
MAJOR RELEASES

National economic and financial accounts

Third quarter 1997

Real gross domestic product (GDP) at market prices grew 1.0% in the third quarter of 1997 on the strength of domestic and foreign demand, in pace with the average rate of growth since the second half of 1996. Consumer spending and business investment in plant and equipment continued to drive final domestic demand, which was up 1.5% in the quarter. While exports picked up by 2.4%, imports jumped by 4.6%. This brought the balance of trade on goods and services to \$3.8 billion in the third quarter, down from \$9.9 billion in the second quarter.

GDP grew on the strength of domestic demand



Nominal GDP at factor cost increased 1.1% in the third quarter of 1997. Corporate profits before taxes advanced 4.7% due to increased revenues and wider profit margins in some industries; namely, petroleum and gas and trade. Labour income rose by 0.9%, along with a continued upswing in employment. The advances in profits and labour income in the third quarter are in line with the gains posted since the current expansion gathered momentum a year ago.

The government sector as a whole registered a surplus for the second consecutive quarter; a situation unseen since the mid-1970s. While the government sector became a net lender, the personal and unincorporated business sector has become a

National economic and financial accounts data have been revised back to 1961 to achieve the following three goals:

Retool the Canadian System of National Accounts in line with the new international guidelines for national accounting released in 1993 (System of National Accounts, 1993, published jointly by the Commission of European Communities, the International Monetary Fund, the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, the United Nations and the World Bank ISBN; 92-1-161352-3).


Rebase the constant price data and price indexes to the new base year 1992.

Incorporate statistical revisions relating to new data sources or revised data, which had not been used up to this point. This includes revisions that arise from a more comprehensive integration of the various parts of the Canadian System of National Accounts, in particular, a restructuring of the public sector and the revision of the balance of international payments.

net borrower as the amount saved out of income has plummeted in recent quarters; also a drastic reversal by historical standards.

Government surplus up again



Despite sustained growth in investment and consumer spending, no significant inflationary pressure has emerged. The quarterly rate of inflation for goods and services produced in Canada, as measured by the Chain Price Index, was 0.4%.



¹ The change is the growth rate from one period to the next. The annualized change is the growth rate compounded annually. The year-over-year change is the growth rate of a given quarter compared with the same quarter in the previous year.

Widespread boom in business investment, except housing

Machinery and equipment led the current boom in business investment, up 7.7% in the third quarter and 32% above its level recorded in the second quarter of 1996. Advances were widespread, with notable gains in spending on agricultural and industrial machinery, computer and office equipment, telecommunications equipment and trucks. The gains in non-residential structures were concentrated in buildings. Investment in residential structures declined slightly while sales of new dwellings dropped.



Business investment in non-farm inventories contributed \$1.8 billion to the \$8.1 billion increase in real GDP in the third quarter of 1997. Both retail and wholesale trade recorded a significant build-up of inventory, especially of motor vehicles. Trade inventories grew by \$7.0 billion in the third quarter after a \$3.1 billion increase in the second. Inventory accumulation in manufacturing, however, went down from \$3.1 billion in the second quarter to \$0.9 billion in the third.

The turnaround of corporate finances over the last few years has brought the corporate sector as a whole into a net lending position. The sector remained a net lender in the third quarter, although its position continued to weaken as corporations made record high investments in fixed capital and inventories (essentially matched by its gross savings, that is, retained earnings and capital consumption allowances).

Consumer demand key to sustained expansion


Consumer spending increased by 1.3% in the third quarter of 1997, the fourth consecutive quarter of 1% growth or more. The increase in spending applied to all categories of consumer goods, except for energy products such as electricity, natural gas and motor fuels. Clothing and footwear spending jumped ahead while the main stimulus to demand for durable goods came from furniture and household appliances, and furnishings and supplies in the third quarter. Motor vehicles had led the growth in the second quarter. Increased outlays on financial and recreational services boosted consumer services, up 1.2% in the quarter.

Machinery and equipment led the current boom

Disposable income growth fell short of that of personal income in the third quarter (+0.5% versus +0.7%), as income taxes and contributions to social insurance and pensions continued to take a bigger share out of income.

