Crude oil and natural gas

October 1997

In October, natural gas production rose 2.0% over the same period in 1996 as a result of advances in exports and steady domestic sales. This was the 18th consecutive monthly year-over-year advance in natural gas production. Strong demand from the United States led to a 3.0% increase in exports of natural gas in October compared with the same month a year earlier. Year-to-date exports were up 2.2% over the same period in 1996.

Crude oil production increased a modest 0.9% over October 1996 levels, following several months of relatively strong growth. The weakness was due largely to a decline in the production of light crude oil. Exports rose only 1.1% from October 1996. However, year-to-date exports of crude oil were up 8.2% over the same period in 1996.

Imports of crude oil rose 27.5% from the October 1996 level. For the first 10 months of 1997, imports were up strongly (+9.9% compared with the same period in 1996), partly to meet the needs of Ontario refineries.

Coal and coke statistics

October 1997

Higher demand for thermal coal (mainly used for electric power generation) and stronger exports caused coal production to rise in October. Coal production totalled 6 961 kilotonnes, up 4.9% from October 1996. The year-to-date production figure stood at 65 280 kilotonnes, up 2.5%.

Exports in October increased 4.3% from October 1996 to 2 794 kilotonnes. However, exports to Japan (the largest consumer of Canadian coal) increased 50.8% to 1 956 kilotonnes during the same period, making up for two months of large decreases. This partly compensated for lower exports in Europe and the rest of Asia. Year-to-date figures show total exports of 30 253 kilotonnes, 3.6% above last year's level.

Coke production in October 1997 increased to 299 kilotonnes, up 12.2% from October 1996.

Steel primary forms

Week ending December 20, 1997 (preliminary)

Steel primary forms production for the week ending December 20, 1997, totalled 288 551 metric tonnes, up 0.5% from the week-earlier 287 117 metric tonnes and down 3.1% from the year-earlier 297 899 metric tonnes. The cumulative total at the end of the week was 14 930 364 metric tonnes, a 5.2% increase compared to 14 198 894 metric tonnes for the same period in 1996.
