Unless otherwise indicated, publications may be purchased from the Supervisor of Government Publications, Queen's Printer, Ottawa, Ontario.

It is required by law that remittance be made in advance of shipment of publications.

Cheque or money orders should be made payable to the Receiver General of Canada. Postage stamps are not acceptable.

No extra charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in Canada and the United States. To cover cost of postage, 30% is added to the selling price when publications are to be mailed to other countries.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Under the authority of the Queen's Printer, the Supervisor of Government Publications, Department of Public Printing and Stationery, Ottawa, Ontario, has charge, by law, of the sale of all official publications of the Parliament and the Government of Canada which are issued for sale, as well as of the distribution of all public documents and papers to officials and other persons who are entitled to receive the same without payment. The general policy is to secure an effective circulation by selling at attractive prices and building up a reputation that government publications are worth buying.

A discount of 25 per cent is allowed to book dealers and quantity purchasers on condition that the prices set by the Supervisor of Government Publications for the sale of the publications shall not be exceeded and that publications shall not be overprinted with any advertising matter. Prepayment of charges is required with each order. Remittance by postal money order, express order or accepted cheque made payable to the Receiver General of Canada, should be mailed to the Queen's Printer, Ottawa.

DAILY CHECKLIST

The **Daily Checklist**, published mainly for administrative convenience, is issued every day except Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays. It records all government publications so that they are readily accessible to the Public Service and the general public and quickly made known to libraries. Produced in loose-leaf form, the **Daily Checklist** is mailed to all who need to have day-to-day information on what is being published by Parliament and the Government of Canada, with the exception of the statutory orders and regulations which are listed in *Canada Gazette*, Part II, under title "**Statutory Orders and Regulations**". The material which appears in the **Daily Checklist** is used to compile a monthly catalogue. The **Daily Checklist** is the only source of reference which gives such immediate information. All those who are authorized by law or regulation to receive free copies of government publications receive the **Daily Checklist** automatically and without charge. Others who desire such service may purchase an annual subscription to the **Daily Checklist** which may be received daily or in weekly batches as desired.

MONTHLY CATALOGUE

The **Monthly Catalogue** of government publications is a comprehensive listing of all official publications, public documents and papers, not of a confidential nature, printed or "processed" at government expense by authority of Parliament or that of a Department, Commission, Board, Corporation, etc., of the Government, including publications bought at public expense for use of, or distribution to, Members of Parliament, public officials or the public. Each issue of the **Monthly Catalogue** contains all items listed in the **Daily Checklist** during the previous month and is ready for distribution during the second week of the following month.

RENSEIGNEMENTS GÉNÉRAUX

Le Surveillant des Publications de l'État, au Département des Impressions et de la Papeterie Publiques, Ottawa, est chargé d'après la loi, et sous la direction générale de l'Imprimeur de la Reine, de la vente de toutes les publications officielles du Parlement et du Gouvernement du Canada qui sont mises en vente, ainsi que de la distribution de tous les documents et pièces publics aux fonctionnaires et autres personnes qui ont droit de les recevoir gratuitement. Les publications fédérales sont offertes au public à un prix modique pour qu'elles soient largement diffusées, et que tous puissent profiter de leur contenu, fruit du travail des législateurs fédéraux, et des savants, experts et spécialistes à l'emploi du Gouvernement du Canada.

Un escompte de 25% est alloué aux libraires et détaillants, ainsi qu'aux personnes et institutions dont les commandes atteignent cent exemplaires d'une publication à condition que les prix de vente établis par le Surveillant des Publications de l'État ne soient pas augmentés et qu'aucune réclame publicitaire ne soit imprimée sur la couverture des publications fédérales. Toute commande est payable d'avance, par mandats-poste ou chèques visés faits à l'ordre du Receveur Général du Canada, et doit être adressée à l'Imprimeur de la Reine, Ottawa, Ont.

MODES DE PAIEMENT

Les personnes qui achètent régulièrement des publications du Gouvernement canadien peuvent déposer à l'avance une somme d'argent chez le Surveillant des Publications de l'État. Ce dépôt permet une livraison plus rapide et élimine les envois répétés de sommes minimales ainsi que les demandes de renseignements au sujet des prix.

Sur réception d'un minimum de dix dollars (\$10) l'on assigne un numéro de dépôt que les clients devront mentionner dans leurs commandes futures.

