MAJOR RELEASES


Home repairs and renovations

Homeowners spent an average of \$1,810 repairing or renovating their homes in 1999, an amount not significantly different from 1998, and still below the level of spending of the early 1990s. An estimated two-thirds of this total was devoted to work contracted out and one-third to materials purchased separately by homeowners. This proportion remains unchanged from previous years. (Figures from previous years used in comparisons have been adjusted using indices that reflect price changes in the construction field.)

About 65% of the nation's 7.5 million homeowner households reported spending on repairs and renovations in 1999. Painting was by far the most common type of repair or renovation work reported, with 38% of owners undertaking some type of interior or exterior paint job. Also commonly reported (by about 10% of households) were repairs to plumbing fixtures, heating and air conditioning systems, and patios, fences, driveways.

In total, homeowners spent \$13.6 billion on repairs and renovations in 1999. Thirty-four percent of the households that reported at least one repair or renovation expenditure spent less than \$500, accounting for only 2% of total repair and renovation spending. In contrast, 15% of reporting households spent \$5,000 or more, accounting for 64% of repair and renovation spending by homeowners.

Note to readers

The 1999 Homeowner Repair and Renovation Survey collected information in March 2000 from a sample of more than 20,000 homeowners about expenditures made in 1999 on repairs and renovations to their homes.

To facilitate historical comparisons, data from previous years have been adjusted to reflect price and wage changes in the construction field. Only summary-level expenditures from previous years have been adjusted.

For 1999, the estimation methodology of homeowner repair and renovation data has been changed. Current and historical estimates in this release have been adjusted to reflect 1996 Census population and household counts. 

Highest average spending was in Newfoundland and British Columbia

Among the provinces, average spending on repairs and renovations ranged from a low of \$1,290 in Manitoba to a high of \$1,970 in British Columbia. Newfoundlanders continued to be more likely to take on their own repairs, spending more than one-half of their repair and renovation budget on materials. In Ontario, just over one-quarter of the repair and renovation budget went to materials.



Rural homeowners more likely to do it themselves

Rural homeowners spent an average of \$1,600 on repairs and renovations in 1999. Their urban counterparts spent \$1,870. Rural homeowners allotted nearly one-half of their total spending on repairs and renovations to materials purchased separately; urban homeowners spent less than one-third on materials purchased separately.

Income a factor

Households with incomes less than \$20,000, representing 9% of all homeowner households, spent an average of \$750 on repairs or renovations in 1999. In contrast, the 17% of households with incomes of \$80,000 and over spent an average of \$3,310. Fifty percent of households in the lowest income group consist of individuals living alone, compared with only 2% of households in the highest income group.

Homeowner households with incomes less than \$20,000 spent their repair and renovation budgets differently than those with incomes \$80,000 and over. The lower income households allocated 58% to repairs, maintenance and equipment replacement and 42% to additions, renovations and new installations of

equipment. In contrast, higher income households spent 39% on repairs, maintenance and equipment replacement and 61% on additions, renovations and new installations of equipment. In general, spending on repairs, maintenance and equipment replacement is considered to be part of the cost of shelter, while spending on additions, renovations and new installations of equipment is an investment.

Husband-wife families with children spent the most

Husband-wife families with children spent the most of all one-family households — \$2,110 on average. Almost 60% of this amount went to additions, renovations and new installations. Individuals living alone — 46% of whom are seniors — and lone-parent households spent more than half of their repair and renovation budgets on repairs, maintenance and replacement of equipment.

Owners spent more on older dwellings

The older the dwelling, the greater the amount spent on repairing and upgrading it. For example, owners of homes built before 1946 spent an average of \$2,250 on repairs and renovations in 1999. Of this total, 44% went to repairs, maintenance and replacement of equipment, and 56% went to additions, renovations and new installations of equipment. Owners of homes built after 1990 spent only \$1,410 on average, allocating a smaller proportion (25%) to repairs, maintenance and equipment replacement, and a higher proportion (75%) to additions, renovations and new installations.

Population projections

2000-2026

Population of businesses with employees Third quarter 2000

Statistics Canada's Business Register Division is re-establishing the longstanding payroll deduction series, which produces a quarterly estimate of the number of businesses that have employees.

These are businesses that have registered a payroll deduction account with the Canada Customs and Revenue Agency (CCRA) in order to remit monies deducted from their employees salaries. This series includes a small number of enterprises with multiple payroll deduction accounts.

Re-introduction of this series comes after extensive analysis of administrative data originating with the CCRA Payroll Deduction Account. The series was terminated at the end of 1997. However, these data are now available for every quarter since 1980.

There were 992,388 businesses with employees in the third quarter of 2000, unchanged from the previous quarter. The number of employer businesses increased 0.3% in the Prairie provinces to 191,555, offsetting a 0.5% decrease in Atlantic Canada, where the total was 82,561.

In Ontario, the number of employer businesses rose 0.3% over the previous quarter to a total of 324,932. Alberta recorded a 0.8% gain to 121,125. Other provinces experienced small declines, offsetting these marginal gains.

Light bulbs and tubes

October 2000

Light bulb and tube manufacturers sold 28.5 million light bulbs and tubes in October, an increase of 7.9% from 26.4 million in October 1999.

Year-to-date sales at the end of October were 227.7 million light bulbs and tubes, an increase of 0.7% from the 226.0 million in the same period of 1999.

Mineral wool including fibrous glass insulation

October 2000

Manufacturers shipped 3 473 884 square metres of R12 factor (RSI 2.1) mineral wool batts in October, up 6.8% from 3 252 030 square metres in September, but down 2.6% from 3 566 651 square metres in October 1999.

Year-to-date shipments to the end of October totalled 24 342 766 square metres, a 7.0% decrease from the same period in 1999.

Sawmills and planing mills

September 2000 and third quarter 2000

Sawmills and planing mills shipped 5 832 thousand cubic metres of lumber in September 2000, a decrease of 5.2% from September 1999.

Shipments for the third quarter of 2000 were 16 465 thousand cubic metres, a decrease of 6.3% from the second quarter and a decline of 4.4% from the third quarter of 1999.

Canadian housing starts rebounded in the third quarter. They were at 156 600 units (seasonally adjusted at an annual rate), up 10% from the second quarter and up 5.8% from the third quarter of 1999. In Ontario, the value of housing permits was the highest recorded for the first nine months of any year. As well, mortgage rates remained stable and levels of full-time employment and consumer confidence remained high.

In the United States, on the other hand, housing starts were averaging 1.605 million units (seasonally adjusted at an annual rate) in the second quarter, but dropped to 1.527 million units in the third quarter. This may, in part, have caused the decrease in shipments

for this quarter since two-thirds of Canadian lumber is exported to the United States.

Interest rates in both Canada and the United States stayed at the same level during the third quarter, after rising in the past year.

Because of the slowdown in the U.S. housing market and strong North American lumber production, lumber prices are on a downward trend. In August 2000, lumber prices hit a five-year low.

Lumber shipments decreased in almost every province in the third quarter compared with the third quarter of 1999. Shipments were 1.5% lower in eastern Canada, with losses spread somewhat evenly across all provinces. Shipments in British Columbia fell 9.1%, mostly because of a 20.0% decrease in deliveries in the province's coastal region, which is affected to a greater extent by the economic situation in Asia.


