CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 16, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 16, 1929, show a decrease of 3,801,852 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat, 100,567,822; Oats, 15,841,226; Barley, 9,073,613; Flax 348,721 and Rye, 3,482,721, a total of 129,314,103 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,528,673, Oats, 169,215, Barley, 8,954, Flax, 26,080 and Rye 68,960 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a new decrease of 640,696 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 506,451, Oats, 154,295, Flax 14,005 and Rye 2,640 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 36,701 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 314,588 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 301,534 and 14,263 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 1,209 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 182,893 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 176,851, Oats 5,677 and Barley 365 bushels.
