THE EXPORT MOVEMENT OF CANADIAN WHEAT

The exports of Canadian wheat and wheatflour for the month of June, have just been made available by the External Trade Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, and are presented in the following table for the eleven months of the crop year 1929-30, compared with the year 1928-29, and with the average of the five crop years 1924-25 to 1928-29.

Exports for the month of June amounted to 21,679,434 bushels and is the third highest in quantity for the present crop year. This makes a total for the eleven month period of 163,434,159 bushels representing 42% of 386,785,002 bushels, the quantity exported during the same period 1928-29, and 56% of the same eleven months in five year period 1924-25 to 1928-29.

Reports from the elevators at Montreal, Quebec, Sorel and Vancouver, B.C., show that an amount of 2,822,690 bushels was shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended July 4, 1930; 2,676,119 bushels were moved to Buffalo and other United States lake ports during the week ended July 7, 1930.

Wheat stocks show a reduction from the previous week ending June 27, 1930. The quantity in store on July 4, 1930 was 126,285,609 bushels, compared with 131,735,712 bushels last week and 113,311,276 bushels for the same week last year.

The movement from the Western Country Elevators to Eastern and Western Terminals continues on a large scale, while increased wheat stocks are shown at the Head of the Lakes, Public Elevators in the East, Vancouver and United States Seaboard. During the period from June 21 to June 30, 1930, 5,722 cars were inspected in the Western Division, an increase of 542 over the same week last year. For the month of June and the eleven months ended June 30th., 22,018 and 147,862 cars were inspected, of which 93.1 and 87.9 per cent were within the contract grades.

According to the compilation issued by the Bureau in April, 228,836,626 bushels were in store in Canada on March 31, 1930. After making a deduction for seed 42,000,000 bushels and food requirements of 16,000,000 bushels, 170,836,626 bushels are available for export. Customs figures from April to June inclusive show 43,185,344 bushels were exported, leaving a balance of 127,651,282 bushels. The Bureau estimated the carry-over at the end of the year as 115,000,000 bushels, leaving an amount of 12,651,282 bushels for export during the month of July. One must add to this figure because of an evident under-estimate of the 1929 crop. The following table lists for each Prairie province the carry-over in farmers' hands on July 31, 1929, the estimated crop of 1929, and the receipts at Country Elevators and shipments over loading platforms up to June 27, 1930. The balances left amount to 8,660,507 for Manitoba, 22,692,912 for Saskatchewan, 16,522,591 for Alberta, and 47,876,010 for the total. Deductions from these figures must be made for seed, consumption on farms, and unmerchantable grain. These items are estimated at Manitoba as 3,766,923 bushels, Saskatchewan 24,760,929 bushels, Alberta 13,137,823 bushels and for the three provinces 41,663,675. It will be noted that the Saskatchewan crop has been considerably underestimated. Deliveries at Country Elevators are being well maintained and probably will average nearly 200,000 a day during July or approximately 4,000,000 bushels for the month. Most of this grain is being marketed in Saskatchewan, so the under-estimate will be most apparent in this province, with Manitoba and Alberta estimates checking fairly well with final marketings.

FOREIGN SITUATION

The import market for the week ended June 27, 1930 shows that no expansion took place in the export business, grain cargoes are of the three-part nature, no full cargoes being reported. When the American winter wheat crop is good, and it comes on the market at a time, when supplies are at their lowest ebb - it has a considerable influence. At the present time quantities are being offered at reduced prices, which should secure for the United States a fair share of the importers' trade. Wheat harvest has started in Hungary and Roumania. Germany reports damage to Rye and Oats through drought, while France and Italian crops have suffered, through inclement weather. During the week ended June 25, reports indicate large shipments from the Southern Hemisphere, and a moderate movement from North America.

For the week June 3, Argentine shipments amounted to 1,617,000, compared with 2,123,000 bushels for the previous week. Australia shipped 1,512,000 bushels against 656,000 bushels. The United Kingdom imports for the week ended June 21, amounted to 3,729,308 bushels, an increase over the week ended June 14th.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 4, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 4, 1930, show a net decrease of 5,453,406 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 126,285,609, Oats 8,865,068, Barley 22,359,024, Flax 490,606 and Rye 8,701,985, a total of 160,702,292 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,450,103, Oats 162,263, Barley 280,160 and Flax 21,776 bushels. While Rye shows an increase of 460,896 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 142,982,869 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 113,311,276, Oats 16,393,126, Barley 9,427,643, Flax 481,682, and Rye 3,369,142 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 5,524,028 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 4,911,164, Oats 270,975, Barley 187,735 Flax 38,855 and Rye 115,299 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 5,449 bushels, Oats and Barley show decreases of 5,847, and 27 bushels respectively, while Wheat and Flax show increases of 424 and 1 bushel respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 162,214 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 150,805, Oats 12,257 and Barley 33 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 881 bushels.
