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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 2nd, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 2nd, 1930, show a net decrease of 6,374,806 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 177,488,727, Oats 13,330,903, Barley 24,457,302, Flax 855,217 and Rye 8,578,691 bushels, a total of 224,710,840 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,403,224, Oats 927,872, Barley 236,625 and Flax 31,931 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 224,846 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 2,299,206 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,548,596, Oats 382,192, Barley 289,623, Flax 34,053 and Rye 44,742 bushels.


INTERICR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 62,447 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 13,228, Oats 39,300, Barley 7,306, Flax 2,543, and Rye 70 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 639,514 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 633,050, Oats 3,464 and Rye 3,000 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- Stocks at this elevator are the same as the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 1,763,318 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 1,524,843 and 298,205 bushels respectively, while increases are noted in Barley of 37,942, Flax 5,906 and Rye 15,882 bushels.


