

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
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## THE SYSTEM OF NATIONAL ACCOUNTS

In Canada, the National Accounts have been developed since the close of the Second World War in a series of publications relating to their constituent parts. These have now reached a stage of evolution where they can be termed a "System of National Accounts". For purposes of identification, all publications (containing tables of statistics, descriptions of conceptual frameworks and descriptions of sources and methods) which make up this System carry the term "System of National Accounts" as a general title.

The System of National Accounts in Canada consists of several parts. The annual and quarterly Income and Expenditure Accounts (included with Catalogue Nos. carrying the prefix 13) were, historically speaking, the first set of statistics to be referred to with the title "National Accounts" (National Accounts, Income and Expenditure). The Balance of International Payments data (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 67) are also part of the System of National Accounts and they, in fact, pre-date the Income and Expenditure Accounts.

Greatly expanded structural detail on industries and on goods and services is portrayed in the Input-Output tables of the System (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 15). The Catalogue Nos. carrying the prefix 15 also provide measures of the contribution of each industry to total Gross Domestic Product at factor cost as well as Productivity Measures.

Both the Input-Output tables and the estimates of Gross Domestic Product by Industry use the establishment as the primary unit of industrial production. Measures of financial transactions are provided by Financial Flow Accounts (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 13). Types of lenders and financial instruments are the primary detail in these statistics and the legal entity is the main unit of classification of transactors. Balance sheets of outstanding assets and liabilities are published annually.

The System of National Accounts provides an overall conceptually integrated framework in which the various parts can be considered as interrelated sub-systems. At present, direct comparisons amongst those parts which use the establishment as the basic unit and those which use the legal entity can be carried out only at highly aggregated levels of data. However, Statistics Canada is continuing research on enterprise company establishment relationships; it may eventually be feasible to reclassify the data which are on one basis (say the establishment basis) to correspond to the units employed on another (the company or the enterprise basis).

In its broad outline, the Canadian System of National Accounts bears a close relationship to the international standard as described in the United Nations publication, **A System of National Accounts** (Studies in Methods, Series F, No. 2 Rev. 3, Statistical Office, Department of Economic and Social Affairs, United Nations, New York, 1968).

## LE SYSTEME DE COMPTABILITE NATIONALE

Au Canada, les comptes nationaux ont fait l'objet depuis la fin de la Seconde Guerre mondiale de toute une série de publications portant sur leurs éléments constitutifs. Ils ont connu une telle évolution qu'on peut maintenant les qualifier de "Système de comptabilité nationale". Aux fins d'identification, toutes les publications qui font partie du système (elles contiennent des tableaux statistiques, la description du cadre théorique et l'explication des sources et des méthodes) portent le titre général de "Système de comptabilité nationale".

Le système de comptabilité nationale du Canada se divise en plusieurs catégories de comptes. Les comptes annuels et trimestriels des revenus et dépenses (paraissant dans les publications dont les n°s de catalogue commencent par 13) ont constitué le premier ensemble de statistiques à être connu sous le titre de "Comptes nationaux" (Comptes nationaux, revenus et dépenses). Les données sur la balance canadienne des paiements internationaux (n°s de catalogue commençant par 67) font également partie du système de comptabilité nationale; elles ont même existé avant les comptes des revenus et dépenses.

Une nomenclature beaucoup plus détaillée d'industries et de biens et services figure dans les tableaux d'entrées-sorties du système (n°s de catalogue commençant par 15). Les publications dont les numéros de catalogue commencent par 15 comprennent aussi les mesures de l'apport de chaque branche d'activité au total du produit intérieur brut au coût des facteurs ainsi que les mesures de productivité.

L'établissement est l'unité primaire de production industrielle tant dans les tableaux d'entrées-sorties que dans les estimations du produit intérieur brut par activité économique. Les comptes de flux financiers (publications dont les n°s de catalogue commencent par 13) mesurent les opérations financières. Les catégories de prêteurs et d'instruments financiers forment les éléments de base de ces statistiques et la personne morale est le point de départ du classement des agents économiques. Les comptes du bilan des actifs et passifs en circulation sont disponibles annuellement.

