In this campaign, soldiers from Canada fought a series of hard and bloody battles over some of the most historic ground in Europe. This account of it is more exhaustive, and based upon more complete investigation, than that included in the preliminary Official Historical Summary, "The Canadian Army 1939-1945" which was published in May, 1948. Illustrated with frontispiece in full colour, 52 photographs in black and white, 14 sketches in black and white and 25 maps in colour.
