CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 25, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 25, show an increase of 14,631,839 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 209,726,228, Oats 18,725,115, Barley 23,198,766, Flax 1,263,885 and Rye 7,397,331, a total of 260,311,25 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 13,673,078, Oats 445,533, Barley 222,147, Flax 33,715 and Rye 257,366 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 6,368,784 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 5,655,977, Oats 488,480, Barley 493,406, Flax 71,362 and Rye 159,559 bushels.


