments.

HIGHER COMMANDS

3. No changes have occurred in the commands of First Cdn Army, 1 and 2 Cdn Corps and the five divisions of the Canadian Army Overseas. During the period when the Army Commander, Lieut.-General A.G.L. McNaughton, was visiting the North African and Sicilian theatres of war, the G.O.C. 1 Cdn Corps, Lieut.-General Crerar, acted as Army Commander.

HEADQUARTERS, FIRST CANADIAN ARMY

- 4. Major-General C.S.L. Hertzberg, C.B., M.C., V.D., vacated the appointment of Chief Engineer, First Cdn Army and was succeeded by Brigadier J.L. Melville, M.C., E.D., formerly Chief Engineer, 1 Cdn Corps (3572, 22 Jun 43). General Hertzberg's first appointment in the Canadian Active Service Force was dated 17 Oct 39. He then became C.R.E. 1 Cdn Div with the rank of Lt.-Col. Since that time he has been continuously senior Engineer officer in the Canadian Army Overseas and his appointments and promotions have closely conformed with the growth and development of the Canadian Army in England.
- 5. General Hertzberg landed in the United Kingdom with 1 Cdn Div on 17 Dec 39. At this time his age as given in military records was 53. He had served in France and Siberia during the last war and had been awarded the M.C. and the Czechoslovakian War Cross. While C.R.E., 1 Cdn Div, he was promoted to Colonel (118, 7 May 40) and on the formation of 7 Corps he became Chief Engineer with the rank of Brigadier (206, 19 Jul 40). During this period, in addition to his military duties, Colonel Hertzberg served on the Mines Committee of the Advisory Council of Scientific Research and Technical Development, of the Ministry of Supply in LONDON.

He was made available for this duty as a result of a request from the War Office dated 21 Feb 40 (C.M.H.Q. file 10/Hertzberg C.S.L/1).

Brigadier Hertzberg's promotion to the rank of Brigadier raised the question of the retirement age. General McNaughton stated in a letter to the Senior Officer, C.M.H.Q. (ibid.) that provided Brigadier Hertzberg was found, on medical examination, to be in Category "A", he would certify to the Minister of National Defence that no other suitable officer was available for the appointment of Chief Engineer, 1 Cdn Corps. The recommendation to OTTAWA was accordingly made, and his appointment extended until 31 Dec 42. On the formation of First Cdn Army, Brigadier Hertzberg was appointed Chief Engineer of that formation and special authority was again obtained for his promotion to the rank of Major-General (appointment and promotion, 1828, 6 Apr 43).

7. The date of General Hertzberg's retirement from overseas service with the Canadian army, in the normal course, was to be 12 Jun 43, and on 11 Apr 43 General McNaughton sent a cable to the Chief of the General Staff (CANMILITRY to DEFENSOR, Most Secret, Al922) requesting authority to return him to Canada. The following portion of the cable may be quoted:-

Hertzberg has rendered exceptional service and his work is deserving of the highest commendation. He will be a definite loss to the Canadian Army Overseas but I feel that the policy re retirement age limits must be followed. I most strongly recommend Hertzberg for continued employment with the Canadian Army in Canada.

- 8. Lt.-Col. G.P. Henderson, M.B.E., relinquished the appointment of G.S.O.I (Int) and was succeeded by Major P.E.R. Wright, R. Regt. C., who was promoted to the acting rank of Lt.-Col. (3572, 21 Jun 43). Lt.-Col. Henderson proceeded on special employment to the Mediterranean theatre, spent some time with the Canadian forces in Sicily, and has since returned to take command of the recently-arrived Algonquin Regt (3736, 16 Aug 43). Major Wright assisted in the detailed planning of the DIEPPE operation, was present at the operation, and was subsequently G.S.O.II on the Canadian Planning Staff and responsible for much of the detailed planning in connection with the participation of 1 Cdn Army Tk Bde in the Sicily operation.
- Golonel B.H. Darwin, formerly G.S.O.I (S.D.) was appointed to command 1 Cdn Corps Troops, R.C.E. as of 10 Aug 43, and was succeeded as G.S.O.I (S.D. & T.) by Major, A/Lt.-Col. C.J. Laurin, C.A.C. (3706, 10 Aug 43). Lt.-Col. Laurin was formerly G.S.O.II (S.D.) at C.M.H.Q., and immediately prior to his new appointment was G.S.O.II (S.D.) attached to G.H.Q. Home Forces. The new appointment of G.S.O.I (Air) has been filled by Major, A/Lt.-Col. C. Rankin, C.A.C. who was formerly G.S.O.II (Air), H.Q. 39 Wing R.A.F. (3572, 21 Jun 43). Attached to the General Staff as temporary G.S.O.I, Lt.-Col. S.G. Lace, previously commanding 15 Fd Regt R.C.A., succeeds Lt.-Col. H.A. Sparling who continues to be specially employed (3572, 17 Jun 43).

