

FARM CASH RECEIPTS JANUARY - SEPTEMBER, 1970(1)

It is estimated that during the first nine months of 1970, cash receipts from farming operations amounted to \$3,021.8 million, 1.8 per cent below the \$3,076.2 million realized during the same period of 1969. These estimates include cash receipts from the sale of farm products, Canadian Wheat Board participation payments on previous years' grain crops, net cash advances on farm-stored grains in Western Canada, deficiency payments made by the Agricultural Stabilization Board and supplementary payments to dairy producers. No deduction was made for the cost incurred by farmers in the production of the commodities sold. Estimates of the expenses involved in farming operations together with total farm net income are published annually in the DBS publication "Farm Net Income" (Catalogue No. 21-202).

This decline in cash receipts for the first nine months of 1970 compared to the same period of 1969 is mainly due to substantial repayments of cash advances on farm stored-grains in Western Canada, a considerable decline in Canadian Wheat Board participation payments, and lesser declines in dairy supplementary payments and in the value of sales of oats and eggs. Partially offsetting these declines were increased returns for wheat, barley, rapeseed, potatoes, tobacco, hogs, cattle and calves.

Due mainly to large repayments of cash advances and lower Canadian Wheat Board participation payments, farmers' cash returns declined in all of the Prairie Provinces. The fall in farm cash receipts was greatest in Saskatchewan at 9.2 per cent, rather less in Manitoba at 7 per cent, and least in Alberta at 4.3 per cent. Much greater returns from the sale of potatoes largely accounted for the greatest gains in total cash receipts of slightly more than 25 per cent in Prince Edward Island and just over 21 per cent in New Brunswick. The remaining increases amounted to 2 per cent in Nova Scotia and Quebec and one per cent in Ontario. British Columbia maintained practically the same level as in the previous year.

In addition to the above income, farmers received supplementary payments amounting to \$32.1 million during the January to September period of 1970, compared to \$9.1 million for the like period a year earlier. For both years, these payments included those made under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act. In addition they included, in 1969, payments to sugar beet growers in Ontario and, in 1970, payments made under the Lower Inventory For Tomorrow (LIFT) program. When added together, farmers' cash receipts from farming operations and supplementary payments totalled \$3,053.8 million, one per cent below the 1969 level of \$3,085.3 million.

Field Crops. — Total cash receipts from field crops including Canadian Wheat Board participation payments and net cash advances on farm-stored grain in Western Canada amounted to \$992.6 million, almost 10 per cent below the \$1,086.1 million realized during the January to September period of 1969. This represents 32.8 per cent of total farm cash receipts compared to 35.3 per cent during the same period of 1969. The large decrease in net cash advances on farm-stored grains together with a decline in Canadian Wheat Board participation payments on previous years' wheat, oats and barley crops was only partially offset by increased cash returns from wheat, barley, rapeseed, potatoes and tobacco.

During the first nine months of 1969, cash advances on farm-stored grains exceeded repayments by \$93 million; in 1970, repayments exceeded cash advances by about the same amount. Participation payments on previous years' grain crops fell from \$68.5 million for the first three quarters of 1969 to \$6.6 million in the corresponding period of 1970. On the other hand farmers' returns from wheat at time of delivery rose from \$423.3 million in the January to September period of 1969 to \$464.3 million for the first nine months of 1970. A decline in average prices received by farmers was more than offset by an increase in marketings. Although barley prices were lower than those of the previous period, marketings more than doubled and total returns to barley producers at the end of September 1970, were \$102.3 million, 77.0 per cent above the 1969 level of \$57.8 million. For rapeseed, both prices and marketings were higher during the first nine months of 1970, resulting in cash receipts from this source rising by \$29.6 million to \$59.5 million. A large increase occurred in average potato prices and with marketings dropping only slightly below last year's level, returns to producers rose 55.7 per cent to a value of \$64.3 million. Although average prices for tobacco were lower in 1970 than in the previous year, increased marketings provided for an increase from \$101.5 million in 1969 to \$114.2 million this year. The only grain for which there was any significant decline was oats. With marketings considerably below those of the previous year and prices also at lower levels cash receipts fell from \$24.6 million in 1969 to \$14.0 million in 1970.

<u>Livestock and Livestock Products</u>. — During the first nine months of 1970, total cash returns to producers of livestock and livestock products amounted to \$1,965.2 million, 3.0 per cent above the level for the corresponding period of 1969. Much of this increase is due to the greater value of sales of hogs. Although average prices over the January to September period of 1970 were slightly below those of the previous year, marketings were sufficiently high to result in cash receipts from this source rising by \$44.7 million to an estimated \$376.3 million. Cash returns from cattle were higher

than those received in 1969, while receipts from calves were slightly below the 1969 level. This resulted in total returns to both categories showing an increase of 1.9 per cent and rising to \$718.0 million for the 1970 period. For dairy products higher average prices were more than offset by lower marketings with the result that receipts from this source declined slightly from the 1969 level of \$521.4 million to reach a value of \$518.2 million in 1970; supplementary dairy payments at \$49.2 million were well below the 1969 level of \$61.4 million. Returns to poultry meat producers increased from \$178.5 million for the first three quarters of 1969 to \$185.2 million for the same period of 1970. Lower prices for eggs when combined with only a small increase in marketings resulted in total receipts falling by 4 per cent to \$131.6 million.

Estimates of cash receipts from farming operations include the returns from all sales of agricultural products except those associated with direct inter-farm transfers. The prices used to value all products sold are prices to farmers at the farm level; they include any subsidies, bonuses and premiums which can be attributed to specific products, but they exclude any storage, transportation, processing and handling charges which are not actually received by farmers.

Sources of information used in the preparation of these estimates include the Censuses of Agriculture; periodic Bureau surveys of production and disposition of crops, livestock and animal products; farm product marketing agencies; processors of agricultural products; Bureau surveys of prices received by farmers in connection with agricultural activities; agricultural statistics arising out of administrative responsibilities of various government departments, both Federal and Provincial.
