Material in the Department of External Affairs Relating to Canada and Peace-Keeping Operations

1. Peace-keeping operations have been one of the major tasks of the Canadian armed services in the period since the end of the Second World War. There is no sign that the commitment of forces for duties of this nature is about to cease. In consequence the Historical Section will likely be undertaking an increasing amount of research and writing on the Canadian role in the nine major peacekeeping operations in which this country has participated to date. (A list of these operations is included as Appendix "A"). The Department of External Affairs, of course, holds an enormous quantity of material on these peace forces, and there should be some utility in a guide to its holdings.

2. This brief report, a by-product of a month's research undertaken in connection with the chapter on peace-keeping for the Centennial Volume on Canadian military history, is intended to set forth as clearly as possible the location, quantity, and nature of the files of the Department of External Affairs which relate to Canada and peace-keeping operations.

Location of Material

3. At the time of writing the Department of External Affairs is scattered throughout downtown Ottawa, with divisions located in the East Block, Dely Building, Langevin Building, and the Post Office Building. Each building has its own registry for current files, thus complicating the researcher's task. The bulk of the material for the period before the early 1960's, however, is now concentrated at the Public Archives Record Centre at Tunney's Pasture.

Guides to the Material

4. The central registry for the Department is situated in Room 355, East Elock. Two card files, with extensive but incomplete cross-filling, are located here. One very large card file covers the "old" system of filing which was in effect until a few years ago; the other, as yet very small, covers the "new" system. (A complete list of subject headings examined in these card files is attached as Appendix "B").

5. The Central Registry also holds Departmental File Lists, loose-leaf volumes listing holdings by file number and subject. The volume for the "new" series is most useful because it also lists all "old" related files.

Using the Material

6. The staff of Registry Division, with their guides to the files, can determine the location of material to be examined. The files at Tunney's Pasture, filling thousands of feet of shelf-space, can best be found if the storage box number is known. This should be determined at Registry Division. (A complete listing of material examined and its location is attached as Appendix "C").

7. All top secret documents have been stripped from dormant files and are separately stored in Room 345, East Elock. Each volume of files from which this material has been removed lists the storage box number in which it is held in Room 345.

8. The current files in daily use within the Department are closely guarded, and a letter to the divisions holding the files will probably be a pre-requisite for access to them.

General Considerations

9. The registry staff is most helpful in solving any problems. Understandably they are most conscious of security. In these circumstances some care should be exercised in arranging for access with the Department. The letter requesting permission to use the files should detail the purpose of research, the security clearance of the researcher, and as definite a statement as possible of the subject area to be examined. Access is easiest to those files held at the Public Archives Record Centre, most difficult for those in current use.