10. It should be noted in passing that an Air Liaison Increment has been provided for First Cdn Army, consisting of four G.S.Os.II and thirteen G.S.Os.III. All of the second-grade appointments and eleven of the thirteen third-grade appointments have been filled. The existence of this Increment is explained mainly by the designation of a Composite Group of the Tactical Air Force to work with First Cdn Army.

HEADQUARTERS, 1st CANADIAN CORPS

- 11. As has been pointed out above, the G.O.C. 1 Cdn Corps, Lieut.-General Crerar, has been concerned with the affairs of First Cdn Army, especially during the Sicily operation, in the absence of General McNaughton. In his absence, the command of 1 Cdn Corps devolved upon Major-General R.F.L. Keller. The appointment of B.G.S. was left vacant by that of Brigadier C.C. Mann to command 7 Cdn Inf Bde (3572, 23 Jun 43). This vacancy was filled by the appointment of Colonel W.J. Megill, R.C. Sigs, and his promotion to the rank of Brigadier (3572, 23 Jun 43). This occurred shortly after Brigadier Megill's return to G.M.H.Q. as A.D.A.G. (A).
- 12. The only other change that has occurred on a first-grade level has been the appointment of A.Q.M.G. which was relinquished by Lt.-Col. W.G.H. Roaf and filled by A/Lt.-Col. C.H. Drury, R.C.A. (3482, 15 May 43). Lt.-Col. Roaf is specially employed (3482, 14 May 43).

HEADQUARTERS, 2nd CANADIAN CORPS

2 Cdn Corps is still commanded by Lieut.-General E.W. Sansom. The appointment of D.D.M.S. was vacated by Brigadier C.P. Fenwick, M.C., V.D., R.C.A.M.C., and filled by Brigadier C.A. Rae, E.D., R.C.A.M.C., formerly D.D.M.S., C.M.H.Q. (appointment and promotion, 3498, 26 Aug 43). The departure of Lt.-Col. D.K. Tow for North Africa created a vacancy in the appointment of A.Q.M.G., which was filled by A/Lt.-Col. J.W. Proctor, C.A.C. (3407, 3 May 43).

1st CANADIAN DIVISION

14. Since Report No. 96 was written 1 Cdn Div has been engaged in the Sicily operation and no further changes have occurred in brigade commands or senior staff appointments. It may be noted, however, that the death in action of Lt.-Col. R.M. Crowe, commanding the R.C.R., created a vacancy which was filled by the appointment of Lt.-Col. D.C. Spry, R.C.R., hitherto G.S.O.I (P.A. to G.O.C.-in-C.) at H.Q. First Cdn Army.

2nd CANADIAN DIVISION

15. There have been no changes in commands and senior staff appointments in 2 Cdn Div.

3rd CANADIAN DIVISION

16. There has been one new first-grade appointment in 3 Cdn Div: that of Lt.-Col. W.J. Moogk, R.C.R., who became G.S.O.I, from A.A. & Q.M.G. 1 Cdn Div (special increment) (3673, 18 Jun 43).

17. Brigadier C.C. Mann, D.S.O., formerly B.G.S. 1 Cdn Corps, assumed command of 7 Cdn Inf Bde (3572, 23 Jun 43), succeeding Brigadier H.W. Poster, who returned to Canada, where he took command of the Canadian force participating in operations against the Japanese in the Aleutian Islands.