Les déductions sont faites en conséquence et un état de compte parvient régulièrement aux clients. Le Surveillant des Publications de l'État accepte également les commandes téléphoniques (9-3175) ou par télégrammes des personnes en affaires ou institutions professionnelles qui sont intéressées à certaines catégories de publications et qui maintiennent un compte ouvert à cette fin.

LISTE QUOTIDIENNE

La Liste Quotidienne, publiée pour fins administratives, ne paraît pas le samedi, le dimanche et les jours de congé public. Son but est de renseigner quotidiennement les membres du Parlement et les fonctionnaires du gouvernement, ainsi que les bibliothèques du pays et autres personnes intéressées, sur les publications fédérales au fur et à mesure de leur parution ou de leur mise en circulation. Publiée sur feuilles mobiles pour être conservées dans un auto-relieur, si désiré, la Liste Quotidienne est adressée automatiquement et sans frais à toutes les personnes ou institutions autorisées à recevoir gratuitement les publications officielles. Les items paraissant dans la Liste Quotidienne servent à

Prices and distribution policy are stated for each title listed for the guidance of prospective buyers, librarians and the interested public. Orders for extra copies of publications, by persons and institutions entitled to receive one free copy of any government publication, must be accompanied, as in the case of orders from other customers, by a money order or accepted cheque, made payable to the Receiver General of Canada.

The Monthly Catalogue is divided into four sections as follows:

1.—English Section

Parliamentary Publications, including Statutes, Royal Commissions, etc.

Departmental publications, including Agencies, Boards, etc.

2.—Section française.

3.—Alphabetical lists of Periodicals.

4.—General index.

Entries in the index appear under the titles, subjects, authors, series, and cross references. All references in the index are to entry numbers, not to pages.

DEPOSIT AND STANDING ACCOUNTS

To avoid waiting for quotations and sending individual remittances, those who expect to purchase Canadian Government publications regularly may open a deposit account with the Supervisor of Government Publications. The minimum deposit is ten dollars (\$10.00). A deposit account number is assigned to the customer which he will quote when ordering publications. All orders are charged to the account and regular statements forwarded. Deposit order blanks are available to such customers on application.

For the convenience of persons or institutions with special business, professional or academic interests, the Supervisor of Government Publications also maintains "standing accounts" to supply them with the publications they need as soon as they are issued. Telephone orders to 9-3175, Ottawa, and telegrams, are accepted. These accounts as well as deposit accounts, provide a convenient method of paying for documents, and the deposit order blanks provide a handy method of ordering.

DISTRIBUTION TO DEPOSITORY LIBRARIES

The libraries provide the most economical and useful distribution possible for government publications. The Queen's Printer is required by law to furnish free of charge one copy of any government publication, not of a confidential nature, to designated classes of libraries in Canada, for preservation and educational purposes, so that all the public may have access to all government publications. The Supervisor of Government Publications has divided these designated classes (Grade I and Grade II) into "full-depository" and "selective-depository" libraries and is issuing the **Daily Checklist** as a reliable guide for selection, pending the issuance of classified lists of Canadian Government Publications available for an adequate selection by depository libraries.

Libraries are expected to accept, shelve and preserve, classify and catalogue, all government publications sent to them, and to assume full responsibility as designated depository libraries. Full-depository libraries are entitled to receive one copy of every publication of the Parliament

la compilation du catalogue mensuel. Les décrets et ordonnances statutaires qui paraissent régulièrement dans la partie II de la *Gazette du Canada* ne sont pas mentionnés dans la *Liste Quotidienne*.

Celle-ci se vend également par abonnement annuel pour livraison quotidienne ou hebdomadaire.

CATALOGUE MENSUEL

Le *Catalogue Mensuel* donne la liste aussi complète que possible des publications officielles et documents non confidentiels imprimés ou "polycopiés" aux frais du gouvernement et en vertu de l'autorité du Parlement ou d'un ministère, bureau, d'une commission ou agence quelconque du gouvernement, y compris les ouvrages achetés aux frais du public pour distribution aux membres du Parlement ou au public. Chaque numéro du *Catalogue Mensuel* contient tous les items parus dans les listes préliminaires quotidiennes du mois précédent et paraît la deuxième semaine du mois courant.

