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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 14, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 14, 1930, show a decrease of 5,407,701 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 213,791,137; Oats 20,169,742; Barley 28,904,035; Flax 1,137,819 and Rye 8,456,997, a total of 272,459,730 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,763,883, Oats 341,481, Barley 35,127, Flax 38,175 and Rye 229,035 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 551,296 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 356,070, Oats 81,287, Barley 106,590, Flax 1,570 and Rye 5,779 bushels.


