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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 4, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 4, show a net decrease of 3,375,924 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 194,032,542; Oats 16,254,158; Barley 26,003,462; Flax 975,734; and Rye 8,608,880, a total of 245,874,776 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,352,192; Oats 736,673; Barley 431,141; and Flax 12,535, while Rye shows an increase of 156,617 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks for the week show a decrease of 1,689,443 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,081,214; Oats 376,894; Barley 190,629; Flax 7,416; and Rye 33,290 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 71,245 bushels. Decreases were noted in Wheat of 16,003; Oats 50,682; and Barley 5,293 bushels, while Flax shows an increase of 733 bushels.
