

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 23, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 23, 1929, show a net decrease of 854,352 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 99,879,043, Oats 15,601,287, Barley 8,904,309, Flax 377,585 and Rye 3,697,527, a total of 128,459,751 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 688,779, Oats 239,939 and Barley 169,304, while Flax and Rye show increases of 28,864 and 214,806 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Stocks for the week show an increase of 432,502 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 196,910, Oats 147,865, Barley 49,234, Flax 899 and Rye 37,954 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on August 16th, 1929, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1928.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a decrease of 326,924 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 314,740 and Oats 12,184 bushels.
