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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 4, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 4th show an increase of 19,895,845 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 17,583,527, Oats 16,463,597, Barley 20,566,423, Flax 771,357 and Rye 6,460,177, a total of 215,845,077 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 15,990,904, Oats 603,526, Barley 2,413,778, Flax 239,863 and Rye 6,460,177 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 13,030,170 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 10,365,639, Oats 826,159, Barley 1,495,210, Flax 232,412 and Rye 110,750 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show an increase of 1,467,313 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 1,416,099, Oats 37,465, Barley 7,126, Flax 5,509 and Rye 1,114 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 439,073 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 344,196 and 95,207 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 330 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 84,450 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (PORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 309,381 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 668,427, Barley 405,739 and Rye 161,852 bushels, while Oats and Flax show decreases of 368,768 and 57,869 bushels respectively.


