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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 1, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 1, show an increase of **6,239,756** bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 214,537,342, Oats 19,704,759, Barley 23,555,444, Flax 1,292,160 and Rye 7,461,376, a total of 266,551,081 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 4,811,114, Oats 979,644, Barley 356,678, Flax 28,275 and Rye 64,045 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net increase of 2,222,331 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,617,272, Oats 560,394, Barley 18,240 and Rye 66,033, while Rye shows a decrease of 40,208 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on October 25, 1929, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1928.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 488,335. Increases are noted in Wheat of 444,385, Oats 23,423, Barley 20,315 and Flax 1,879 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 1,667 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 457,683. Wheat and Rye show increases of 455,357 and 9,139 bushels, while Oats and Barley show decreases of 5,899 and 914 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Stocks at this elevator show an increase of 199,650 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 199,568, and Oats 82 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 2,564,623 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 2,156,103, Barley 539,762, Flax 25,297 and Rye 5,705, while Oats shows a decrease of 162,224 bushels.