Le système de comptabilité nationale constitue un ensemble conceptuellement intégré dans lequel les diverses catégories de comptes peuvent être considérées comme des sous-systèmes étroitement liés entre eux. Au stade actuel de développement, on ne peut faire de comparaison directe entre les éléments basés sur l'établissement et ceux qui sont basés sur l'entité juridique que lorsque les données sont groupées dans des catégories très générales. Toutefois, Statistique Canada poursuit ses recherches sur les relations entre l'entreprise, la société et l'établissement. Il sera peut-être possible un jour de reclasser les données établies sur une certaine base (l'établissement par exemple) de manière à les faire correspondre aux données établies sur une autre base (société ou entreprise).

Dans ses grandes lignes, le système de comptabilité nationale du Canada suit de très près la norme internationale exposée dans la publication des Nations Unies intitulée **Système de comptabilité nationale** (Etudes méthodologiques, série F, n° 2, rév. 3, Bureau de statistique, Département des affaires économiques et sociales, Nations Unies, New York, 1970).

## NOTE

This publication includes revised seasonally adjusted data from 1982 to 1986. The revisions reflect statistical changes resulting from revised source data and seasonal patterns.

Seasonally adjusted data for the years 1947 to 1980 and data unadjusted for seasonal variation for the period 1947 to date are available through CANSIM or directly from the Income and Expenditure Accounts Division.



## Introduction

### GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

#### Highlights - Third Quarter 1987

Gross Domestic Product rose 1.8% in the third quarter to a level, seasonally adjusted at annual rates, of \$558.6 billion. After allowing for price increases, this represents a gain of 1.1% in real GDP, compared to 1.5% in each of the first two quarters of the year. Higher domestic demand again led growth and was partly met by higher imports.

In real terms, domestic demand grew at a rapid rate for the third consecutive quarter, up 1.7%. Consumer spending continued to rise steadily, while business investment in plant and equipment accelerated. Housing demand slowed from the frenetic pace of recent quarters. Exports and imports both increased after declines in the second quarter despite continued sluggishness in the auto industry. On an industry basis, growth was led by a 1.7% gain for goods-producing industries, notably mining and manufacturing, while services grew by 1.1%.

### Components of Demand

Consumer spending expanded by 1.3% in volume and contributed almost three-quarters of the overall increase in GDP. Higher spending on goods, up 1.5%, accompanied a gain of 1.1% for services. Outlays for durable goods eased to 2.4% growth, compared to 5.1% last quarter, as demand for autos and furniture and appliances decelerated. Spending on semi- and non-durable goods grew by over 1%.

Investment in residential construction slowed to 2.8% growth from around 5% in each of the two preceding quarters. The slowdown was evident in all components. The quarterly growth of new housing construction fell from 9.7% to 5.5%, as housing starts slowed during the quarter. Outlays for alterations and improvements also grew more slowly. The resale market for homes declined, as a dampening of demand in central Canada more than offset a further recovery in Western Canada.

Business investment in plant and equipment continued to post strong growth in the third quarter. The 5% gain in volume was slightly faster than in the previous two quarters. Business investment was 14% above the level of a year ago, the largest gain in the current expansion. Outlays for machinery and equipment rose sharply, up 6.4% in the

### PRODUIT INTÉRIEUR BRUT

#### Points saillants - Troisième trimestre de 1987

Après désaisonnalisation au taux annuel, le produit intérieur brut augmente de 1.8% au troisième trimestre de 1987 pour atteindre \$558.6 milliards. Après correction de la variation des prix, le PIB réel enregistre une progression de 1.1%, comparativement à 1.5% au premier et au deuxième trimestre. Une fois de plus, c'est l'augmentation de la demande intérieure qui alimente la croissance, que vient satisfaire en partie un accroissement des importations.

En termes réels, la demande intérieure augmente rapidement pour le troisième trimestre consécutif (+ 1.7%). Les dépenses de consommation continuent de croître de façon soutenue, tandis que les investissements des entreprises en usines et matériel s'accélèrent. La demande de logements se ralentit par rapport au rythme frénétique des derniers trimestres. Après avoir baissé au deuxième trimestre, les exportations et les importations se redressent, en dépit de l'inertie persistante de l'industrie automobile. Par branche d'activité, la croissance provient du secteur des biens, en hausse de 1.7%, notamment des mines et de la fabrication; les branches des services progressent de 1.1%.

