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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 30. 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 30th, 1929 show a net decrease of 1,006,952 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 93,252,977, Oats 15,479,627, Barley 9,517,721, Flax 346,326 and Rye 3,556,148, a total of 127,452,799 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,626,066, Oats 121, 660 and Flax 31,259 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 613,412 and 158,621 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net increase of 410,661 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 280,603, Barley 36,704 and Rye 74,623 bushels, while Oats and Flax show decreases of 30,618 and 651 bushels respectively.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on August 23rd, 1929, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1928.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 99,455 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 99,911 and 131 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 587 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 25,930 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 26,236 and 4,387 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 4,693 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 681,936 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,057,959, Oats 9,229 and Flax 19,406 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 310,590 and 94,218 bushels respectively.






