

## FARM CASH RECEIPTS, JANUARY - MARCH 1965(1)

Farmers' cash receipts from farming operations are estimated at 974.1 million dollars for the first three months of 1965, 14 per cent above the record-high figure of 854.9 million dollars established for the corresponding period of 1964. These estimates include cash receipts from the sale of farm products, Canadian Wheat Board participation payments on previous years' grain crops, net cash advances on farm-stored grains in Western Canada, and deficiency payments made by the Agricultural Stablization Board. No deductions are made for the cost of production of commodities sold(2).

The increase in total receipts is due in large part to a substantial rise in Canadian Wheat Board payments - from a total of 208.5 million for the first quarter of 1964 to 292.1 million for the same period of 1965. Higher returns were also realized from potatoes, tobacco, soybeans, rapeseed, cattle, calves, hogs, dairy products and poultry meat. Offsetting these gains to some extent were lower receipts from current sales of wheat, coarse grains and eggs.

All provinces shared in the increase with the most significant absolute gains occurring in Ontario, Saskatchewan and Alberta. The substantial rise recorded for Ontario is due for the most part to tobacco and cattle while for Saskatchewan and Alberta it stems from record Canadian Wheat Board participation payments. On a percentage basis the most important increases were recorded in Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick where potato prices rose well above the 1964 first-quarter levels.

Under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act(3), farmers also received supplementary payments amounting to 8.8 million dollars during the January-March period of 1965 as against 6.6 million for the corresponding 1964 period. When added together, farmers' cash receipts from farming operations and supplementary payments totalled 982.9 million dollars for the 1965 period, about 14 per cent above the 1964 level of 861.5 million dollars.

Field Crops - Total cash receipts from field crops, including Canadian Wheat Board participation payments and cash advances on farm-stored grains in Western Canada, amounted to 536.4 million dollars or 55 per cent of total receipts from farming. This estimate is about 20 per cent above the level of a year earlier and reflects the record-high participation payments made by the Canadian Wheat Board during this quarter. These payments represent final payments on the 1963 crop marketings of wheat and barley of 48.2 cents and 22.6 cents per bushel respectively. They arose out of the system of grain marketings in Western Canada whereby farmers, at the time they deliver their grain, are given initial payments and certificates stating the quantities and grades delivered. These certificates entitle farmers to share in surpluses accumulated by the Board through subsequent sales of these grains for domestic consumption or export. The share of the surpluses accruing to farmers represents the Canadian Wheat Board payments included in these estimates of farm cash receipts.

Total receipts from the sale of potatoes increased significantly, from 9.5 million dollars for the first three months of 1964 to 25.2 million for the like period in 1965. Although marketings were above year-ago levels, most of this gain is attributable to a very substantial increase in prices arising out of a short crop in the United States in 1964 and a resultant strong demand in that country for Canadian potatoes. The marked increase in returns from this crop is reflected in the spectacular rise in total cash receipts occurring in Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick.

Cash receipts to farmers from the sale of tobacco rose from 43.9 million dollars for the 1964 period to 54.0 million dollars in 1965. Although quantities sold during the first quarter of 1965 were about the same as those for the corresponding period of a year earlier, prices were substantially higher as a result of the smaller crop produced last year. Increased marketings of both rapeseed and soybeans at prices above the first-quarter level of a year ago provided total cash receipts from these sources well above those realized during the first three months of 1964.

Up to the end of March 1965, farmers delivered less wheat, coarse grains, rye and flaxseed than during the corresponding period of a year ago and this is reflected in lower cash receipts from each of these crops. Returns from wheat were 109.6 million dollars in 1965 as compared with 140.7 million in 1964 while receipts from the sale of flaxseed dropped from 13.1 million dollars to 6.6 million.

Livestock and Livestock Products - During the first quarter of 1965 total cash receipts to farmers from the sale of livestock and livestock products amounted to 432.1 million dollars, 7.6 per

cent above the level of a year ago for the corresponding period. Receipts from cattle and calves rose from 142.8 million dollars to 165.6 million as a result of increased marketings more than off-setting slightly lower average prices. A similar marketings-price situation developed for hogs with the result that receipts from this source increased from 77.8 million dollars for the first three months of 1964 to 84.2 million for the like period of 1965.

A combination of slightly increased production and slightly higher prices provided total returns from the sale of dairy products of 103.0 million dollars as against 99.2 million for the January-March period of 1964. Total cash receipts from eggs, estimated at 32.1 million dollars to the end of March 1965, were about 11 per cent below the 1964 level as a result of lower prices more than offsetting higher marketings.

Estimates of cash receipts from farming operations include the returns from all sales of agricultural products except those associated with direct interfarm transfers. The prices used to value all products sold are prices to farmers at the farm level; they include any subsidies, bonuses and premiums which can be attributed to specific products, but they exclude any storage, transportation, processing and handling charges which are not actually received by farmers.

Many sources of information are used in the preparation of these estimates. These include the Censuses of Agriculture; periodic Bureau surveys of production and disposition of crops, livestock and animal products; farm product marketing agencies; processors of agricultural products; Bureau surveys of prices received by farmers in connection with agricultural activities; agricultural statistics arising out of administrative responsibilities of various government departments, both Federal and Provincial.
