

FARM CASH RECEIPTS

APRIL TO JUNE 1966



FARM CASH RECEIPTS, JANUARY - JUNE 1966(1)

During the first six months of 1966, farmers' total cash receipts from farming operations reached an estimated \$1,919.2 million. This is about 11 per cent above the figure of \$1,727.7 million realized in 1965, and 16.3 per cent higher than the 1964 estimate of \$1,650.7 million. These estimates include cash receipts from the sale of farm products, Canadian Wheat Board participation payments on previous years' grain crops, net cash advances on farm-stored grains in Western Canada, and deficiency payments made by the Agricultural Stabilization Board. These estimates make no allowances for the cost of production of commodities sold.(2)

The increase in total farm cash receipts between the first half of 1965 and the first half of 1966 is attributable in large part to substantial increases in cash receipts from the sale of wheat, oilseed crops, tobacco, cattle, calves, hogs and poultry products. Offsetting these gains to some extent were a reduction in total returns from the sale of potatoes, increased repayments of cash advances on farm-stored grain in Western Canada, and smaller Canadian Wheat Board participation payments.

All provinces, except Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick and Saskatchewan, shared in the increase in total cash receipts. The greatest absolute increase occurred in Ontario as a result of fairly substantial increases in returns from the sale of tobacco, cattle, hogs and poultry products. The declines in total cash receipts recorded for Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick reflect for the most part a cut-back in total returns from the sale of potatoes. Smaller total Canadian Wheat Board participation payments account for most of the reduction in Saskatchewan.

In addition to the above income, farmers also received supplementary payments amounting to \$7.4 million during the first half of 1966, as against \$10.8 million for the same period a year earlier. The payments for the 1965 period are made up entirely of payments made under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act, whereas the payments to the end of June 1966 include, in addition to P.F.A.A. payments, an amount of \$2.5 million paid to eligible milk and cream producers. When added together farmers' cash receipts from farming operations and supplementary payments totalled \$1,926.6 million for the 1966 period, about 11 per cent above the 1965 level of \$1,738.5 million.

Field Crops - During the first six months of 1966, it is estimated that Canadian farmers received a total of \$787.1 million from the sale of field crops. This is 1.4 per cent above the \$776.0 million received during the corresponding period of 1965. Substantial increases occurred in the total returns from the sale of wheat, oilseeds and tobacco, but these gains were almost offset by reduced income from potatoes, increased repayments of cash advances on farm-stored western grains and smaller Canadian Wheat Board payments. Total returns to wheat producers rose from \$263.1 million to \$304.4 million and receipts from oilseeds increased from \$22.6 million to \$55.8 million. In each case, most of the increase is attributable to higher marketings. It is estimated that tobacco growers received cash receipts totalling \$67.7 million during the early months of 1966, 34.4 per cent above the 1965 estimate of \$50.4 million; this gain reflects an increase in both prices and quantities sold.

Although farmers' marketings of potatoes during the January-June period of 1966 did not vary significantly from those of a year earlier, prices were down quite substantially with the result that total cash receipts from this commodity dropped from \$53.6 million to \$39.4 million. Repayments under the Prairie Grain Advance Payments Act during the first six months of 1966 exceeded advances by an amount nearly \$6 million greater than a year ago. Total Canadian Wheat Board participation payments during the first half of 1966 amounted to \$229.2 million as against the comparable figure of \$296.8 million in 1965. This decline is due entirely to smaller total final payments on the 1964 wheat crop relative to those made a year earlier on the 1963 crop; these smaller payments reflect a reduction in both the per bushel payments and the marketings on which the payments were made.

Livestock and Livestock Products - Farmers' total cash receipts from the sale of livestock and livestock products are estimated at \$1,107.5 million for the first six months of 1966. This is 19 per cent above the level of the 1965 estimate of \$930.1 million for the same period. This amount for 1966 represented nearly 58 per cent of the total cash receipts from farming. Total returns from cattle and calves rose from \$334.8 million in 1965 to \$428.4 million in 1966 as a result of both increased marketings and higher prices. Hog marketings during the 1966 period were down but prices reached recordbreaking levels and total cash receipts from this commodity increased from \$172.4 million in 1965 to \$216.4 million in 1966.

Cash receipts from dairy products reached a total of \$268.6 million to the end of June 1966 as against \$262.9 million in 1965; although the quantities sold remained about the same for the two years,

prices were higher in 1966. Increased poultry meat production is reflected in total cash receipts which rose from \$69.1 million in 1965 to \$87.7 million in 1966. Total cash returns to egg producers amounted to \$78.8 million as against \$65.9 million in 1965; a substantial increase in prices more than offset a drop in marketings.

Estimates of cash receipts from farming operations include the returns from all sales of agricultural products except those associated with direct interfarm transfers. The prices used to value all products sold are prices to farmers at the farm level; they include any subsidies, bonuses and premiums which can be attributed to specific products, but they exclude any storage, transportation, processing and handling charges which are not actually received by farmers.

Many sources of information are used in the preparation of these estimates. These include the Censuses of Agriculture; periodic Bureau surveys of production and disposition of crops, livestock and animal products; farm product marketing agencies; processors of agricultural products; Bureau surveys of prices received by farmers in connection with agricultural activities; agricultural statistics arising out of administrative responsibilities of various government departments, both Federal and Provincial.