### Composantes de la demande

Les dépenses de consommation augmentent de 1.3% en volume, ce qui représente presque les trois quarts de la croissance globale du PIB. Les dépenses en biens s'accroissent de 1.5%, et celles au titre des services, de 1.1%. Les dépenses en biens durables n'augmentent que de 2.4%, contre 5.1% le trimestre précédent, en raison d'un ralentissement de la demande d'automobiles et de meubles et appareils ménagers. La croissance des dépenses en biens semi-durables et non durables dépasse 1%.

Après avoir atteint environ 5% au cours de chacun des deux trimestres précédents, la croissance des investissements en construction résidentielle n'est plus que de 2.8%; le ralentissement touche toutes les composantes de ce secteur. La croissance de la construction de logements neufs tombe de 9.7% à 5.5%, en raison du ralentissement des mises en chantier au cours du trimestre. Les dépenses au chapitre des modifications et des améliorations se ralentissent également. Le marché de la revente se replie, le fléchissement de la demande dans le centre du pays venant neutraliser la poursuite de la reprise dans l'Ouest.

Les investissements des entreprises en usines et matériel continuent de croître vigoureusement au troisième trimestre. L'augmentation de 5% en volume est légèrement supérieure à celle des deux trimestres précédents. Les investissements des entreprises dépassent de 14% leur niveau d'un an plus tôt, leur plus forte progression au cours de l'actuelle période d'expansion. Les dépen-

quarter, reflecting higher imports. Spending on non-residential construction rose a further 2.8%, comparable to the gains in the previous two quarters.

The volume of exports rose by 0.7%, following a slight decline in the second quarter. The gain in exports originated in crude materials and in end products, with particularly large gains in office machinery, natural gas and refined petroleum products. These increases offset a sharp decline in wheat exports and continued low export levels for motor vehicles and related products. Exports of services also continued to decline, reflecting lower tourist receipts and sales of business services.

Real imports rose by 3.7% in the third quarter, after a slight decline in the second. There were large increases in machinery and equipment and in crude petroleum. Imports of automotive products continued to decline, as domestic auto production and inventories were cut back.

Real non-farm business inventories rose by \$536 million in the third quarter; the rate of inventory accumulation has lagged behind sales growth for the last four quarters. The third quarter increase in stocks was confined to the wholesale industry, at a time of rising imports. In manufacturing, raw material and finished goods inventories fell while the retail industry recorded widespread declines.

The rate of increase in the overall Implicit Price Index for GDP remained at a moderate 0.7%. Prices for machinery and equipment, particularly the imported components, continued to decline and there was also a slackening in new housing prices. Export prices rose 0.7%, the first rise after seven consecutive quarterly declines. The gain was led by rising export prices for most crude and fabricated materials, and food products other than wheat.

## Production by Industry

On an industry basis, most of the third quarter growth in the goods-producing industries originated with mining and manufacturing. Mining output increased 5.9% in the third quarter due to higher production levels for crude petroleum and natural gas, to meet export demand, as well as increased activity in services related to mineral extraction. Within manufacturing, significant output increases were recorded in wood products, primary metals, fabricated metal products and electrical and electronic products.

The most significant output increases among service-producing industries occurred in financial institutions and in wholesale trade, due to increased sales of industrial and farm machinery and equipment.

Les dépenses en machines et matériel enregistrent une forte augmentation de 6.4% au troisième trimestre, ce qui traduit la hausse des importations. Les dépenses au titre de la construction non résidentielle s'accroissent de 2.8% au troisième trimestre, soit à peu près autant qu'au cours des deux trimestres précédents.

Les exportations augmentent de 0.7% en volume, après un léger recul au deuxième trimestre. La hausse des exportations est attribuable aux matières brutes et aux produits finals; on observe des augmentations particulièrement importantes pour les machines de bureau, le gaz naturel et les dérivés du pétrole. Ces hausses viennent neutraliser une forte baisse des exportations de blé et des exportations toujours faibles de véhicules automobiles et de produits connexes. Les exportations de services continuent également de se replier, ce qui traduit la baisse des recettes touristiques et des ventes de services aux entreprises.

Les importations augmentent de 3.7% en volume au troisième trimestre, après une légère baisse le trimestre précédent. On note une forte augmentation de la demande de machines et de matériel ainsi que de pétrole brut. Les importations de produits automobiles continuent de se replier, en raison de la baisse de la production et de la réduction des stocks au pays.

