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## CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 28, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 28, show a net decrease of 4,885,684 bush. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 196,384,734, Oats 16,990,831, Barley 26,434,603, Flax 988,269 and Rye 8,452,263 a total of 249,250,700 bush. Decreases were noted in Wheat of 3,926,252, Oats 704,522, Barley 277,566 and Flax 5,468 bush., while Rye shows an increase of 28,124 bush.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 1,423,772 bush. made up as follows: Wheat 891,331, Oats 341,138, Barley 102,757, Flax 339 and Rye 8,207 bushels.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 113796 bush. Wheat and Barley show decreases of 103,172 and 10,915 bush respectively while Oats and Rye show increases of 290 and 1 bush. respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 398,679 bush. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 364,842, Oats 32,562 and Rye 2,900 bush. while Barley shows an increase of 1,625 bush.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator are the same as the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 352,171 bush. Increases are noted in Wheat of 340,947, Barley 3,454 and Rye 25,669 bush. while Oats and Flax show decreases of 14,974 and 2,925 bush. respectively.



Week ending March 28, 1930.


