BANKRUPTCY

Bankruptcy is a possible outcome when a person or company is facing a financial crisis. The process consists of a legal proceeding dealt with under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act (BIA).

One of the many obligations in bankruptcy, as indicated by the Office of the Superintendent of Bankruptcy (OSB), is to make a list of assets and liabilities for the Trustee. The Controlled Goods Directorate (CGD) strongly recommends that all controlled goods under the control or owned by the bankrupt be listed and visibly marked on the list of assets and liabilities. Furthermore, the CGD recommends that all controlled goods be turned over to the Trustee at the earliest possible time and that you make disclosure of the controlled goods to the Official Receiver during the examination. Any attempt to liquidate assets during the insolvency period could result in an Investigation Order being issued to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) raising allegations of suspicious disposal of assets contrary to Sections 198 of the BIA and 392 of the Criminal Code.

In the event that you have filed an assignment with the Official Receiver, you must notify CGD without delay as specified under Section 9 of the Controlled Goods Regulations which stipulate: Every applicant and registered person shall, without delay, inform the Minister of any change in any of the information contained in the application for registration. HIRING CONTRACTORS REQUIRING REGISTRATION WITH THE CONTROLLED GOODS PROGRAM

When hiring contractors who will require registration with the Controlled Goods Program, please ensure that they are provided with as much information as possible on the controlled goods/technology being accessed (i.e. Export Control List number, brief description of good/technology) and the nature of the work being performed. Clear details ensure a more efficient processing of a request to register and may help minimize delays in completing the registration.

REMINDER - REPORTING SECURITY BREACHES

A registered person, as per section 10(h) of the Controlled Goods Regulations, is required to advise the Controlled Goods Directorate (CGD), without delay, of any security breach in relation to controlled goods. Examples of security breaches include: loss of goods, unauthorized examination/possession/transfer, willful damage, and tampering of controlled goods/technology. Security breaches of a criminal nature, subject to conviction under the Criminal Code (such as theft) should also be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency.

The Case Management and Best Practices Division of CGD reviews all reported security breaches to identify the cause and to ensure that corrective measures have been implemented to prevent reoccurrence.