Les stocks commerciaux non agricoles réels s'accroissent de \$536 millions au troisième trimestre; le taux de mises en stocks a été inférieur à la croissance des ventes au cours des quatre derniers trimestres. Au troisième trimestre, seuls les stocks du commerce de gros augmentent, avec la hausse des importations. Dans la fabrication, les stocks de matière brutes et de produits finis diminuent; on note des baisses générales dans le commerce de détail.

Le taux d'accroissement de l'indice implicite de prix d'ensemble du PIB demeure modéré (0.7%). Le prix des machines et du matériel, en particulier celui des composantes importées, continue de se replier, et l'on constate également un relâchement du prix des maisons neuves. Les prix à l'exportation progressent de 0.7%; il s'agit de la première hausse après sept diminutions trimestrielles consécutives. Les plus fortes hausses des prix à l'exportation touchent la plupart des matières brutes et travaillées ainsi que les produits alimentaires autres que le blé.

## Production par branche d'activité

Par branche d'activité, la plus grande partie de la croissance du secteur des biens provient des mines et de la fabrication. La production des mines augmente de 5.9% au troisième trimestre; on observe une hausse de la production de pétrole brut et de gaz naturel, en réponse à la demande à l'exportation, ainsi qu'un accroissement de l'activité dans les services se rattachant à l'extraction de minerai. S'agissant de la fabrication, des augmentations appréciables s'observent dans les produits du bois, la première transformation des métaux, la fabrication de produits en métal ainsi que de produits électriques et électroniques.

Dans les services, les plus fortes progressions de l'activité touchent les institutions financières ainsi que le commerce de gros où la progression traduit un accroissement des ventes de machines et de matériel industriels et agricoles.

## **Components of Income**

Wages, salaries, and supplementary labour income rose by 1.4% in the third quarter. The gain was evenly distributed between the goods- and services-producing industries. A slowdown in employment growth checked the overall increase in labour income. The growth in personal income slowed considerably, largely reflecting irregular movements in net farm income caused by the timing of subsidy payments. With personal spending up 2.3%, the savings rate fell from 9.1% to 8.0%.

Corporate profits before taxes rose by 4.6%, the fourth consecutive quarter of strong growth. The mining industry led the third quarter increase, reflecting higher prices. Manufacturers of metal, wood, and paper products also posted large quarterly gains.

Total revenues of the government sector edged up by 1.2%, as lower direct taxes from persons offset a large increase in indirect taxes. Total expenditure rose only slightly with a large drop in farm subsidy payments offsetting increases elsewhere. As a result, the overall deficit of the government sector, on a national accounts basis and seasonally adjusted at annual rates, narrowed from \$23.9 billion in the second quarter to \$21.9 billion in the third.

## **Composantes du revenu**

La rémunération des salariés s'accroît de 1.4% au troisième trimestre. Cet accroissement se répartit de façon égale entre le secteur des biens et celui des services. Le ralentissement de la croissance de l'emploi est venu limiter l'augmentation globale du revenu du travail. La croissance du revenu personnel se ralentit considérablement, ce qui traduit dans une large mesure les fluctuations irrégulières du revenu agricole net imputables à l'échelonnement des subventions. Compte tenu d'une hausse de 2.3% des dépenses personnelles, le taux d'épargne passe de 9.1% à 8.0%.

Les bénéfices des sociétés avant impôts augmentent de 4.6%, ce qui en fait le quatrième trimestre consécutif de forte croissance. Ce sont les mines qui affichent l'augmentation la plus forte, en raison de la hausse des prix. Les bénéfices des fabricants de papier, de produits du bois et de produits de métal enregistrent également de fortes progressions au cours du trimestre.

Les recettes totales du secteur des administrations publiques ne progressent que de 1.2%, la baisse des impôts directs des particuliers étant neutralisée par une forte hausse des impôts indirects. Les dépenses totales s'accroissent très légèrement, alors qu'une forte baisse des subventions aux agriculteurs vient compenser d'autres augmentations. Le déficit global du secteur des administrations publiques, sur la base des comptes nationaux et après désaisonnalisation au taux annuel, diminue, passant de \$23.9 milliards au deuxième trimestre à \$21.9 milliards au troisième.


