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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 30TH., 1930

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 30th, show a decrease of 8,981,797 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 147,060,274, Oats 11,002,459, Barley 23,387,486, Flax 713,520 and Rye 8,228,165, a total of 190,391,904 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 7,995,805, Oats 533,980, Barley 343,865, Flax 12,509 and Rye 95,638 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 177,631,371 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 139,997,519, Oats 18,468,960, Barley 14,299,488, Flax 931,943 and Rye 3,933,461 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 4,689,938 bushels, made up as follows; Wheat 3,971,029, Oats 383,937, Barley 230,344, Flax 26,193 and Rye 78,435 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY) - Stocks for the week show a decrease of 181,550 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 155,942, Oats 24,931, Barley 554 and Flax 123 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 169,571 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 150,499, Oats 6,217, Barley 1,715 and Rye 11,191 bushels, while Flax shows an increase of 51 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS - Stocks at this elevator are the same as the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS - Wheat stocks at this elevator are nil.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR) - Stocks at the head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 5,458,588 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,109,927, Oats 228,193 and Barley 178,067 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 15,437 and 42,162 bushels respectively.