Les prix, de même que la méthode de distribution, sont indiqués pour chaque item, dans le but de renseigner les clients, les bibliothécaires et tout groupement ou association intéressés.

Les personnes autorisées à recevoir gratuitement un exemplaire de toute publication fédérale peuvent s'en procurer des exemplaires additionnels aux taux indiqués pour chaque publication. Ces commandes doivent être accompagnées d'un mandat-poste ou chèque payable à l'ordre du Receveur Général du Canada.

PLAN

Le *Catalogue Mensuel* comprend quatre parties: la première donne la liste des publications en anglais et la deuxième les entrées en français, chacune de ces deux parties est divisée comme suit:

I—Publications du Parlement.

II—Publications de l'Exécutif.

La troisième partie est réservée à la liste alphabétique des périodiques et la quatrième à un index général.

Les inscriptions d'index comprennent les titres, séries, noms d'auteur, vedettes-matière de même que les renvois conventionnels. L'index est rédigé tous les mois dans le but de faciliter le repérage des diverses publications. Les renvois indiquent toujours le numéro de la publication et non la pagination.

DISTRIBUTION AUX BIBLIOTHÈQUES DÉPOSITAIRES

Les bibliothèques s'avèrent le véhicule le plus utile et le plus économique pour la répartition adéquate des publications du Gouvernement du Canada. L'Imprimeur de la Reine est chargé, en vertu de la loi, de distribuer gratuitement un exemplaire des publications fédérales non confidentielles à certaines catégories de bibliothèques canadiennes. Cette répartition systématique a pour but de mettre les publications du Gouvernement canadien à la disposition du public dans toutes les parties du Canada.

or Government of Canada which is made available to the Supervisor of Government Publications for distribution. Selective-depository libraries are entitled to select any series of government publications they are able to adequately place at the disposal of the public. The **Daily Checklist** incorporates the functions of a **Depository Invoice** for full-depository libraries and of an **Order Form** for selective-depository libraries. In order to receive their selection, selective-depository libraries must make application within ten days after receiving the issues of the **Daily Checklist** in which the desired items appeared.

CLASSIFICATION

The code numbers immediately following the distribution symbols are those used by the Supervisor of Government Publications for his administrative collection. They are given for the benefit of public libraries who may wish to use this scheme for their respective documents collections. The **Monthly Catalogue** may be satisfactorily used as a direct index to government publications on their shelves to supplement their own card catalogue. The classification scheme is by departmental authors and is based on the United States Documents Office Classification. The schedules are being expanded and will be made available to libraries, on request, when completed.

Le Surveillant des Publications de l'État a classé ces bibliothèques dépositaires en deux groupes: le premier (classe 1) comprenant les bibliothèques dépositaires totales, et le second (classe 2) comprenant les bibliothèques dépositaires partielles. La **Liste Quotidienne** est publiée pour leur faciliter l'exercice de leur privilège. Le Surveillant des Publications de l'État publiera plus tard des listes classifiées dans le but d'aider davantage ces bibliothèques dans le choix des titres disponibles.

Les bibliothèques dépositaires qui reçoivent gratuitement les publications du gouvernement, doivent les mettre sur leurs rayons, les cataloguer et les classifier, et assumer leur rôle en tant que dépositaires. Les bibliothèques dépositaires totales reçoivent toute publication du Parlement ou du Gouvernement canadien dont le Surveillant des Publications de l'État possède des exemplaires pour cette fin. Les bibliothèques dépositaires partielles sont autorisées à recevoir les titres ou séries de leur choix, en autant qu'elles peuvent les mettre à la disposition du public. La **Liste Quotidienne** sert à la fois de formule d'expédition ou de formule de commande pour les bibliothèques dépositaires totales ou partielles respectivement. Les bibliothèques doivent commander les items de leur choix dans les dix jours qui suivent la réception de leur **Liste Quotidienne**.

CLASSIFICATION

Les numéros d'ordre de classification qui suivent les symboles de distribution sont ceux dont se sert le Surveillant des Publications de l'État pour ses stocks. Les bibliothèques publiques trouveront avantage à utiliser ces cotes pour leur répertoire de documents fédéraux, puisque le **Catalogue Mensuel** pourra leur servir d'index en plus de leurs propres catalogues sur fichiers. Cette classification est basée sur le système en vigueur à la "Bibliothèque des Documents" des États-Unis.




