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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 8, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 8, show a net increase of 6,307,161 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat, 218,787,127, Oats 20,053,773, Barley 25,008,777, Flax 1,247,182 and Rye 7,761,383, a total of 272,858,242 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 4,249,785, Oats 349,014, Barley 1,453,333, and Rye 300,007 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 44,973 bushels.

Western Country Elevators - Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net increase of 1,415,019 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,030,742, Oats 429,859, and Barley 45,515 bushels, while Flax and Rye show decreases of 68,617 and 22,480 bushels respectively.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on November 1, 1929, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1928.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show an increase of 133,848 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 96,379, Oats 26,807, Barley 4,202, and Flax 6,460 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 25,162 bushels. Oats and Barley show decreases of 123,583 and 2,615 bushels respectively, while Wheat and Rye show increases of 86,886 and 14,150 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 7,124 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 550,513 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 363,212, Oats, 588,282, and Flax 3,113 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 267,756 and 127,338 bushels respectively.






