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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 2nd, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Aug. 2nd, 1929, show a net decrease of 1,638,843 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 106,719,003, Oats 16,399,612, Barley 9,596,735, Flax 462,787 and Rye 3,422,452, a total of 136,600,589 bushels. Wheat and Rye show decreases of 2,314,036 and 137,281 bushels, while increases are noted in Oats of 419,792, Barley 366,526 and Flax 26,156 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 2,286,920 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 1,599,928, Oats 301,668, Barley 311,110 Flax 19,569 and Rye 54,645 bushels.






