Department store sales and stocks August 1998

Department store sales fell 1.7% to \$1,393.2 million (seasonally adjusted) in August, following a 4.9% advance in July 1998. After posting gains for the first three months of 1998, department store sales have declined in each of the past five months with the exception of July. Sales have been volatile since the second quarter of 1998. Department stores experienced a period of strong advances in sales from the last half of 1996 to the first quarter of 1998, following a period of more gradual advances from mid-1993.

The recent closure or conversion of a number of department stores may have contributed to the volatility in sales. There were 64 fewer departments stores in August compared with March 1998, the last peak in seasonally adjusted department store sales.

All provinces posted declines in the number of stores, with Ontario (-27) and British Columbia (-11) posting the greatest losses. The remaining provinces lost between 1 and 6 stores.

Unadjusted for seasonality, provincial sales levels in August 1998 compared with the same month last year were down in British Columbia (-6.3%), New Brunswick (-4.8%) and Nova Scotia (-0.6%). Saskatchewan (+5.5%), Alberta (+5.2%) and Manitoba (+4.7%) posted the largest year-over-year sales gains.

Steel primary forms

Week ending September 26, 1998 (preliminary)

Steel primary forms production for the week ending September 26, 1998, totalled 303 328 metric tonnes, down 2.4% from the week-earlier 310 860 tonnes and up 5.3% from the year-earlier 288 065 tonnes. The cumulative total at the end of the week was 12 019 555 tonnes, a 6.2% increase compared with 11 314 697 tonnes for the same period in 1997.

Electric lamps

August 1998

Light bulb and tube manufacturers sold 22.3 million light bulbs and tubes in August, down 5.5% from 23.6 million a year earlier. Year-to-date sales at the end of August totalled 182.2 million light bulbs and tubes, down 6.0% from 193.8 million a year earlier.

Coal and coke statistics

July 1998

Declining exports overseas led to lower coal production in July. Coal production totalled 5 879 kilotonnes, down 12.6% from July 1997. Year-to-date production figure stood at 44 083 kilotonnes, down 1.1%.

Exports in July decreased 17.1% from July 1997 to 2 875 kilotonnes. Exports to Japan (the largest consumer of Canadian coal) decreased 6.8% to 1 731 kilotonnes during the same period, while exports to Europe fell 62.9% to 276 kilotonnes. Year-to-date figures show total exports of 20 092 kilotonnes, 5.0% below last year's level.

Coke production decreased to 257 kilotonnes in July, down 8.1% from July 1997.


