The purpose of the Bill is to provide for an increase in the annual appropriation to the railway grade crossing fund.

The purpose of the Bill is to control the mechanical features of radio antennae for the safety of air navigation, to establish technical standards to minimize interference with the operation of licensed radio stations, and to implement the obligations assumed under the International Telecommunication Convention to preserve secrecy of radio communications.

The principal purposes of this Bill are: 1) To clarify and extent the purposes for which water may be used in a Park or on land adjacent to a Park. 2) To authorize the levying of taxes on residents of a park so that residents can take part in a hospital services plan. 3) To provide for the withdrawal of certain lands from Waterton Lakes National Park and of an island from St. Lawrence Islands National Park. 4) To provide for the establishment of a National Park in Newfoundland.

MARIUS BARBEAU, distinguished Canadian ethnologist and folklorist, has made a special study of the Indians of the Northern Rockies and of the north Pacific Coast. 