4th AND 5th CANADIAN ARMD DIVISIONS

18. No further changes have occurred in brigade commands or first-grade appointments in either 4 or 5 Cdn Armd Divs.

OTHER FORMATIONS

- 19. I Cdn Army Tk Bde has left the United Kingdom and is at present in Sicily. It is still commanded by Brigadier Wyman. 2 Cdn Army Tk Bde, which recently arrived in this country, has been broken up. 3 Cdn Army Tk Bde has been converted into 2 Cdn Armd Bde. This formation is at present under command 1 Cdn Corps and is equipped with all the services of an army tank brigade. Its role will presumably be that of either an armoured brigade or an army tank brigade as need arises. It is possible that the designation "army tank brigade" may disappear from the Canadian Army Overseas.
- 20. Brigadier A.M. Thomas, M.B.E., V.D., vacated the command of 3 Cdn Army Tk Bde (3507, 4 Jun 43) and was succeeded by Brigadier N.A. Gianelli (3533, 12 Jun 43). Brigadier Gianelli is a Permanent Force officer and formerly commanded 2 Cdn Armd Regt (Lord Strathcona's Horse). He commanded 2 Cdn Army Tk Bde immediately prior to his transfer to 3 Cdn Army Tk Bde.

CANADIAN MILITARY HEADQUARTERS

- 21. There have been no changes in the higher appointments at C.M.H.Q., Major-General P.J. Montague being still Senior Officer, Brigadier N.E. Rodger, B.G.S., Brigadier A.W. Beament, D.A.G., and Brigadier J.H. MacQueen, D.Q.M.G.
- Lt.-Col. W.A.B. Anderson, R.C.A., was appointed to command 15 Cdn Fd Regt (3660, 7 Jul 43) and was succeeded as G.S.O.I (S.D.) by Lt.-Col. C.R. Archibald, R.C.A. Lt.-Col. Archibald had been absent from this country for some time whilst employed at N.D.H.Q. It is of interest to note that he is the first G.S.O.I (S.D.) at C.M.H.Q. not to be a Permanent Force officer. A further change in the Training Section of "G" Branch was foreshadowed by the appointment of Lt.-Col. M.P. Bogert, R.C.R., to command the West N.S. Regt, then on the eve of departure for Sicily. In due course Major B.B. King, Cdn Inf Corps, was appointed G.S.O.I (Trg) and promoted A/Lt.-Col. (3616, 12 Jul 43).
- 23. In "A" Branch the A.D.A.G. (A), Colonel, A/Brigadier, C. Lloyd, O.B.E., R.A., was succeeded by Colonel, now Brigadier, W.J. Megill, R.C. Sigs (3449, 16 May 43) and he in turn was succeeded by Brigadier E.G. Weeks, M.C., M.M., R.C. Sigs (3594, 1 Jul 43). Brigadier Weeks returned to this country from N.D.H.Q. to take up this appointment.

A new development has occurred in the organization of G.H.Q. 2nd Echelon. G.H.Q. 2nd Echelon remains under the command of Colonel A.M. Brown, V.D. as A.A.G., but two sections have gone to North Africa. These are G.H.Q. 1st Echelon (Type "A") with Lt.-Col. D.K. Tow, Cdn Inf Corps as A.A. & Q.M.G. (3673, 26 May 43) and Canadian Section G.H.Q. 2nd Echelon (Type "B") with Lt.-Col. V.S.C. McClenaghan, M.C., E.D., R.C. Sigs as A.A.G.

CANADIAN REINFORCEMENT UNITS

- 25. Lt.-Col. F.L. Nicholls, formerly commanding the R. Regt. C., replaced Lt.-Col. I.L. Ibbotson, E.D., Cdn Inf Corps, as G.S.O.I at H.Q., C.R.U. (3736, 20 Aug 43).
- Colonel G.H. Basher, O.B.E., E.D., succeeded A/Colonel L.M. Watson, E.D., as Officer Commanding 1 Cdn Spec Base Depot (3449, 15 May 43), thus leaving vacant the command of "A" Group, C.R.U. Lt.-Col. J.A. Calder, C.A.C., was appointed to command the Group and to be A/Colonel, from the command of 32 Recce Regt (R.M.R.) (3498, 27 May 43).
- 27. Colonel Basher's command is now designated 1 Cdn
 Base Reinforcement Depot and is organized in four Reinforcement
 Battalions. Its function is to hold reinforcements for the
 Canadian force in the Central Mediterranean. At last advices,
 the Depot was located near PHILIPPEVILLE, Algeria, with one
 battalion forward in Sicily.
