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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 28, 1930

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 28, show a net decrease of 939,847 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 211,141,277, Oats 19,195,753, Barley 27,842,427, Flax 1,005,855 and Rye 8,830,221, a total of 268,015,533 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 490,070, Oats 223,363, Barley 439,299 and Flax 134,692 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 347,577 bushels.

Western Country Elevators Stocks for the week at these elevators show a net decrease of 850,301 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 588,394, Oats 100,012, Barley 163,173 and Flax 2,588 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 3,866 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on February 21st, 1930, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1929.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 714,059 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 767,456 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 50,578 and 2,819 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 611,315 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 610,477 and Oats 1,404 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 566 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 876 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 489,809 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 467,825, Barley 47,468, Flax 2,587 and Rye 33,909 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 61,980 bushels.
