

New Housing Price Index

August 1998

In August, the New Housing Price Index was unchanged from a month earlier, but remained 1.0% higher compared with August 1997.

New housing price indexes August 1997 to August 1998



The largest monthly increases occurred in Regina (+0.6%) and Halifax (+0.5%) as some builders passed on higher construction costs to new home buyers. Smaller increases were also noted in several other Canadian cities. However, these increases were counterbalanced by monthly decreases in Vancouver (-0.3%), Saint John-Moncton-Fredericton (-0.2%), Windsor (-0.2%), Charlottetown (-0.1%) and Saskatoon (-0.1%). Generally, contractors attributed these decreases to competitive factors.

Annual changes varied considerably among the cities surveyed. The largest annual increase was in the active Calgary (+8.4%) market. The largest annual decreases were in Victoria (-7.2%) and Vancouver (-4.9%) where market conditions continue to be very competitive.

Passenger bus industry

1997

The passenger bus industry generally suffered revenue declines compared with 1996. Expenditures increased sharply due to corporate take-overs and financial restructuring — primarily in the school bus industry.

Excluding these sharp increases, expenditures industry-side remained flat.

In contrast to the industry in general, urban transit companies revenues rebounded after a decline in 1996, gaining 6.5% compared with a year earlier — in part a result of ridership increases.
