INTRODUCTION

GENERAL INFORMATION

Under the authority of the Queen's Printer, the Superintendent of Publications, Department of Public Printing and Stationery, Ottawa, Ontario, has charge, by law, of the sale of all official publications of the Parliament and the Government of Canada which are issued for sale, as well as of the distribution of all public documents and papers to officials and other persons who are entitled to receive the same without payment.

DISTRIBUTION OF PUBLICATIONS

HOW TO ORDER PUBLICATIONS

Remittances

It is required by law that remittance be made in advance of shipment of publications.

Cheque or money orders should be made payable to the Receiver General of Canada. Postage stamps are not acceptable.

Discounts

A discount of 25 per cent is allowed to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the prices set by the Superintendent of Publications for the sale of the publications shall not be exceeded and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter.

Deposit Accounts

To avoid waiting for quotations and sending individual remittances, those who expect to purchase Canadian Government publications regularly may open a deposit account with the Superintendent of Publications. The minimum deposit is ten dollars (\$10.00). A deposit account number is assigned to the customer which he will quote when ordering publications. All orders are charged to the account and regular statements forwarded.

Postage Charges

No extra charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in Canada and the United States. To cover cost of postage, 30 per cent is added to the selling price when publications are to be mailed to other countries.

FREE DISTRIBUTION

To Depository Libraries

The Queen's Printer is required by law to furnish free of charge one copy of any government publication, not of a confidential nature, to designated classes of libraries in Canada, for preservation and educational purposes, so that all the public may have access to all government publications.

Libraries are expected to accept, shelve and preserve, classify and catalogue, all government publications sent to them, and to assume full responsibility as designated depository libraries. Full-depository libraries are entitled to receive one copy of every publication of the Parliament or Government of Canada which is made available to the Superintendent of Publications for distribution. Selective-depository libraries are entitled to select any series of government publications they are able to adequately place at the disposal of the public. The Daily Checklist incorporates the functions of a Depository Invoice for full-depository libraries and of an Order Form for selective-depository libraries. In order to receive their selection, selective-depository libraries must make application within ten days after receiving the issues of the Daily Checklist in which the desired items appeared.

To the General Public

Free publications are obtainable from the Department or Agency issuing the publication.

CATALOGUE SERVICES

DAILY CHECKLIST

The Daily Checklist, published mainly for administrative convenience, is issued Monday through Friday except public holidays. It records all government publications so that they are readily accessible to the Public Service and the general public and quickly made known to libraries. Produced in loose-leaf form, the Daily Checklist is mailed to all who need to have day-to-day information on what is being published by Parliament and the Government of Canada, with the exception of the statutory orders and regulations which are listed in Canada Gazette, Part II, under title "Statutory Orders and Regulations". The material which appears in the Daily Checklist is used to compile a monthly catalogue. All those who are authorized by law or regulation to receive free copies of government publications receive the Daily Checklist automatically and without charge.

MONTHLY CATALOGUE

The Monthly Catalogue of Government Publications is a comprehensive listing of all official publications, public documents and papers, not of a confidential nature, printed or "processed" at government expense by authority of Parliament or that of a Department, Commission, Board, Corporation, etc., of the Govern-

ment, including publications bought at public expense for use of, or distribution to, Members of Parliament, public officials or the public. Each issue of the Monthly Catalogue contains all items listed in the Daily Checklists during the previous month and is ready for distribution during the second week of the following month.

Prices and distribution policy are stated for each title listed for the guidance of prospective buyers, librarians and the interested public.

ANNUAL CONSOLIDATED CATALOGUE, 1953

The Canadian Government Publications Consolidated Annual Catalogue, 1953, supersedes the Annual Catalogue of 1948 and supplements to 1952 and incorporates all the entries from the Monthly Catalogue of Canadian Government Publications, January to September, 1953 inclusive.

An attempt has been made to include all federal publications in print as of September, 1953. The Consolidated Catalogue records free as well as priced publications, whether distributed by the Queen's Printer or by the various issuing agencies.

ANNUAL CATALOGUES

The Annual Catalogue, 1954, is a supplement to the Consolidated Annual Catalogue 1953 and lists all federal publications received and noted by the Publications Branch from October, 1953 to December, 1954 inclusive.

The Catalogue of Canadian Government Publications 1955 is a consolidated list of the publications issued during the year. It cumulates the issues of the Monthly Catalogue of Canadian Government Publications, volume 3 Nos 1 to 11 and lists the publications noted in the Daily Checklist during December 1955.

SECTIONAL CATALOGUES

The sectional catalogue entitled "Labour Publications" issued in 1955, is the first of a series which, when completed will provide a comprehensive record of all publications available for purchase, arranged according to Government Departments and including a selection of important related publications issued by Parliament and other departments and agencies of the Government of Canada. The Sectional Catalogues will provide a subject approach to the many thousands of publications which form the sales stock of the Queen's Printer.

SELECTED TITLES BULLETINS

Published periodically, they contain short notes on two or three dozen current government publications. The contents of each book are briefly and vividly described and an order form accompanies each bulletin. Anyone who is interested may receive these bulletins simply by sending a postcard to the Queen's Printer asking to be placed on the Selected Titles mailing list. Also available in French.

HOW TO ORDER

Unless otherwise indicated, publications may be purchased from the Superintendent of Publications, Queen's Printer, Ottawa, Ontario.

Remise

Chaque commande doit être payée d'avance. Les mandats de poste, les mandats de messageries ou les chèques visés doivent être faits payables à l'ordre du Receveur général du Canada et adressés à l'Imprimeur de la Reine à Ottawa. Les timbres-postes ne sont pas acceptés en paiement des publications.

Rabais

The present work, completed in 1950 by the Queen's Printer, Ottawa, and honoured by a foreword by the late Right Honourable William L. Mackenzie King, former Prime Minister of Canada, is the outcome of the long and intensive interest on the part of this great statesman, for the planning of a Capital worthy of the growing role of Canada in world's history.

The preparation of the plan, under the direction of a world authority in city planning, assisted by his Canadian associates, is fully described and analysed in the General Report, which, while a technical document devoted to a particular problem, is also of deep interest and inspiration to the non-professional readers.


