

FARM CASH RECEIPTS(1), 1964(2)

(Formerly Farm Cash Income)

This report presents, by commodity and by province, preliminary estimates of farm cash receipts from farming operations for the year 1964. As a result of more up-to-date information becoming available in recent weeks, the provincial and Canada totals contained herein differ slightly from those presented in the advance preliminary report published in March. Included in this report are data concerning cash receipts from the sale of farm products, Canadian Wheat Board participation payments on previous years' grain crops, net cash advances on farm-stored grains in Western Canada, deficiency payments made by the Agricultural Stabilization Board, and supplementary payments outlined below. No deductions are made for the cost of production of commodities sold(3).

Total cash receipts from farming operations, excluding supplementary payments, are now estimated at 3,455.6 million dollars for Canada, excluding Newfoundland. This estimate is a record high and exceeds by 8.5 per cent the previous high of 3,184.5 million established in 1963. In comparing these estimates with those for earlier years, it should be remembered that the totals for 1962, 1963 and 1964 have been revised to include substantial revisions to receipts from dairy production. Complete revisions for all products will be published sometime in 1965(4).

The increase in farm cash receipts in 1964 over 1963 can be attributed for the most part to a substantial increase in farmers' marketings of wheat and to much larger participation payments made by the Canadian Wheat Board. Somewhat less important contributions were made by oilseed crops, potatoes, barley, fruits, vegetables, cattle, hogs and dairy products. Partially offsetting these gains were lower total receipts from poultry products, tobacco and oats, and a substantial repayment of cash advances on farm-stored grains in Western Canada.

Under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act(5) farmers also received, in 1964, supplementary payments amounting to 8.5 million dollars as against 14.8 million during 1963. When added together, farm cash receipts from farming operations and total supplementary payments amounted to 3,464.1 million dollars for 1964, about 8.3 per cent above the previous record high of 3,199.3 million in 1963.

Field Crops - It is estimated that during 1964 farmers realized 1,569.8 million dollars from the sala of field crops, cash advances on farm-stored grains in Western Canada, and Canadian Wheat Board payments. This is nearly 20 per cent above the revised estimate of 1,320.4 million dollars for the previous year and results largely from substantially higher total receipts from wheat marketings and Canadian Wheat Board participation payments. In total, income from field crops in 1964 accounted for approximately 45 per cent of total cash receipts for the year, excluding supplementary payments. This compares with about 40 per cent in 1963.

Cash receipts to farmers from wheat at the time of delivery and before adjustment for cash advances, totalled 741.0 million dollars for 1964, about 24 per cent above the 598.1 million dollars received a year earlier. For the most part, this gain arises out of unusually heavy marketings by farmers from the record 1963 crop to meet above-normal export demand. During 1964, the Canadian Wheat Board distributed to farmers a total of nearly 225 million dollars in the form of participation payments. This compares with about 124 million dollars in 1963. The 1964 payments represent a final payment of 42.5 cents per bushel on wheat delivered to the Board from the 1962 crop and also final payments of 12.4 cents and 18.2 cents per bushel paid respectively on deliveries from the 1962 crops of oats and barley. The payments made in 1963 were made up entirely of a final payment of 43.0 cents per bushel on deliveries from the 1961 wheat crop. These payments arise out of the system of grain marketings in Western Canada whereby farmers, at the time they deliver their grain, are given initial payments and certificates stating the quantities and grades delivered. These certificates entitle producers to share in surpluses accumulated by the Board through subsequent sales of these grains for domestic consumption or export. The share of the money accruing to farmers represents the Canadian Wheat Board payments included in these estimates of farm receipts.

Receipts from flaxseed, rapeseed and soybeans, rose from a total of 61.5 million dollars in 1963 to 93.4 million in 1964 largely as a result of increased marketings. Rapeseed was the only oilseed for which there was any noticeable increase in prices. Cash receipts from flaxseed were up from 36.4 million dollars in 1963 to nearly 60.0 million in 1964, and returns to rapeseed growers increased from 11.7 million dollars to about 18.0 million.

While initial delivery prices for barley remained unchanged, marketings increased to give total receipts from this crop in 1964 of almost 72.0 million dollars as against 67.7 million a year earlier. Receipts from potatoes, at 55.1 million dollars in 1964, was 31.4 per cent above the 1963 level as a result of both larger marketings and higher prices. Fruits and vegetables rose from a total of 146.3 million dollars in 1963 to 157.2 million in 1964.

The most important offset to the above gains was caused by repayments of cash advances on farmstored grains in Western Canada. Heavy marketings of grains during the year 1964 led to repayments which exceeded cash advances by 12.1 million dollars. As a result, the net entry in farm cash receipts was minus 12.1 million dollars. This was in contrast with the previous year when advances exceeded repayments by 11.2 million dollars. Returns from tobacco declined from 114.2 million dollars to 96.7 million dollars. Most of this decline occurred in Ontario and can be attributed to lower prices and a much larger proportion of the 1963 crop sold during the year of production than was the case for the 1962 crop.

Farmers' marketings of oats declined quite significantly in 1964. This together with average prices approximately the same as in 1963 provided total cash receipts from this source of 33.0 million in 1964, 27.8 per cent less than a year earlier.

<u>Livestock and Livestock Products</u> - Total cash receipts to producers of livestock and livestock products amounting to 1,853.0 million dollars in 1964, were little different from those of 1963. Marketings of cattle, calves and hogs were above 1963 levels, but prices averaged lower. Total cash receipts from cattle and calves amounted to 645.5 million dollars as against 638.1 million in the previous year while hogs at 325.5 million dollars compared with 318.2 in 1963. Farmers marketed fewer sheep and lambs at prices not greatly different from those of a year earlier with the result that receipts from these sources, at 9.4 million dollars, were slightly below the 1963 estimate.

A record production of poultry meat in 1964 more than offset slightly lower prices, to give a total cash income of 173.2 million dollars as against 168.9 a year earlier. Egg production also increased quite substantially but the decline in prices was proportionally greater with the result cash receipts decreased from 148.4 million dollars in 1963 to 132.6 million in 1964. A combination of higher prices and a slight increase in production provided total receipts from dairy products of approximately 531 million dollars in 1964, about 20 million dollars above the level of the previous year.

Estimates of farm cash receipts from farming operations include the returns from all sales of agricultural products except those associated with direct interfarm transfers. The prices used to value all products sold are prices to farmers at the farm level; they include any subsidies, bonuses and premiums which can be attributed to specific products, but they exclude any storage, transportation, processing and handling charges which are not actually received by farmers.

Many sources of information are used in the preparation of these estimates. These include: the Censuses of Agriculture; periodic Bureau surveys of production and disposition of crops, livestock and animal products; farm product marketing agencies; processors of agricultural products; Bureau surveys of prices received by farmers in connection with agricultural activities; agricultural statistics arising out of administrative responsibilities of various government departments, both Federal and Provincial.

In Table 1 is summarized the preliminary estimate of cash receipts from farming operations, by quarters and by provinces, for the calendar year 1964 and estimates for 1962 and 1963. Tables 2, 3 and 4 present farm cash receipts by commodity sources for each province, in the three years and include supplementary payments. No information is available for Newfoundland.
