

FARM CASH RECEIPTS, 1967(1)

This report presents, by commodity and by province, estimates of farm cash receipts from farming operations for the calendar year 1967. As a result of more up-to-date information becoming available in recent weeks, the provincial and Canada totals contained herein differ slightly from those presented in the preliminary report published in March. Included in this report are cash receipts from the sale of farm products, Canadian Wheat Board participation payments on previous years' grain crops, net cash advances on farm-stored grains in Western Canada, deficiency payments made by the Agricultural Stabilization Board, and supplementary payments outlined below. No deductions have been made for the cost of production of commodities sold(2).

Total cash receipts form farming operations, excluding supplementary payments, are now estimated at \$4,379.0 million for Canada(1), the highest recorded to date. They are 3.3 per cent above the previous record of \$4,238.7 million established in 1966 and 22.8 per cent above the average for the five years, 1962-66.

The most significant contributions to the gain in farm cash receipts in 1967 were higher Canadian Wheat Board participation payments, increased cash returns from the sale of dairy products, tobacco, barley, cattle and calves, and larger payments under the dairy support program. In contrast, lower cash returns were realized from wheat, oats, rye, flaxseed, potatoes, hogs and poultry products. Increases in total cash receipts, ranging from about 3 to 6 per cent, were estimated for Quebec, Ontario, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia. In the remaining provinces, cash receipts were lower, with declines ranging from less than one per cent in Manitoba to nearly 10 per cent in New Brunswick.

In addition to the above income, farmers also received supplementary payments amounting to \$6.1 million in 1967 in contrast with \$41.3 million in 1966. These payments include only those made under the Prairie Farm Assistance Act and other government assistance to farmers who suffered losses as a result of adverse weather conditions. In 1966 these payments included substantial outlays for assistance to farmers in Quebec and Ontario who suffered from extreme drought conditions during 1965; with improved conditions in subsequent years, these payments declined. When added together, farm cash receipts from farming operations and supplementary payments totalled \$4,385.2 million in 1967, 2.5 per cent above the previous record high of \$4,280.0 million in 1966.

Field Crops - During 1967, farmers' total returns from the sale of field crops, cash advances on farmstored grains in Western Canada, and Canadian Wheat Board payments amounted to \$1,837.8 million, nearly 4 per cent above the 1966 level of \$1,769.4 million. This estimate of total field crop returns for 1967 amounted to 42.0 per cent of farmers' total cash receipts form farming operations, about the same proportions as a year earlier. The maintenance of field crop returns at this level is due to higher Canadian Wheat Board participation payments on previous years' grain crops and increased returns from the sale of tobacco, barley, fruits, vegetables, rapeseed, soybeans, and sugar beets. Lower receipts were obtained for wheat, oats, potatoes, flaxseed and rye marketed by farmers in the 1967 calendar year.

Marketings of wheat were above 1966 calendar year levels during the first half of the year but dropped below during the third and fourth quarters with the result that by the end of the year the total was about 12 per cent less than in 1966. Although initial prices were increased by 20 cents per bushel at August 1, 1967, this was insufficient to offset the smaller marketings with the result that farmers' cash returns from this crop at time of delivery declined from \$803.7 million in 1966 to \$761.6 million in 1967. Canadian Wheat Board participation payments paid in 1967 on the 1965 wheat crop pool amounted to \$270.2 million as against the \$200.2 million in 1966 on the 1964 pool. When these payments are added to the receipts at time of delivery, total returns from wheat amounted to \$1,031.8 million in 1967, slightly above the \$1,003.8 million realized in 1966.

Smaller marketings of oats more than offset an increase in the initial price of 5 cents per bushel, effective August 1, 1967, and total cash returns at time of delivery declined from \$36.6 million for the calendar year 1966 to \$24.7 million in 1967. Oats participation payments by the Canadian Wheat Board amounted to \$12.3 million in 1967 and \$6.8 million a year earlier to give total cash returns from this product of \$37.0 million in 1967 as against \$43.4 million in the previous year. Barley was the only cereal crop for which there was an increase in cash returns from marketings in 1967; marketings were higher as well as prices which averaged above the 1966 level as a result of an increase of 10 cents

per bushel in the initial delivery price at August 1, 1967. Total returns to barley producers including initial returns at time of delivery and C.W.B. participation payments amounted to \$125.0 million in 1967, about 18 per cent above the 1966 estimate of \$105.8 million. Receipts from the sale of tobacco are estimated at \$156.7 million 32.9 per cent above the 1966 level of \$117.9 million as a result of an increase in both average prices and total deliveries.

The price of rye averaged about the same in 1967 as in 1966 and that of flaxseed increased, but total returns from these crops dropped off sharply as a result of substantial reductions in marketings. Little change was estimated for the marketings of potatoes, but prices were considerably lower in 1967 with the result that total income declined from \$73.7 million to \$53.3 million. The effect of the reduction in potato income was most evident in Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick.

<u>Livestock and Livestock Products</u> - Total cash receipts from the sale of livestock and livestock products amounted to \$2,392.7 million in the calendar year 1967 as compared with \$2,354.7 million for 1966. Returns from the sale of dairy products, cattle and calves more than offset lower returns from hogs, poultry products, sheep and lambs.

Total cash returns to farmers from cattle and calves amounted to \$922.3 million in 1967 as against \$888.3 million for the previous year; although total marketings were lower than in 1966, prices averaged higher. Hog marketings during 1967 were well above the level of a year earlier but prices averaged lower with the result that total cash receipts from this source declined from \$421.0 million to \$408.3 million.

Cash returns to poultry producers were lower for both eggs and poultry meat in 1967. Production of eggs was well above the level of the previous year, but prices were down substantially to give total cash receipts of \$148.6 million in 1967 as against \$169.8 million in 1966. Although turkey production was down slightly in 1967, total poultry meat production continued to climb largely as a result of higher output of chicken broilers. However, prices were down more than enough to offset production increases and total cash returns declined from \$232.6 million in 1966 to \$224.7 million. Cash receipts from the sale of dairy products (exclusive of supplementary support payments) totalled \$629.4 million in 1967, approximately \$45 million higher than in 1966; higher average prices more than offset a slight decline in production. Supplementary dairy support payments rose from \$68.6 million to \$103.2 million and when added to sales returns gives a total of \$732.7 million for 1967 as against \$653.0 million in 1966.

Estimates of cash receipts from farming operations include the returns from all sales of agricultural products except those associated with direct inter-farm transfers. The prices used to value all products sold are prices to farmers at the farm level; they include any subsidies, bonuses and premiums which can be attributed to specific products, but they exclude any storage, transportation, processing and handling charges which are not actually received by farmers.

Many sources of information are used in the preparation of these estimates. These include the Censuses of Agriculture; periodic Bureau surveys of production and disposition of crops, livestock and animal products; farm product marketing agencies; processors of agricultural products; Bureau surveys of prices received by farmers in connection with agricultural activities; agricultural statistics arising out of administrative responsibilities of various government departments, both Federal and Provincial.
