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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 18, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 18, show an increase of 14,502,204 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 196,053,150, Oats 18,279,552, Barley 22,976,619, Flax 1,230,170 and Rye 7,139,955, a total of 245,679,486 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 12,055,022, Oats 769,833, Barley 1,166,252, Flax 294,731 and Rye 216,310 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 7,532,652 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 5,336,169, Oats 896,773, Barley 827,096, Flax 239,915 and Rye 232,699 bushels.



VICTORIA ELEVATOR. Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 194 bushels.


