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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 31, 1930

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 31, 1930, show a net decrease of 2,650,317 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 221,120,909, Oats 20,830,091, Barley 29,069,782, Flax 1,187,612, Rye 8,743,671, a total of 280,960,065 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,206,227, Oats 277,805, Barley 342,949 and Flax 8,667, while Rye shows an increase of 185,331 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net decrease of 669,683 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 551,800, Barley 115,065 and Rye 5,696 bushels, while Oats and Flax show increases of 2,642 and 236 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 816,343 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 804,899, Barley 10,723, Flax 8,052 and Rye 1,179 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 8,510 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 820,434 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases 808,195 and 13,562 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 974 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at this elevator are the same as for previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 658,003. Increases are noted in Wheat of 613,808, Barley 41,021, Flax 1,669 and Rye 41,147, while Oats shows a decrease of 39,642 bushels.