Once again in the third quarter of 1997, spending of the personal and unincorporated business sector outpaced its income, continuing a trend set a few years ago. Saving fell below \$8 billion in the third quarter compared with \$30 billion a year ago, and \$57 billion in 1992, its all time high. In relation to disposable income, these saving levels yield a saving rate of 1.5% in the latest quarter in sharp contrast with 19.7% in the first quarter of 1982.

The record low savings rate reflects in part renewed consumer confidence with improved job prospects, low inflation and interest rates, and healthy capital gains on households asset holdings. These factors have encouraged consumers to take on more credit debt to finance purchases that had been delayed prior to the recent phase of the current expansion.



Merchandise exports picked up, but not as much as imports

The 2.8% advance in merchandise exports in the third quarter of 1997 was led by exports of machinery and equipment, consumer goods other than automobiles, agricultural and fish products, while forestry and energy exports dropped. Much of the 5.6% jump in merchandise imports stems from robust domestic demand for goods with high import content, especially machinery and equipment, industrial goods and materials, automotive products and other consumer goods.

The recent phase of the current expansion, driven in large part by domestic demand, has been coupled with a significant deterioration of the trade balance, which went from \$37 billion in the second quarter of 1996 to \$9 billion in the third quarter of 1997. As a result, the non-resident sector regained the strong net lending position it held prior to the current expansion.

Governments continue to improve their budgetary position

Government revenue rose by 1.1% while expenditure was up by only 0.3% in the third quarter of 1997. Gross spending on goods and services picked up slightly by 0.5%, after remaining more or less flat for a year and a half, while interest on the public debt fell by 1.3% due to lower interest rates.

The federal government made the most noticeable progress in its budget situation. It registered a \$5.6 billion surplus (on a national accounts basis) in the third quarter of 1997 following a \$4.1 billion surplus in the second; the first surpluses since 1974.

Oil pipeline transport

September 1997

Net receipts of crude oil and equivalent hydrocarbons totalled 12 331 556 cubic metres in September, up 6.5% from September 1996. Year-to-date receipts (111 426 356 cubic metres) rose 7.2% over the same period in 1996. In September, net receipts of liquefied petroleum gases and refined petroleum products (6 123 160 cubic metres) increased 0.3% from the same period a year earlier. Year-to-date receipts decreased 0.6% to 56 506 114 cubic metres.

Pipeline exports of crude oil (6 067 915 cubic metres) advanced 27.3% in September compared with September 1996, and pipeline imports (1 085 450 cubic metres) fell 2.7%. Year-to-date exports (50 967 125 cubic metres) were up 10.3% from 1996. Year-to-date imports (12 269 604 cubic metres) increased 25.0%. Canadian crude oil has found a ready market in the United States, where indigenous production has been declining in recent years.

September deliveries of crude oil by pipeline to Canadian refineries totalled 5 357 879 cubic metres, down 3.1% from 1996. September deliveries of liquefied petroleum gases and refined petroleum products fell 34.6% to 513 392 cubic metres. Year-to-date deliveries of crude oil to refineries totalled 50 216 371 cubic metres, up 3.5% from the same period in 1996.

Particleboard, oriented strandboard and fibreboard

October 1997

Oriented strandboard production in October totalled 512 277 cubic metres, up 13.0% from 453 398 (revised) cubic metres in October 1996. Particleboard production reached 203 695 cubic metres, up 5.8% from 192 569 (revised) cubic metres in October 1996. Fibreboard production in October was 59 226 cubic metres, up 36.9% from 43 268 cubic metres compared with the same period in 1996. Year-to-date oriented strandboard production totalled 4 691 225 cubic metres, up 23.1% from 3 810 906 (revised) cubic metres produced a year earlier. Year-to-date particleboard production was 1 896 579 cubic metres, up 9.8% from the 1 727 237 (revised) cubic metres from a year earlier. Year-to-date fibreboard production reached 534 358 cubic metres, up 39.8% from 385 973 cubic metres during the same period in 1996.
